Appointment of Coordinator of Vidya Vistar Scheme (V2 Scheme)

It is my pleasure to announce that, in keeping with the college's philosophy of fruitful collaboration between educational institutes, Dr. Servchetan Katoch, Associate Professor from the Department of English, has been appointed as the Coordinator of Vidya Vistar Scheme. Dr. Katoch has initiated the process of implementation of this scheme by shortlisting and communicating with 2-3 colleges in Himachal Pradesh, located in remote/tribal regions of the state such as Chamba, Lahaul, and Spiti. During his tenure here he organized a number of student oriented programs, the most memorable being the student aid fund for underprivileged students. He retired on 30th September 2019. Dr. Darshan Arora of the Mathematics department worked with us for many decades and left an indelible mark on the department and college. She gracefully mentored her young colleagues and worked in tandem with her peers to create new and innovative way to impart a profound understanding of Mathematics to young minds. Her acuity was much appreciated by her colleagues, and she was always the first to come forward to guide departmental activities. She retired from the department on 30th September 2019. We all are deeply thankful for her years of diligent service.

Sh. Rattan Chand Jain of the Commerce department was undoubtedly one of the most beloved members of faculty. He earned his B.Com. degree from the Sri Ram College of Commerce and his M. Phil from the Delhi School of Economics. He joined his services at this college on 16th February 1982. He frequently discussed quite a number of issues of contemporary and political significance, and even when there was a difference of opinion, there never was any unpleasantness. He has been a member of many panels and bodies constituted by the GOI and has worked with charitable organizations as well. Department of Commerce - Commerce Association




and is also associated with the online archives www.pad.ma and www.indiancine.ma. Prof. Liang shared his valuable insights about the aesthetics and politics of copyright as it relates to the domains of literature, criticism and research.

The next lecture in this series was organized on 8th October 2021 on “The Power of the Word: Decolonising Creative Writing” by Ms Janice Pariat, an award-winning novelist and Assistant Professor of Creative Writing at Ashoka University, Haryana.

The next talk, titled “The Lure and the Trap of Khasak: A magical Terrain and People”, was organized on 22 nd October 2021 and was delivered by Dr Vellikkeel Raghavan, Assistant Professor, Department of English and Comparative Literature, Central University of Kerala. Dr Raghavan shared his valuable insights on translation theory, Indian literature, and the place of “magical realism” in Indian literature/criticism.

The next talk in the series was titled “Dress, Desire and Dignity: Clothing the Dalit Body” and delivered on 29th October 2021 by Dr Anupama, Assistant Professor, Department of History, Mahanth Mahadevanand Mahila College, Veer Kunwer Singh University, Ara, Bihar. Dr Anupama illuminated the audience on the aesthetics and politics of sartorial choices made by Dalit subjects as they negotiate various power structures and ideas of defiance and dignity in acts of creative self-fashioning.

Dr. Somjyoti Mridha (Assistant Professor, Department of English, North-Eastern Hill University, Meghalaya), the esteemed speaker for our next talk titled “Narrating India through Translation: A Literary Perspective” shared his insights on the necessity and efficacy of the cultural activity of translation in the context of a multi-lingual and multi-cultural nation-state like India on 12th November 2021.

Our next talk focused on “Nineteenth-Century English Romanticism: Theory and Praxis” and was delivered on 18th February 2022 by Dr Ganesh Krishnamoorthy, Visiting Faculty, Department of English, University of Madras. Dr Krishnamoorthy was kind enough to discuss at length the various political, aesthetic, and philosophical debates that informed and shaped nineteenth-century literature.

“Epiphaneia’22”, the annual literary fest, was successfully organized on the 9th and 10th of March, 2022. The fest was conducted in online mode and drew extensive participation from students enrolled in Delhi University, as well as from universities across the country. The fest began with an inaugural lecture by Dr. Aratrika Das (Assistant Professor, School of Humanities and Social Sciences, IIT Indore), titled “Windows, Vampires, Blood, and Tweed”. Dr. Das illuminated the audience with an engaging literary and philosophical historiography of the ‘gothic’ in Western literary canon and its many transformations in popular culture of the 21st century. The lecture was followed by some invigorating student performances that embodied the larger theme of the fest, that is, “Dark Academia”. The organizing team worked diligently over the course of many weeks to curate a diverse set of six events on the theme “Dark Academia”. The events invited creative and intellectual expression in different forms– from slam poetry to cosplay, from meme-making to book-cover designing. The team received an impressive array of submissions for the following events:

1. Poetry Slam (9th March)
2. Pictionary- Literary Quiz (9th March)

3. Cloth Thy Book– Book-cover design (10th March)
4. The Purloined Letter– Creative writing competition (10th March)
5. Vanity Fair– Cosplay/Monologue performance competition (10 March)
6. Meme-oir– Meme-making competition (10th March)



The events were judged by members of the faculty, and students who won were awarded with prizes worth Rs 39,000/-. A number of student volunteers from the English Department of the college helped coordinate the programs and made sure the events segued smoothly one after the other.

B.A Programme Association

Convenor: Dr Saima Iqbal

B. A. Programme Association organized the following events during the year:

Parichay'21-the orientation programme for batch of 2024, was conducted virtually on the zoom platform dated 22 November 2021. The session was graced with the address of the Principal and Convenor of B.A. programme association Dr. Saima Iqbal. The department of

the B.A. Programme furnished the students not only with information ranging from academic and social activities but also with a remarkable video on a virtual tour of the college. The strength of approximately 150 students was observed on that day. Cultural performances including poetry, song, and electrifying dance performance were exhibited. A complete detailed structure of societies and the opportunities they provide was presented followed by a vote of thanks proposed by the president of B.A. Programme Association. The session ended with great enthusiasm.

Ice -breaking session: The department of B.A. Programme conducted an informal session for the first-year students on 23rd November 2021 through Zoom platform. After the introduction, the event had a blend of many activities and surprises for the first-year students. The event was concluded with a Q&A session for solving all the queries. The event had around 65 students with active participation. The event went around for about 1 hour and 30 minutes.

BELLA NOCHE: The musical performance: A melodious musical concert was organized on the 27th of November by the B.A. Programme Association in collaboration with Ombré, a live-streaming platform for content creators and musicians. The event witnessed a footfall of over 100 viewers and led to an evening full of musical charm and radiance. The audience was mesmerized by various musical performances. The event concluded with a lot of positive feedback and provided some much-needed respite from the monotony of day-to-day life which rendered it an absolute success.

INTERVIEW: Every year, the B.A. Programme Association of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi, conducts a rigorous selection process for the position of executive members from the freshers. The selection process was executed in 3 rounds: Form screening, Personal Interview Round 1 and Personal Interview Round 2. Total of 26 applicants cleared the first round and sat for the first round of personal interviews, which were conducted by the core members.

For the final round, 9 candidates were shortlisted, and the interview panel consisted of the core member and the B.A. Programme Department's convenor Dr. Saima Iqbal. The selection procedure ended on 4th January 2022, with the induction of 6 Executive members into the association.

SENNIGHT GALA 2.0/ Inaugural ceremony: The department of B.A. Programme conducted an event Sennight Gala 2.0- the week of festivity from 10 January to 15 January 2021. The occasion was graced with the presence of our honourable principal Dr Anil Sardana, respected convenor of B.A. Programme Association Dr Saima Iqbal and respected co-convenor Dr R.K Rajan. Thereafter the students were given a structured description of all the four grand events that fell under the umbrella of Sennight Gala 2.0. Next, a mesmerizing performance was given by Sonam and Shivam. The event witnessed a footfall of over 500 viewers and went around for 1.5 hours. The session ended with great enthusiasm and amusement.

V—SLEUTH: An Online treasure hunt competition based on a murder mystery was conducted in 3 rounds. The first round was a quiz on google forms which was eliminatory. In the 2nd round, a photo was shown to the participants and they has to conclude with reasons that it was a murder or a suicide. 3rd round was conducted by providing riddles to them

through Instagram and YouTube channels, the answer to one riddle lead the participants to the next. The registration count was more than 450, teams from different colleges across the country.

ADVERTIFY: An Online B-plan competition conducted in 3 rounds, the first round had a brand and Bollywood quiz, after which 15 teams were shortlisted for the 2nd round where they had to prepare an advertisement and a pitch for a hypothetical product created by them. In the 3rd round, the top 10 teams went under an auction for the ads created by them in the 2nd round. The registration count was more than 550, teams from different colleges across the country. Including colleges like IIMs and IITs.

THE DRUNKEN POET: This was a bi-lingual, 2-round creative writing competition. In the first round, the participants had to present their best work of writing in front of the audience and judge. In the final round, the shortlisted participants were given a word and in 10 minutes they had to present their work around that specific word. The registration count was more than 60, teams from different colleges across the country.

QUIZZARD: It was an online quiz competition conducted in 2 rounds. The first round was conducted on the D2C platform, and the top 20 participants were selected for the final round which was a live quiz conducted on google meet. The quiz was not specific and covered a wide variety of questions.

SOCIAL OUTREACH CELL

LIBRARY - KNOWLEDGE & LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE

Library is a growing organism and like every year this year too the library has grown in terms of its resources and services. This year **1723 titles** have been added to the collection in which disciplines like Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Geography, Political Science, History, English and Hindi language and Literature are particularly well represented. In our effort to welcome and honour the demand of our students and faculty members **574 titles** have also been added in our *Reference Section* consisting of competitive entrance books; general knowledge books; yearbooks; reports; atlases; etc. Further, in order to enrich our *Light Reading Section*, **69 popular titles** by acclaimed, celebrated and awarded authors have been added. The total **accessioned volumes as of now are 88547**; however, **the total collection of serviceable copies as on date is 68552** after deducting the collection which has been weeded over a period of 25 years. Library is also subscribing to **101 Periodicals**, comprising 62 Journals and 39 Magazines of academic and general interest.

Another notable milestone achieved during this year is the provision of remote access to e-resources to faculty as well as to students. In its effort to reach out to freshers of the college, the library organized an Online **Library Orientation Program**. Various societies and their achievements under the year of the report are as follows:

AUDIOPHILE - THE MUSIC SOCIETY

Founded in the year 2011, Audiophile has had quite a noteworthy journey in the DU Music circuit. It has three core segments: **the Band, the Indian Classical Choir, and the Western Acapella Group**. The society has won numerous accolades over the years. It has performed its original compositions at various Delhi-NCR college fests as well as outstation fests and has bagged positions at annual cultural fests of various colleges.

Like many societies in the DU circuit, Audiophile had its fair share of obstacles because of the pandemic. Even after all this, it successfully hosted Swaratmika'21 in online mode and managed to reach a wide audience.

SPARDHA - THE DANCE SOCIETY

It is among one of the best dance societies at Delhi University. It is also regarded as one of the best college dance crews in India after winning competitions all over the country including winning the Street Dance Competition in **Asia's largest festival: Mood Indigo, IIT Bombay, three times in a row**.

During 2021-2022, **FilmTantra** dived deep into the ever-evolving world of cinema. **The annual fest CAFF'22 - Cineville Annual Film festival became the largest student-run Film Festival in India.** With over 17 movie screenings featuring **the best of Indie cinema along with panel discussions with panelists like Mr. Tushar Singhal (AD Piku, Pink, Sardar Udham) and Ms. Jiya Bhardwaj (AD Fan and Aankhon Dekhi),** and multiple competitions to challenge and inspire cinema lovers were held during the four-day celebration of life behind the screen.

There is a common misconception that drama only caters to acting but Natuve challenges that notion by infusing art, dance, music, etc together..



This year Natuve won Best Actor and 2nd place (stage) at Lal Bahadur Shastri Institute of Management, 2nd Place (stage) at Shaheed Rajguru College and Deshbandhu College, 1st place in Individual Monologue and Street Play event at Geography Department of SBSC, Best Actress (street) at Shivaji College and Lady Irwin College.

MERAKI - THE BILINGUAL CREATIVE SOCIETY

Meraki is a community of writers, spoken word artists, and learners who are passionate about digging for words and writings that resonate with them the most. For the past 2 years, the world might have shut down but its members didn't stop hustling. Be it offline or online, Meraki made its name outshine among the poetry circuit of Delhi University.

It took part in IIT Bombay's Mood Indigo - Asia's largest Cultural Fest. Parul Kumar won the first prize in a Mini Tale competition at IITB's Mood Indigo. Last year, the whole team won approximately **35 prizes collectively**. Bisma Shoeb stood 1st in a poetry competition organized by The Erudite, a renowned news company. Shyamu Pujari secured the 1st position in Open-Mic Competition organized at Gargi College. Shubham Kumar and Pushpender Tiwadi got the golden opportunity to represent our college at Steller by Tape a Tale in 2021 and 2022 respectively.

THE REVOLUTIONISTS - THE ENGLISH DEBATING SOCIETY

It strives to create a space where all ideas can be shared and discussed, with rational thought and logical reasoning being the two cornerstones of their discourse. It strongly believes that

in a world that is getting increasingly polarized, it is extremely important to explore a million shades of gray that exist between black and white.

It has conducted and participated in tournaments at the national & international levels throughout the year. The society won laurels at the prestigious competitions of colleges like SRCC, IIT Delhi, NLSIU, Sri Venkateswara College, Hindu College, Hansraj College and Ramjas College among several others. With a rising presence in the debate circuit, the Revolutionists conducted its flagship event, **SBS BPD and saw enormous participation not just from India, but also from countries like Bangladesh, China, Philippines and Malaysia to name a few. Additionally, the society organized a fundraiser tournament 'Rahat' as a collaborative effort, through which they raised a total of INR 1,11,000 & donated it to two organizations working towards providing COVID relief.** Lastly, they have strived to make debating a more inclusive rather than elitist space, and make the activity accessible to all.

SARVAGYA - THE HINDI DEBATING SOCIETY

Sarvagya works to establish the knowledge of reasoning, self-confidence, discretion, and patience within the students. The society is active in conducting weekly sessions and doing in-depth analyses on various issues.

The Sarvagya Samiti has organized two parliamentary debate competitions smoothly at the national level. The society members actively participated and represented the college at various events. The members of the society have won the positions of the runner-up, semi-finalist and quarter-finalist in the parliamentary debate competitions, participated in traditional and other debate competitions and earned their name. The society has won accolades in more than 30 debate competitions across the country. Apart from this, Sarvagya has also participated in youth parliamentary competitions.

MINERVA – THE QUIZZING SOCIETY

Minerva is an active platform with a vision of inquisition and wonder that spreads across science and tech, history and culture, literature, mythology, etc. The society holds annual events in its fest and sessions, which are accessible to all the students within the University. This society is for individuals who love going out of the general scope of their academic courses and delving deeper into new dimensions.

During the year 2021-22, its members bagged winning positions at various competitions. Mr Adarsh Das secured 1st Position in a quiz organized by Political Science Association, and Rohit Modi won Earth Hour Quiz organized by Sup-Eco App. Mr. Abdul Qadir won Runner-up position at Pragyan BA programme quiz, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College. Ms. Shristi Yadav won the 3rd position in the Ambedkar Quiz organized by the Department of Political Science and SC/ST cell, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College evening held on 12 April 2021. Rituraj Sarma bagged 1st, 2nd and 3rd position at the various quizzes that happened at MELA Quiz, ZHDC.

ENACTUS of SBSC

Under the Convenership of Dr. Pooja Talwar, Enactus, SBSC, a team of 80 driven individuals, in its capacity tries to bridge the gap between communities by providing employment to the underprivileged and fostering an entrepreneurial spirit in them. Presently, it has two established projects and one project which is in its stealth stage.

Currently, **Project Safar is in its ideation stage** for new verticals. The project aims at better **waste management while also improving the livelihood of local artisans**. Thus, we intend to make our surroundings clean and revive the dying crafts of India.

Project Pavitra is an initiative undertaken to serve the underprivileged and raise awareness of adulteration, animal cruelty and environmental degradation. It has also conducted a campaign called **Campaign Mishran** that aimed at **fighting adulteration and helped spread awareness** regarding the same. Under another small campaign it asked people to play with puppies and charged them a minor fee. All the proceeds from this campaign were given back to the NGO to help take care of the pets, get them vaccinated, provide them with nutritious meals and provide them with any and everything they might need.

Online campaigns and the use of social media were used to increase the reach of society. It worked on several **Instagram series such as "Short on Time Big on Curiosity"** and live sessions. Along with that, it started weekly posts on their account "Enactaflix" which aimed at spreading awareness on new topics every week. **They recently published their first newsletter.**

Ibaadat is an upcoming project of Enactus. The thought behind this vertical is **to propagate awareness towards the proper disposal of ashes and reshaping them into consecrated deities.** Through their collaboration with Energinee Innovations, Enactus would venture into a domain where they would contribute to the provision of livelihood for previous prisoners and help them to earn for themselves and their families.

The society collaborated with ITC for their campaign called WOW (Well being out of waste). The collaboration focused on spreading awareness in several pockets of Delhi NCR about the benefits of waste segregation and waste management.

CENTRE FOR SHAHEED BHAGAT SINGH STUDIES AND RESEARCH

The “**Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research**” under the convenorship of **Ms. Mita Hussain** was established to create awareness that the struggle for Indian independence was informed by diverse thoughts and actions through Shaheed Bhagat Singh's ideas and record of actions. The Centre brings together a host of primary and secondary material on Bhagat Singh and other revolutionaries. It includes newspaper records, British Home Political files and the voluminous proceedings of the Lahore Conspiracy Case, the oral history records, i.e transcripts of interviews with comrades of Bhagat Singh. Other important sources for understanding the importance and impact of revolutionaries were the proscribed photographs, drawings, and calendar art which endured the memories of the heroic actions and sacrifices of the revolutionaries, who spent a large part of their lives underground and in that sense were hardly seen.

Last year, the Centre invited **Prof. Shashi Bhushan Upadhyay to deliver a lecture on 'Subhash Chandra Bose and the Indian National Army'**. Subhash Chandra Bose, one of the brightest stars in the political firmament in the 1930's and 40's, took the unprecedented path of armed struggle, raising an army on foreign soil to continue to be an unrelenting opponent of her majesty. Prof. Upadhyay, brought forth the fascinating story of the struggle waged by the Indian National Army.

The latest venture of the Centre was the lecture by **Dr. Aparna Vaidik, Associate Professor, Ashoka University, on the 'Inner lives of Revolutionaries'**. In line with the latest historiographical trend, Dr. Vaidik moved away from the spectacular and heroic actions to look into the daily lives of revolutionaries, who through their discipline, commitment and devotion carried out the 'revolution'. A close examination of the life of legendary revolutionary Chandra Shekhar Azad helped to understand the varied and rich spectrum of revolutionary thought and action.

HARITHKRAM - ECO-ENVIRONMENT SOCIETY

Harithkram, the Environment society, under the leadership of **Dr. Shikha Gupta** and mentorship of **Dr. V.A.V Raman** aims to create a green and sustainable society on and around the campus, through the means of creating environmental awareness among individuals. The members of Harithkram voluntarily contribute their time and brain power through audacious media campaigns, events, contests and workshops.



On the occasion of World Environment Day on June 5, 2021, Harithkram invited all its former and current members, for an **open-house discussion on the focal theme, "Ecosystem Restoration: Possible Ways for resetting our Bonds with Nature."**

Harithkram supported the **31-Day Plastic Free Challenge** and encouraged everyone to join hands to make a positive impact. It was an initiative by Plastic Free July®, a global movement that seeks to find solutions to plastic pollution.

Harithkram organised its first event of the session 2021-22, an Inaugural Talk on "Water and SDG-6", which was delivered by Dr. Romila Verma, Department of Geography and Planning, University of Toronto, Canada, on Friday, August 6, 2021. She discussed that sustainable management of water resources and access to safe water and sanitation is essential for unlocking economic growth and productivity.

"Cockatoo: Green Chats" is a bi-monthly gathering of budding environmentalists. The online session takes place on Friday at 4:30 PM. This live interaction involves free-spirited discussions on a wide range of topics, covered in different sessions. The goal of Cockatoo:

Green Chats is to welcome all the enthusiastic participants to share their inspiring green thoughts and practices, suggestions and experiences regarding various themes, issues and challenges centred on our environment. **In this academic year, Harithkram conducted six sessions (Week 34-39), ranging from Gender and Environment, Saving Trees, Carbon Footprints of Green Energy, Impact of Food Choices on Environment, to Lonar Crater Lake.** One of the sessions was taken by a student member of Harithkram, **Analiya MJ**, in which she **walked along the Periyar River and showed cage culture and ancient forts.**

Harithkram celebrated its 10th Foundation Day on September 07, 2021. Harithkram made a few important announcements including the launch of a new section of "blog" on its website. The new members were inducted on the day and explained about the functioning of the society, given a website tour. The event ended with all the members taking eco-pledge.

Harithkram organised its three-day **Youth Conference Delhi University Sustainability Forum 2020 x Harithkram Model United Nations Environment Assembly 2021 (DUSF'20 x HMUNEA'21) on the theme of "COVID 19 and its impact on SDGs' Targets" on October 25-27, 2021 in the online mode.** School Students' Conference (SSC) was organized as part of DUSF'20. **Mr. Atul Bagai, Head, UNEP India, was the chief guest, and Ms. Gayatri Raghwa, Educational Consultant, UNEP India, graced the occasion** as the guest of honour, in the inaugural session of the conference. Around 25 delegates from prestigious institutes across India and Delhi-NCR discussed the issues related to the onslaught of COVID 19 on sustainable development in **HMUNEA'21.** SSC witnessed the participation of around 10 schools spanning over 8 states of India. The conference was aimed at imparting the principles of sustainability and the allied goals among the youth masses while creating awareness about the pressing environmental issues. The central theme discussed at the conference was Sustainable Development Goals. The three-day conference ended on a jubilant and elevating note with a roaring success despite the odds of the virtual medium.

A Talk on **"Dietary Habits and Chulha: an Ecological Analysis"** was conducted on **February 17, 2022, delivered by Mr. Mayank Kumar;** Associate Professor of History, IGNOU. The session highlighted the importance of considering individual-level factors and socio-ecological aspects in the analysis.

Once the college reopened, Harithkram kicked off its first offline activity for organizing a Workshop on "Engaging Youth for Social Cohesion" organized in follow up of the UNESCO MGIEP Training for Trainers Programme, held on March 08, 2022. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Lakshya Yog, Senior Research Fellow at Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi, and Ms. Aanya Wig, Intern at UNESCO Cluster Offices, New Delhi. The workshop required the students to speak and put forth the views of a specific stakeholder. The activity conducted instilled the values of compassion, and empathy in them for the surroundings.

Harithkram took its students on a Nature Trail to Mangarbani, Aravallis on March 13, 2022. The students had been made aware of the invasive species - Vilaiti Keekar, and how it is threatening the existence of the other native species like dhau. They also visited the Gudariya Baba Das temple. The students also interacted with Mr. Sunil Harsana, the pied piper of Mangarbani, and exchanged ideas. The trip was enthralling yet informative.



Harithkram celebrated Earth hour on March 26, 2022, in offline mode. The event featured movie screening, jamming session, pledge and dark photography competition. The jamming session was conducted in collaboration with Audiophile, the Music Society of the college. This was followed by the participation in the International Movement of Earth Hour by putting off the lights on the college campus for one hour from 20:30 – 21:30 hrs and pledged to fight climate change by raising awareness about it. During that one-hour, students participated in a Dark Photography competition and captured the beauty of nature in the natural light. The students celebrated the spirit of Earth Hour by lighting candles in a formation reflecting "Earth Hour 60+." They were joined by the teachers and staff members from the college.



Under the skilled direction of its Staff Advisor Dr. V.A.V. Raman, Harithkram is confronting the difficulties of Environmental Sustainability among Youth and mobilising them to make the planet greener via various projects, programs, and activities.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The NSS of the college, under the guidance of **Mr. Sandeep Kumar**, started the year with an appreciation for our doctors who have been at the frontline, tirelessly helping and saving people from the deadly Coronavirus. **It organized a webinar on 'Kargil Vijay Diwas' where it had the privilege of being accompanied by Maj. Gen. Yashpal Singh Mor.** Another enlightening webinar was held with the two successful sportsmen: Tarundeep Rai (Olympian, Padma Shree and Arjuna awardee) and K Ravi Kumar (Commonwealth and Asian games medallist, Arjuna awardee) where they talked about the importance of sports and fitness in one's life.



NSS organized its Annual Fest, Samarpan 3.0 with two events 'Markgician' and 'Mystic Key'. Keeping in mind the importance of masks in the fight against COVID-19, NSS distributed over 1200 masks in the area around the college campus. A webinar was organized on 'Breast Cancer and Palliative care', speakers Prof. (Dr.) Ramesh Dawar and Dr. Pragya Singh provided useful information regarding the prevention and care of cancer. Focusing on waste management it organised a webinar with Mr. Shubham Agrawal, Founder and Director of Green Dream Recycles who talked about the problems and solutions of plastic waste disposal.

To celebrate Vigilance Awareness week it invited Md. Mohsin Alam (IRS) for a webinar that included an oath-taking ceremony as well. Continuing their efforts in line with the Project Kaabil, NSS SBSC organised a **Stationery Distribution Drive and distributed a set of Stationery items to those who couldn't afford one.** With the topic 'Shaping the Future: Responsibility towards society' NSS invited Lt. General Anil Malik for a webinar on 26th January 2022 as part of the Republic Day celebrations.

In yet another show of Selfless service, its volunteers organised a **Food Donation Drive in Gurgaon wherein it distributed more than 70 packets of good, nutritious food to the children and played fun and interactive games.**

On March 8th, it organised a **Blood Donation Drive with the help of AIIMS Delhi at the college campus.** Its volunteers motivated everyone to donate blood and they were able to donate a total of **116 Units of Blood.**

PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell is a student body incorporated for inviting corporates and facilitating the recruitments of the final year students. This year, the Placement Cell's team comprised 14 student coordinators, with **Prof. Ruchi Gupta** as their Teacher Convenor. The team

constantly engaged in developing alliances with potential recruiters seeking quality human capital and furnishing excellent career opportunities to the students.



During the recruitment season 2021-2022, placements at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College surpassed all records, making it the most successful recruitment season ever at SBSC. **The Season witnessed an all-time high of 265+ offers and a significant growth of 60% in the number of recruiters as more than 55 companies visited the campus for 80+ profiles in diverse sectors. The highest ever package of 23 LPA was offered by The DE Shaw Group.** The Placement Cell was able to bring on board all the Big 4 accounting firms namely **Deloitte USI, KPMG India, KPMG Global, Ernst & Young India, Ernst & Young Global and PWC India for 8 diverse profiles.** Apart from Big 4s, the cell also on-boarded the Big 3 management consulting firms such as **Bain & Company and Boston Consulting Group hiring for both full-time and internship opportunities.** Over the years, SBSC has maintained the confidence of the Big 4s and the Big 3s, which has resulted in an increase of 55% in the offers made by them. **Moreover, corporate giants like Accenture, Sattva Consulting and unicorn start-ups like Vahdam India, Byjus, to name a few, placed their trust in the potential of our students and recruited them from SBSC for the first time. The recruitment season also saw an influx of more than 50% novel recruiters.** Apart from providing career opportunities to the students, the Placement Cell also hosted articleship drives for the students pursuing the Chartered Accountancy course. Companies such as PWC India and Grant Thornton were a few among others who hired articleship trainees from the campus.

While the pandemic slowed down the learning opportunities for students, the Placement Cell took the initiative to collaborate with the digital learning platform Coursera to provide free access to various online courses to all students. The initiative drew the participation of more than 1000 students, who used these courses for upskilling themselves. The Cell also collaborated with Quollab to provide students with an opportunity to work on live projects in domains like equity research, consulting, venture capital etc. Apart from these, **the**

Placement Team also carried out a CV vetting drive for more than 450 students to ensure standardisation and genuineness of all CVs. To increase the corporate exposure of first and second-year students at college, the Placement Cell is associated with firms like Deloitte USI, KPMG India, EY India, The D.E. Shaw Group, etc. to host events like Graduate School Maverick, KPMG Ideation Challenge and summer internships. The Cell has witnessed a smooth shift towards virtual placements to provide a hassle-free hiring experience for recruiters and students. The Cell successfully managed a smooth transition to virtual placements leading to the most successful recruitment year at SBSC.

WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL (WDC)



CENTRE FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT


students attending the webinar from across the Delhi University circuit and universities pan India.

CDMS, established in 2018, aspires to work as a Centre of excellence in disaster management research, training and creating awareness for disaster preparedness, risk reduction and mitigation. The CDMS regularly organises events encompassing lectures, short-term courses, training and workshops for students, staff and other participants. In addition to these, the Centre also organises events in collaboration with institutions and organisations working in the domain of disaster management.

CDMS had successfully organised a 7-Day Capacity Building Program from March 1-7, 2021 on the theme "Hydro-Meteorological Disaster: Techniques for Measuring, Monitoring and Management of Floods in collaboration with Teaching Learning Centre, Ramanujan College under the aegis of Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education, GOI.

Centre in collaboration with P4CA, Inhabitant, World Urban Campaign, IRPUD, Dress & Sommer, Sustainability and Adaptation Planning had diligently organised a webinar on May 6, 2021, on the theme - **“Critical Urban Infrastructure (CI)- Identifying and Assessing Smart and Green Solutions for Efficient Disaster Risk resilience”**.



The keynote was delivered by Dr. K J Ramesh, National Commission for Monitoring Pollution India and Prof. Stefan Grieving, Institute for Spatial Planning, TU Dortmund University, Germany and Panellists were Dr. DU Juan, Institute for Spatial Planning TU Dortmund; Dr. Nadine Appelhans Habitat Unit TU Berlin Germany and Ms. Alyssa, Weskamp Dress and Sommer Integrated Urban Solution, Berlin, Germany. Indeed, the webinar was quite informative and fruitful that immersed new insights about the critical aspects of Urban Infrastructure into the minds of attendees.

The Centre had observed the International Day of Disaster Risk Reduction in collaboration with P4CA, Inhabitat, World Urban Campaign, IRPUD, Dress & Sommer, Sustainability and Adaptation Planning had organised another webinar (Session 2) on May 27, 2021, on the

theme - **“Critical Urban Infrastructure (CI)- Actual issues of Disaster Risk and Infrastructure Management-in selected countries of Global South”**. The presenters were Prof Sophie Schramm, International Planning Studies, TU Dortmund University; Prof. Ally Hassan Namangaya, School of Spatial Planning and Social Sciences, Ardhi University, Tanzania; Dr. Haris Piplas, Drees & Soomer Integrated Urban Solution, Switzerland. The eminent Presenters reflected their profound knowledge of the Critical aspects of Urban Infrastructure and added new insights into the minds of attendees.

The Centre observed the International Day of Disaster Risk Reduction on October 10-13, 2021. On this occasion, CDMS had organised a Virtual Poster Making Competition '**Art-E-Disaster**' based on the theme Disaster Risk Reduction. Participants were given 3 days to work on their posters. Every poster was unique in itself, keeping the theme at its core. Participants from different colleges all over India showcased their prowess in artwork. Winners were applauded with Cash prizes and Certificates.

Preparedness is the only way we can combat natural disasters." With these words, the CDMS in collaboration with the National Institute of Disaster Management, Ministry of Home Affairs, GOI successfully organised a 3-day online training Program from 21-23rd October 2021, on Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience. The first day was the Inaugural Ceremony, that instigated with the felicitation of the Patrons Major MK Bindal, Executive Director, NIDM, MHA, GOI and Prof Anil Sardana, Principal Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, DU; Programme Chair Prof Surya Prakash and some eminent speakers by Prof Poonam Sharma Director, CDMS. She has talked about the essence and importance of this training program. The eminent speakers were Dr. Raju Thapa, JC, NIDM; Sh Hari HK Devada, YP, NIDM and Sh. Ajit Batham, YP, NIDM, Dr. Kiranmay Sharma, School of Environment Management, GGSIPU and Ms. Sonal Chauhan, Former DLSA, Advocate. They all have talked about special attention for low-income families, bringing in the practice of an Early warning system, proper infrastructure, proper implementation of guidelines of Emergency Operation System and the use of Social networking services to obtain information. Indeed, this training imparted intensive knowledge and skills about various aspects connected to disaster management.

A Quiz Competition was successfully organised by the CDMS on 15th January 2022. The quiz consisted of four rounds having 10 questions in each covering standard, moderate and difficult levels with elimination in each round. 97 participants were very enthusiastic to qualify for the first round and the intense competition made it more exciting for the students and audience.

CDMS successfully organised an online quiz competition, Game-O- Mania on February 4, 2022. The game consisted of six rounds of starting with Gibberish followed by tongue twister, crossword, riddle, word puzzle and situation-based questions along with some informative and lifesaving dos and don'ts at the time of a disaster occurrence. There were 181 registrations from all over India. The participants surprised the audience with their knowledge.

CDMS, in collaboration with the National Institute for Disaster Management, Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, organised a 3-day online training programme on "Disaster Management Plans to enhance the resilience of Institutional buildings." The speakers shed light on the various intricacies of enhancing the resilience of institutional buildings and the need for parties at all levels to come up with a blueprint adhering to the

current geographical and ecological conditions of the concerned sites to help strategies in the formulations of effective plans in this regard.

CDMS organised a virtual International Conference on Challenges to Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilient Habitat April 5-6, 2022 in collaboration with the National Institute of Disaster Management Ministry of Home Affairs Government of India, International Geographical Union Commission on Hazard And Risk And United Nations Office For Disaster Risk Reduction. The conference hosted four plenary sessions with twelve international speakers from the University of North Texas, US. The Knowledge partners with the conference include Bournemouth University, UK; Technical University Dortmund, Germany; University of Huddersfield, UK; University of Buffalo, New York, US; Climate Resilient, Observing-System Promotion Council; University of Manchester, UK; University of Tokyo, Japan; UNDRR; Keio University, Japan; University of New Castle, Australia and many more.

Scholarships and Medals Awarded to Meritorious Students

Every year, in keeping with its legacy, the college awards scholarships and medals to deserving and meritorious students who exhibit extraordinary performance in academics and other disciplines. In order to ensure transparency and curtail redundancies, funds were transferred directly to the students' bank accounts. Students from all departments were beneficiaries of this exercise. The eligibility for this aid was ascertained through a screening process. Interviews were conducted in online mode in the months of January and February 2022 to ascertain suitability.
