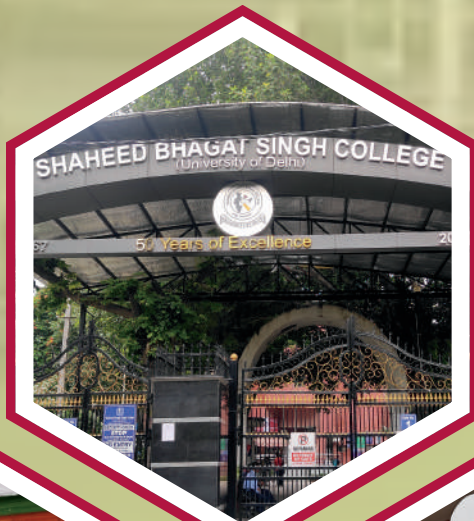

For the sake of brevity, let me mention that among the standout achievements were the unveiling of a fully renovated Shaheed Bhagat Singh statue; enhanced accessibility and teaching facilities through installation of new elevators; several smart classrooms and laboratories; upgraded seminar halls; and state-of-the-art facilities like the open-air auditorium, the Academic Auditorium, a new Staff Room, a video-conferencing committee room, and the renovated Library Reading Hall. These developments have not only improved infrastructure but also symbolized the college's forward-looking vision in alignment with NEP 2020 and its commitment to excellence.

Glimpses of the Inauguration of Infrastructure Facilities by the Honourable Vice-Chancellor, University of Delhi, Professor Yogesh Singh, and Other Esteemed Dignitaries

INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

Since its establishment in 1967, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College has upheld the belief that world-class education, promoting intellectual excellence and national service, requires modern infrastructure that fosters innovation and inclusion. Named after the freedom fighter Shaheed-e-Azam Sardar Bhagat Singh, the college embodies his revolutionary spirit, emphasizing the ongoing evolution of ideas and structures to adapt to societal needs, values, and technological advancements.

During the previous academic year, the college undertook a series of transformative infrastructure projects aimed at enriching the educational ecosystem and improving accessibility. The crowning moment in this journey was the visit of Prof. Yogesh Singh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi, along with other esteemed dignitaries such as Prof. Balaram Pani, Dean of Colleges, Prof. Shri Prakash Singh, Director, South Campus, and Dr. Vikas Gupta, Registrar, University of Delhi, who honored the college with their presence on July 22, 2024, to inaugurate these projects. Their presence marked a moment of great pride and reaffirmed the college's commitment to excellence in higher education.

Among the most significant achievements was the reconstruction and beautification of the statue of Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh, symbolizing courage and idealism while serving as an inspiration for values such as national pride, courage, and a sense of purpose in service. Equally notable were several key additions aimed at improving accessibility and enhancing the institutional environment. Two new elevators were installed to ensure enhanced mobility for all members of the college community. A fully air-conditioned and spacious staffroom was also developed, with a capacity to accommodate 250 faculty members. It features comfortable furnishings, LED lighting, a refrigerator, a modern restroom, and large windows overlooking the rejuvenating campus gardens.

In addition, a modernized video-conferencing committee room was established. This facility, designed to seat 35–40 participants, is equipped with high-end audio-visual systems, including LED screens, portable microphones, speakers, and integrated lighting solutions.

All of these developments were conceived with a focus on inclusivity, aesthetics, functionality, collaboration, community engagement, and the overall well-being of both faculty members and students.

The college also took a monumental step forward by constructing a state-of-the-art open-air auditorium equipped with rock-wool insulation, providing a venue for academic and cultural events where optimal design, flexibility, efficiency, and sustainability are seamlessly integrated.

The upgrading of seminar halls has significantly enhanced the academic infrastructure of the college. Several existing classrooms have been transformed into technology-enabled smart classrooms. These classrooms feature an auditorium-style or cavea-shaped layout designed to accommodate a hundred students. They are equipped with integrated digital infrastructure,

including podium systems, LCD interactive panel, high-speed Wi-Fi, sound systems, and smart cameras.

The college has also established new computer laboratories to support digital learning. These initiatives have set new benchmarks in the college's journey toward digital empowerment and pedagogical innovation.

The inauguration of the Knowledge Dissemination Centre, “***Gyan Prasar Kendra***,” represents a visionary leap toward democratizing access to quality education, offering online lectures, podcasts, and guidance and resources for competitive exam preparation to students across the country. Seeking to bridge the educational divide by leveraging technology to reach a wider student audience across the nation, Gyan Prasar Kendra, SBSC, maintains a dedicated YouTube channel, where students can access top-tier lectures by University of Delhi faculty, covering the regular college syllabi and competitive examinations such as UPSC-CSE and CUET-PG. The initiative also features podcasts with eminent personalities, offering insights that help students build confidence and clarity in their academic and professional pursuits. These initiatives reflect the college's belief in the words of Rabindranath Tagore: “Everything, including great education, that belongs to us comes to us if we create the capacity to receive it.”

Building on the ethos and momentum of these developments, the college made another significant stride with the inauguration of the newly constructed state-of-the-art Academic Auditorium on 17th February 2025. With a seating capacity of 230, the auditorium, located atop the library, marks a significant addition to the college's academic infrastructure. It includes features such as flexible seating arrangements, high-profile speakers, an elevated podium, powerful lighting, wall-mounted screens, wireless internet connectivity, enhanced accessibility through an inclined platform lift for wheelchair users or individuals requiring mobility assistance, a well-designed green room, and an emergency exit. The auditorium was inaugurated by our esteemed Chief Guest, Prof. Jagdish Mukhi, Former Governor of Assam, Nagaland and Mizoram, and Former Minister of Finance, Excise, Taxation, and Higher Education, Government of Delhi, who congratulated the college for achieving this milestone and highlighted the significance of such spaces for enabling insightful conferences, interactions, collaboration, and discussions across academic fields and institutions.

In anticipation of the demands of the four-year undergraduate program envisioned under NEP 2020, the college has been working ceaselessly on creating more spaces for lectures, engagements, and activities for the enrichment of our students. We have made notable additions to our ever-expanding catalog of smart classrooms with interactive panels and other enhancements in rooms C6, C7, and C8 this year. Two air-conditioned Activity Rooms have been constructed on the third floor for facilitating interactions such as tutorials, meetings, discussions, and round-table seminars.

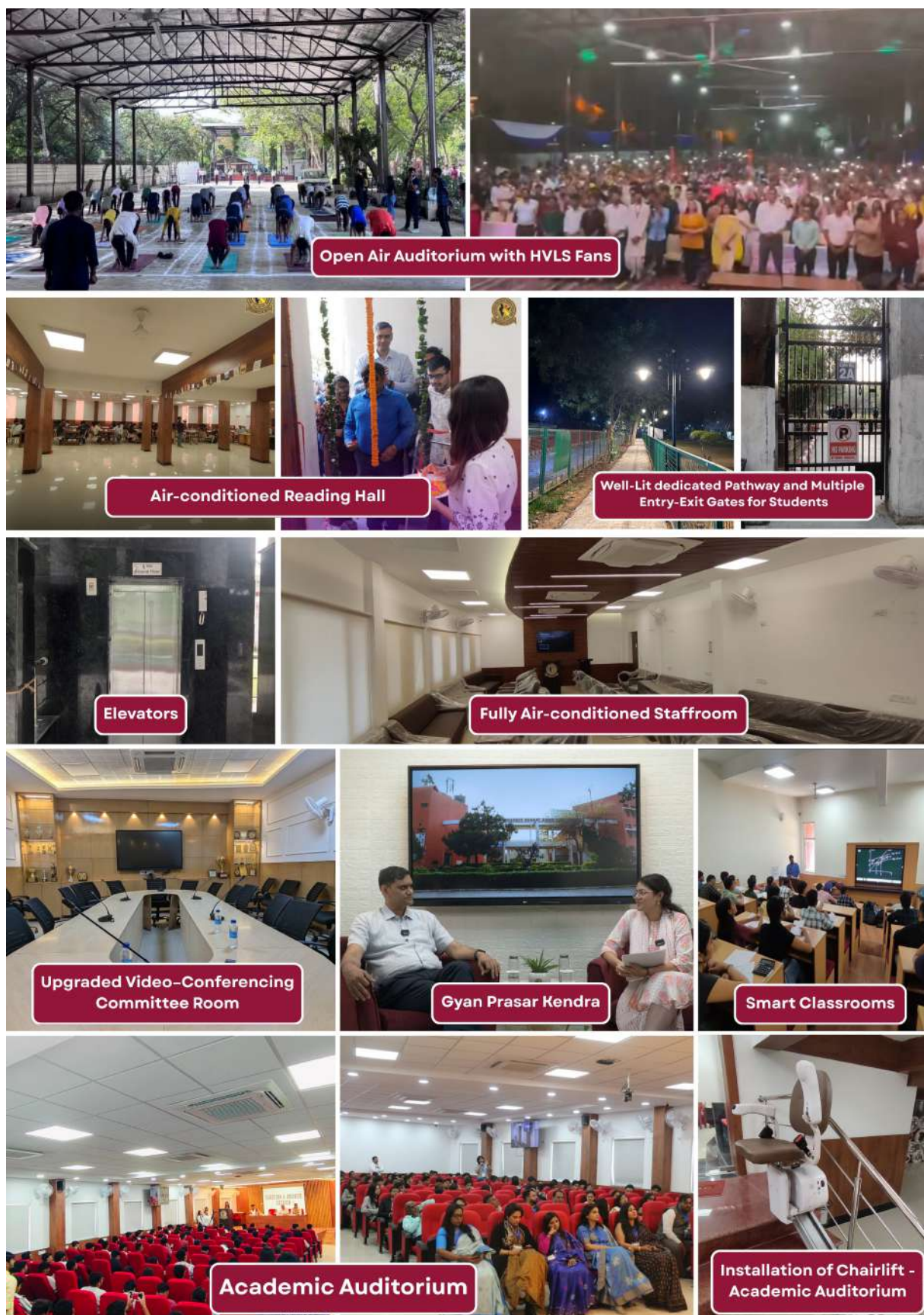
The addition of two newly constructed computer labs has generated enthusiasm about the possibilities and reforms promised under NEP with a four-year undergraduate program that includes research.

As another significant step in this direction, the newly renovated Reading Hall of the library, designed with enhanced seating arrangements in a comfortable, conducive, air-conditioned space that meets the needs of a diverse group of students, was inaugurated on 25th March 2025, a move that was applauded by all students and staff members present during the inaugural event. With the capacity to accommodate around 300 students, this hall has earned the distinction of being one of the largest air-conditioned reading halls among colleges of the University of Delhi. As part of our continued commitment to accessibility and inclusivity, this development has been carried out in a phased manner. Initially, fully functional lifts were installed to ensure easy access for all students, including students with disabilities (Divyangjan). Subsequently, the reading hall block was developed, ensuring that the facility is accessible and welcoming to everyone. Another crucial addition to the college library has been the Helen Keller Resource Centre, which is currently under development. This dedicated space inside the library will further strengthen our commitment to supporting students with disabilities, providing them with the resources, tools, and environment they need to thrive academically and personally. The college has also ensured that the library reading hall will remain open from 8:30 AM to 10:00 PM, and based on student needs and feedback, timings may be extended to midnight.

For student safety and convenience, a dedicated pathway was designed to help students exit without navigating alongside the vehicles plying on campus. Subsequently, the college added warm-toned street lighting at strategic locations across the campus, ensuring that the campus and its pathways remain well-lit throughout the evening while also enhancing the campus's aesthetic appeal. The entire lighting system was designed and executed in-house by the college's staff. This marks a significant achievement in our journey toward self-sufficiency and innovation, showcasing how collaboration within the college leads to impactful improvements for the college community. The project to set up an electric substation, envisioned to make all classrooms fully air-conditioned, is already complete. This, combined with structures like the newly installed shade canopy over the main entrance gate that shelters the area from hostile weather, will ensure that navigation, learning, are equally comfortable for all college members across the campus. We have also ensured that the mental health and well-being of our students are addressed by creating a safe space with a college counsellor who is available for online as well as offline sessions for students who need counselling, guidance, or help with their health, stressors, goals and growth.

Future and ongoing projects including the renovation of E-Block, the construction of a state-of-the-art Multipurpose Hall-cum-Sports Block, an ECA (Extra-Curricular Activities) Complex, and several new classrooms, the installation of digital display screens throughout the campus, floodlights for the college grounds, an air-conditioned canteen, and creation of well-equipped departmental rooms stand as a testament to the college's vision and forward-looking spirit. With these initiatives that promise an overhaul of educational possibilities, the college continues to invest in infrastructure that reflects its academic aspirations and the holistic development of its students. These historical milestones together mark an ongoing chapter in the college's pursuit of creating an environment where knowledge thrives and future leaders are shaped, in keeping with an ethos summarised by Abraham Lincoln when he famously announced: "The best way to predict your future is to create it".

Launch of Department Magazine - “संश्लेषण” and Lecture on “Democracy and Violence”

The *Skill Session*, held on 13th February 2025, focused on Data Analysis and Visualisation, Negotiation and Communication, and Crisis Management. The session was enriched with case studies and live demonstrations to enhance practical understanding.

These initiatives reflect the SCM Cell's commitment to aligning academic pursuits with industry expectations, equipping students with essential skills for success in dynamic supply chain environments.

180 DC: The 180 Degrees Consulting Society

180 Degrees Consulting (180 DC) is the world's largest student-led consultancy, committed to delivering affordable, high-quality consulting services to non-profits and social enterprises. At 180 DC SBSC, the society continues to uphold its mission of providing strategic solutions to socially driven organisations, while nurturing leadership, critical thinking, and professional development among its members.

During the academic session 2024–25, 180 DC SBSC undertook several impactful initiatives. A collaborative session with the Placement Cell was organised to guide first-year students on excelling in case competitions. A new department, Case Library & Resources, was established, curating a comprehensive collection of materials including a Consulting Interview Guide, case studies, guesstimates, frameworks, and competition resources. Internal training sessions were conducted for freshers, covering key areas such as consulting basics, cold emailing and calling, Canva design, research methodologies, and guesstimates. The society expanded its mentorship and industry engagement by onboarding over 30 professionals from leading firms, including the Big 3 and Big 4. Ashutosh, Pragyansh, and Harsh were runners-up at Masters' Union, earning a cash prize of ₹30,000, while Yash won at IIM Amritsar. These accomplishments were underpinned by the society's structured training and mentorship framework.

The Department of Economics commenced the academic year 2024-25 with an exciting orientation programme for first semester students. Mr. Jayesh Adeshra, former Associate Professor (retd.), Department of Economics, of the college, was also present during the event.

Ecospire: The Economics Society

Movie Screening – *Roger & Me*

Ecospire, the Economics Society of the college, organised a screening of the documentary *Roger & Me* on 13th November 2024. Directed by Michael Moore, the film examines the economic decline of Flint, Michigan, following General Motors' decision to close eleven manufacturing plants—resulting in approximately 30,000 job losses. The documentary explores themes of deindustrialisation, unemployment, globalisation, and economic inequality, while also portraying the resilience and determination of the affected former workers and local residents.

Workshop on the Gender Lens: Approaches & Praxis

Ecospire also conducted a workshop on 'Gender Lens: Approaches & Praxis' with Dr. Nupur Ray from Kamla Nehru College as the guest speaker. The event demonstrated how we unconsciously view society through a gendered lens and how to overcome our lack of awareness of the same. The seminar was a remarkable success and brought forth a forum for discussion of a vital and sensitive topic which is still left untouched by some sections of our society.

Economics Conundrums – A Battle of Perspectives

A workshop titled '*Gender Lens: Approaches & Praxis*' was organised, featuring Dr Nupur Ray from Kamala Nehru College as the guest speaker. The session examined how individuals often perceive society through an unconscious gendered lens and discussed approaches to addressing this lack of awareness. The seminar was highly successful, providing a meaningful forum for the discussion of a vital and sensitive issue that remains underexplored in certain segments of society.

Special Lecture on the Union Budget

A special lecture on the Union Budget 2025–26 was organised on 12th February 2025. Dr Surajit Das, Assistant Professor at the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning, Jawaharlal Nehru University, delivered the session, which provided a comprehensive overview of key economic principles and budgetary policies. The lecture proved to be highly insightful, offering a clear understanding of the Union Budget and its broader economic implications. The session effectively connected theoretical concepts such as fiscal deficits and government expenditure to real-world applications, enabling students to better appreciate the significance of budgetary measures in shaping the national economy.



Lecture on Migration in 20th Century India: The Colonial and Post-Colonial Experiences

A lecture on migration in 20th-century India was delivered on 19th March 2025 by Dr Camille Buat, Postdoctoral Research Fellow at the Centre for Modern Indian Studies, University of Göttingen, Germany.



ECONOTIZE: The Annual fest of Ecospire

Ecospire organised its annual fest *ECONOTIZE* on 29th March 2025, commencing with an inaugural lecture titled “*Urban Water and the Right to the City*”, delivered by Professor Marie-Hélène Zérah, Senior Researcher at the Institute of Research for Development, Paris. The fest included engaging competitions such as *ECONOX* (the case study competition) and *ECONOBID* (the auction competition), both judged by faculty members from Shaheed Bhagat Singh College and other institutions.

The concluding event of the day was a panel discussion on “*Decoding the Budget: Insights and Implications*”, led by two eminent scholars—Professor Arun Kumar, National Institute of Public Finance and Policy, and Professor (Retd.) Pinaki Chakraborty, Centre for Economic Studies and Planning, Jawaharlal Nehru University. The discussion provided critical perspectives on the Union Budget, contributing significantly to the intellectual engagement of the audience.

Arthshodh: The Economics Research Cell

Arthshodh, the Economics Research Cell, had an eventful academic year in 2024–25, actively promoting research aptitude and analytical skills among students through a series of workshops, activities, and research-based engagements. The Cell provided a platform for students to delve into economic inquiry, data interpretation, and academic writing. Key highlights from the year are as follows:

The academic year commenced with an **Orientation Programme** on 25th September 2024, aimed at introducing new members to the objectives and functioning of the Research Cell. During the session, the previous year's research projects were presented by the former Principal Investigator, providing a foundation and motivation for aspiring researchers. The session familiarised students with core components of research such as methodology, data collection, analysis, and report writing, encouraging active participation in upcoming projects.

On 10th February 2025, *Data Quest* was organised as a team-based analytical event. Participants, working in pairs, were assigned economic variables such as unemployment, inflation, GDP, demand, price levels, population, or related goods pricing. Each team collected data from credible sources spanning the past ten years, compiled it in tabular form, and presented notable trends and events linked to their assigned variable. The activity significantly enhanced students' data interpretation skills and real-world economic understanding.

A One-Day Online Workshop on Research Methodology was held on 22nd March 2025 for undergraduate and postgraduate students. The workshop covered essential components of the research process, including hypothesis development, data collection methods, the use of statistical tools, and academic report writing. The session aimed to strengthen the foundational research capabilities of the participants and better prepare them for future scholarly endeavours.

The Paper Presentation Event held on 5th April 2025 welcomed student participants from various colleges across India, who presented their research findings. A total of 56 research abstracts had been received, reflecting a wide spectrum of economic perspectives and intellectual inquiry. The event served as an academic platform for emerging researchers to showcase their work, engage in critical discussions, and receive feedback from experts in the field.

In addition to this event, the research divisions of *Arthshodh*—Micro and Macro—actively engaged in sponsored research projects in collaboration with St. Xavier's College, Jaipur. These projects were scheduled for completion by April 2025, with publication in the institution's academic journal forthcoming.

The Micro division examined how perceived quality, brand popularity, and social status influence students' preferences for branded smartphones in Delhi University colleges. Using survey data and statistical analysis, the study found battery life, branding, and social image as key factors, with price also significant due to students' financial constraints. It recommended that domestic manufacturers focus on brand value and affordability.

The Macro division studied the impact of automation on employment in India's manufacturing sector. Despite low robot density, sectors like textiles and electronics showed rising automation effects, particularly affecting informal workers. The research highlighted declining low-skilled jobs, rising demand for technical roles, and widening wage gaps. It proposed a policy framework

focused on reskilling, education reform, and inclusive strategies to balance technological advancement with social equity.

The Department of Economics had a productive year, fostering academic excellence through lectures, workshops, competitions, and research activities. These initiatives enabled students to enhance their critical thinking, analytical skills, and intellectual engagement.



DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

Bricolage: The Literary Society

The Department of English engaged in a range of creative ventures designed to help students better understand the praxis of academic and creative theory. By adopting a dynamic, multidisciplinary approach, these initiatives bridged the gap between theoretical inquiry and artistic expression, fostering critical thinking, and intellectual engagement.

The Editorial Board of Staff Advisors and Student Editors launched the first edition of its literary magazine, *Alyssum '24*, on May 7, 2024 during the Annual Day celebrations. The magazine serves as a platform for literary expression, critical thought, and creative engagement, showcasing the diverse voices of students and faculty.



As part of Piazza, the English Department's series of pseudo-symposium sessions, faculty and students collaboratively organized yet another engaging discussion on October 17th, 2024, on the evolving nature of the discipline of English. The diverse subjective perspectives enriched the dialogue, fostering a dynamic, interactive space within the classroom and encouraging in-depth literary discourse. In another such event of the Piazza, which took place on February 25th, 2025, a fun session was planned where discussions were held on “Animals in Literature and Life”. Students were delighted to share their personal stories which mirrored the events in some text or the other.

The students of the Department of English organized an enriching excursion to the Delhi Book Fair on February 6th, 2025 under Bricolage. They actively participated in literary discussions on language and attended insightful talks featuring distinguished speakers such as Shashi Tharoor and Prof. Jitendra Narayan Dash. The visit also provided an opportunity to explore the diverse world of publishing, with students engaging with works from renowned publishing houses, including Penguin Random House, HarperCollins, Bloomsbury, Rajkamal Prakashan, and Vani Prakashan.



To explore the discipline through a creative lens, the Department facilitated an engagement with visual interpretations of literary narratives through film screenings and discussions. As part of this initiative, *The Color Purple*, an adaptation of Alice Walker's novel, was screened on 7th of February. The screening was followed by an in-depth discussion on narratology, media theory,

the reception and interpretation of slave narratives, and their broader socio-cultural and historical dimensions.

In view of the enthusiastic participation and improved interaction from students, the Department organised similar screenings and discussions throughout February. These screenings include Fahrenheit 451 and Margarita with a Straw, each followed by critical discussions on their narrative structures, thematic concerns, and socio-political contexts.

On March 7th, 2025, a seminar was organized as part of our annual academic events, featuring distinguished speakers who shared their insights on a vast spectrum of topics and themes. The sessions were thought-provoking and provided valuable perspectives to students and faculty alike. Following the seminar, on March 8th, 2025, a series of student activities were conducted, fostering engagement, creativity, and collaboration among participants. These activities not only reinforced key learnings from the seminar but also provided an interactive platform for students to showcase their skills and enthusiasm.



Department of Environmental Science

Teacher-In-Charge: Mr. Harvinder Singh

Special lecture on “India’s space technology and sustainable development” by Prof. Chander Kumar Singh, Dean (Academics) TERI, New Delhi

India has made remarkable strides in space technology, with significant contributions to sustainable development. The Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) continues to play a vital role in advancing space science while addressing critical challenges related to climate change, environmental monitoring, agriculture, and resource management.



To explore the intersection of space technology and sustainability, the Department of Environmental Science organised a special lecture on the topic “*India’s Space Technology and Sustainable Development.*” The session was delivered by renowned environmentalist Professor Chander Kumar Singh, who offered insights into the global climate crisis, strategies for adopting sustainable practices, and emerging career opportunities in the field of green talent and environmental sustainability for aspiring young professionals.

Professor Chander Kumar Singh is a distinguished academic and researcher, currently serving as Dean (Academics) and faculty member in the Department of Natural and Applied Sciences at the TERI School of Advanced Studies (TERI SAS), New Delhi. His research interests include geochemistry, groundwater studies, and hyperspectral remote sensing. Over time, his work has expanded to examine the interactions between environmental factors and public health, with a particular focus on groundwater contamination.

The lecture provided students with a valuable perspective on the role of scientific innovation in addressing environmental challenges and highlighted pathways for impactful careers in the green economy.

Aravali Biodiversity Park, Vasant Vihar visit with 1st year AEC students

Environmental education is a global priority, and in line with this goal, the Department of Environmental Science conducted an outreach activity on 20th March 2024 at Aravalli Biodiversity Park, Vasant Vihar, New Delhi. The visit aimed to raise awareness among students and



the public about the importance of healthy ecosystems. Dr Dinesh Albertson, Scientific Officer at the park, briefed students on the ecological value of biodiversity parks in urban settings.

Aravalli Biodiversity Park is being developed on 699 acres of land previously degraded by mining and overrun with *Prosopis juliflora* (*Vilayati Kikar*). Its core mission is to restore the native biodiversity of the Delhi Aravallis. The park also promotes environmental education and public engagement, offering a space for experiential learning and awareness-building.

This outreach initiative provided participants with valuable insight into conservation efforts and the critical role of biodiversity in sustainable urban living.

Department of Geography

Teacher-In-Charge: Dr. Amrita Bajaj

The Department of Geography witnessed a highly engaging and academically enriching year, marked by a variety of field visits, seminars, conferences, and student-led initiatives aimed at enhancing practical knowledge and interdisciplinary understanding.

As part of its commitment to experiential learning, students of Semester VI undertook a field trip to western Gujarat to study the impact of Cyclone Biparjoy on coastal regions. The visit offered students valuable hands-on experience and an opportunity to analyse disaster management efforts in vulnerable areas. Similarly, students of Semester V conducted a field study in Joshimath, Uttarakhand, focusing on land subsidence. Through structured questionnaires, they engaged with local residents to understand the socio-environmental challenges they face. The group also trekked through Auli and the Garhwal Himalayas, gaining meaningful insights into terrain analysis and geophysical processes. Another field trip was conducted from 1st to 6th March 2025 to Shimla, Himachal Pradesh, to assess the city's carrying capacity and landslide susceptibility. Students conducted surveys in areas such as Tutikandi, Boileauganj, Chaura Maidan, Summerhill, and Mall Road. They also attended an academic session at Himachal Pradesh University and visited Kandaghat for extended data collection. An interactive session with a Forest Officer at Chail Palace further deepened their understanding of environmental challenges in the region.

The academic year began with an Orientation and Freshers' Meet, hosted by the Geography Association, to welcome incoming students. The event facilitated interaction between faculty members, senior students, and freshers. Various engaging activities and games were

conducted, and faculty members offered valuable guidance and shared their experiences with the students.

A series of academic events contributed to the department's intellectual environment. A seminar on "*Floodplains Hydromorphic Assessment Using Optical and Radar Remote Sensing Methods*" was delivered by Dr Manudeo Singh, Newton International Fellow at Aberystwyth University, UK. The session emphasised the importance of wetland creation and sustainable conservation approaches and was well-attended by both students and faculty. Another important academic initiative was the inaugural lecture on "*Careers and Placements in Geography*", delivered by Professor Anu Kapur from the Delhi School of Economics, University of Delhi. The lecture offered practical insights into the application of geotechnical skills in the professional world and guided students on enhancing their competencies for career development.

The department also hosted an International Conference titled "*Urban Development Missions, Restructuring of Spaces, and the Emergence of New Urbanism.*" This two-day event featured multiple research paper presentations and discussions centred around urbanisation trends and their implications. The conference concluded with a valedictory session attended by eminent professors and researchers from various institutions. A Cultural Night was held on the first day, providing an engaging and lively platform for student participation.

The annual departmental magazine, *Landscape 2025*, was launched on 8th March 2025 during the department's flagship festival *VASUNDHARA*. Titled "*Geospatial Perspectives: From Source to Sea*", this edition included research contributions from emerging scholars, focusing on river morphology. The editorial team ensured rigorous academic review, and the publication reflected the department's dedication to research excellence.

The annual fest *VASUNDHARA 2025* was held on 8th March 2025 on the theme "*Geographies of Power and People: The Socio-Political Landscape of the Global South.*" Distinguished guests, Professor Vijoy S. Sahay and Professor S.M. Patnaik, graced the event. The festival featured a variety of competitive and cultural events, including *Spatswar* (music competition), *Echoes and Eloquence* (extempore contest), *Darpan-e-Dastan* (reel-making competition), and *Thought Meridian* (Youth Parliament). The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from colleges and universities across the country, creating a vibrant platform for academic discourse and creative expression.

Through its blend of fieldwork, academic engagement, and student-led initiatives, the Department of Geography continues to provide a well-rounded educational experience, preparing students for both academic and professional excellence.



हिंदी विभाग

विभागाध्यक्ष : डॉ. राजकुमार राजन

हिंदी वार्षिकोत्सव 'मंत्रणा' सहित 5 संगोष्ठियों (अनहद, अनहद 2.0, अनहद 3.0, अनहद 4.0, अनहद 5.0) का सफल संचालन विभागाध्यक्ष डॉ. राजकुमार राजन के निर्देशानुसार किया गया है।

‘अनहद’ व्याख्यानमाला (2024–25)

शहीद भगत सिंह महाविद्यालय के हिंदी विभाग द्वारा आयोजित वार्षिक व्याख्यानमाला ‘अनहद’ श्रृंखला के अंतर्गत सत्र 2024–25 में पाँच विचारोत्तेजक कार्यक्रमों का आयोजन किया गया, जिनमें साहित्य, मीडिया, भाषा शिक्षण, स्त्री विमर्श, रचना प्रक्रिया तथा सामाजिक चिंतन जैसे विविध विषयों पर गंभीर संवाद हुआ।

‘अनहद 1.0’ का आयोजन 24 नवम्बर 2024 को “हिंदी मीडिया और लोकतंत्र” विषय पर किया गया, जिसमें प्रोफेसर सुधा सिंह (हिंदी विभाग, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय), एनडीटीवी की वरिष्ठ पत्रकार सिक्ता देव, तथा दैनिक जागरण के विशेष संवाददाता नीलू रंजन ने भाग लिया। वक्ताओं ने मीडिया की लोकतांत्रिक भूमिका और उसमें हिंदी भाषा के प्रभाव की चर्चा करते हुए यह रेखांकित किया कि हिंदी पत्रकारिता जनचेतना को सशक्त करने में अग्रणी भूमिका निभाती है।

‘अनहद 2.0’ 4 अक्टूबर 2024 को “वैश्विक स्तर पर हिंदी शिक्षण: दशा और दिशा” विषय पर आयोजित हुआ। इस सत्र में डॉ. ग्रेगरी वाई गोल्डिंग (एसोसिएट प्रोफेसर, दक्षिण एशिया अध्ययन विभाग) और डॉ. सुनील कुमार वर्मा (असिस्टेंट प्रोफेसर, हिंदी विभाग, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय) ने विचार प्रस्तुत किए। वक्ताओं ने बताया कि हिंदी भाषा की लोकप्रियता वैश्विक मंच पर लगातार बढ़ रही है और यह भारत की आर्थिक एवं सांस्कृतिक उपस्थिति के विस्तार का संकेत है।

‘अनहद 3.0’ का आयोजन 21 फरवरी 2025 को “बाजार और स्त्री मुक्ति का प्रश्न” विषय पर किया गया। प्रोफेसर स्वाति श्वेता (गार्गी कॉलेज) और डॉ. ज्योति चावला (इग्नू) ने बाजार संरचना के भीतर स्त्री की स्थिति पर अपने विचार साझा किए। उन्होंने कहा कि बाजार केवल लाभ अर्जन का माध्यम है, न कि सामाजिक परिवर्तन का, और यह स्त्री की



वस्तुकरण की प्रवृत्ति को बढ़ावा देता है। वक्ताओं ने पारंपरिक रुढ़ियों को चुनौती देने और स्त्री चेतना को पुनर्परिभाषित करने की आवश्यकता पर बल दिया।

‘अनहद 4.0’ 3 मार्च 2025 को “रचना प्रक्रिया और लेखक से मुलाकात” विषय पर आयोजित हुआ। इस कार्यक्रम में डॉ. उमाशंकर चौधरी (स्वामी श्रद्धानंद कॉलेज) और डॉ. प्रवीण कुमार (हिंदी विभाग, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय) ने अपने रचनात्मक अनुभव साझा किए। उन्होंने लेखन में संवेदनशीलता, आत्मसंवाद, और निरंतर अभ्यास की भूमिका को महत्वपूर्ण बताया। इस अवसर पर डॉ. चौधरी के उपन्यास ‘यायावर’ का विमोचन भी किया गया, जिससे साहित्यिक वातावरण को विशेष समृद्धि प्राप्त हुई।

‘अनहद 5.0’ का आयोजन 8 अप्रैल 2025 को “कबीर और आज का समाज” विषय पर किया गया। हिंदी सृजन साहित्य सभा द्वारा आयोजित इस संगोष्ठी के मुख्य वक्ता प्रोफेसर अनिल राय (हिंदी विभाग, दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय) रहे। उद्घाटन सत्र में विभागाध्यक्ष डॉ. राजकुमार राजन ने कबीर की विचारधारा और समकालीन समाज में उनकी प्रासंगिकता पर प्रकाश डाला। प्रोफेसर राय ने कहा कि कबीर की कविताएं आज भी जनमानस से सीधा संवाद करती हैं और सत्ता, पाखंड, तथा सामाजिक अन्याय का निर्भीक विरोध करती हैं। उन्होंने यह भी रेखांकित किया कि कबीर की कविता आत्मानुभूति और संवेदना की कविता है, जो व्यक्ति को आत्ममंथन और सामाजिक चेतना के मार्ग पर प्रेरित करती है।



‘अनहद’ व्याख्यानमाला की यह श्रृंखला न केवल शैक्षणिक रूप से समृद्ध रही, बल्कि विद्यार्थियों को समकालीन सामाजिक, सांस्कृतिक और साहित्यिक विमर्शों से जोड़ते हुए एक गहन संवाद की परंपरा को भी आगे बढ़ाने में सफल रही। यह हिंदी विभाग की सृजनात्मक सक्रियता और विचारधारात्मक प्रतिबद्धता का उत्कृष्ट उदाहरण है।

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

Teacher-In-Charge: Dr. Mrityunjay Kumar

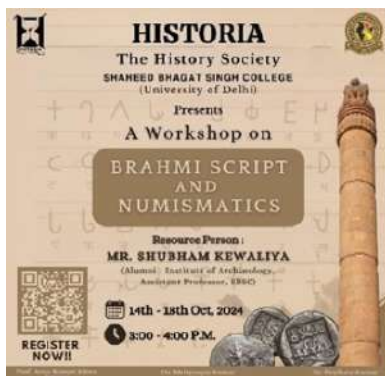
The academic session commenced with a documentary screening organised by *Historia*, the History Society, on 6th September 2024. The event featured a screening on *The Quit India Movement*, followed by a group discussion. The documentary offered an insightful exploration of the complexities of the movement, highlighting its multifaceted nature across various social classes and regions of the country. A short quiz on the Quit India Movement was also conducted for first-year students, who participated enthusiastically and demonstrated commendable awareness of India's freedom struggle.



On 18th September 2024, *Historia* screened another documentary titled *Secrets of Sinauli*, which focused on one of the most significant archaeological discoveries of the 21st century. The Sinauli site has revealed 116 human burials dating back nearly 4,000 years. Most notably, the discovery of a horse-driven chariot, dated to approximately 2000 BCE and constructed of wood and copper, has had a profound impact on prevailing narratives within Indian historical scholarship.

From 14th to 18th October 2024, *Historia* organised its first academic workshop of the year on the Brahmi script. The workshop was conducted by Mr Shubham Kewaliya, alumnus of the Institute of Archaeology, ASI, and Assistant Professor at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College. The Brahmi script, one of the oldest known writing systems of ancient India, originated in the 3rd century BCE. Its influence endures through its descendants—the Brahmic scripts—still in use across South and Southeast Asia. The workshop offered students valuable insights into early Indian epigraphy and provided a deeper understanding of India's cultural and historical legacy.

The society concluded its session with a compelling documentary screening on Veer Savarkar on 4th March 2025. This event aimed to shed light on the sacrifices made by national figures during India's freedom struggle. Through this initiative, *Historia* sought to honour the contributions and enduring legacy of those who played a pivotal role in the nation's fight for independence.



DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS

Teacher-In-Charge: Dr. Divya Bhambri

The Department of Mathematics organised a variety of intellectually stimulating activities during the academic year, encouraging academic growth, industry readiness, and community engagement. A series of alumni talks provided students with valuable career insights. Tanishk Agarwal (Batch of 2024) shared his journey of cracking the IIT JAM examination and transitioning to IISc Bangalore. Swapnil Singh (Batch of 2017), joining virtually from Germany, discussed opportunities for studying and working in Germany, covering applications, scholarships, and job search strategies. Ishita Singh (Batch of 2023) spoke on the corporate applications of mathematics in data analysis, finance, and consulting. Subodh Singh (Batch of 2023) outlined his journey to becoming an actuary and explained the profession's relevance in insurance and risk assessment. Anoushka Ghosh (Batch of 2020) shared her experience pursuing a Master's in Statistics and Data Science from the University of Edinburgh and securing a position as a Data Scientist at Hastings Direct in the UK.

On 1st February 2025, the department hosted a special lecture by Prof. Mansaf Alam from Jamia Millia Islamia on *Artificial Intelligence Using Mathematics and Recent Technologies*. The session explored the mathematical foundations of AI, including linear algebra, probability, and optimisation, and examined recent breakthroughs in machine learning and their practical applications. On 17th February 2025, Prof. Rashmi Bhardwaj, a Fellow of the Institute of Mathematics and its Applications (UK), delivered a lecture on *Nonlinear Dynamics and Mathematical Modelling*, highlighting applications in climate science, epidemiology, and finance, and introducing students to chaos theory and complex systems. As part of its social outreach, the department organised a visit to TARA NGO in Hauz Khas on 20th February 2025. Volunteers conducted engaging maths-based activities such as chess, Sudoku, and Vedic mathematics puzzles with underprivileged children, aiming to make learning enjoyable. Additionally, students donated clothes, books, and treats. The impact of



the visit was such that TARA NGO has formally requested the department to initiate regular pro bono mathematics classes for their children.

The department's annual fest, *Ganitam 2025*, brought mathematics to life through a variety of creative events. Highlights included *Numeric Expedition*, a live quiz; *IPL Auction*, a strategy-based analytics challenge; *Escape Room*, featuring timed mathematical puzzles; *Analytica*, a real-world data analysis case competition using Excel and Power BI; and engaging events such as chess, Sudoku, and Rubik's Cube challenges to enhance logical thinking. A paper presentation competition was also held, allowing participants to present research abstracts through structured slide decks.

Looking ahead, the department is set to launch its first annual magazine in June 2025. The publication will feature research articles, interviews, and creative student contributions, serving as a platform to showcase academic excellence and innovation within the department.

DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

Teacher-In-Charge: Dr. Saima Iqbal

The Department of Political Science conducted a diverse range of academic and professional activities throughout the academic year 2024–25. These initiatives included panel discussions, workshops, lectures, civil service sessions, and cultural events, aimed at fostering critical thinking and professional readiness.

The year began with a panel discussion on “China in the World Order: Implications for Indian Security” on 20th September 2024, featuring Major Namrata Dhasmana (Retd.), a geopolitical analyst, and moderated by Dr Rityusha Mani Tiwary. Major Dhasmana examined China's strategic role globally and its impact on Indian security, with a focus on the Indo-Pacific region.

A special lecture on “Gandhi's Concept of Satyagraha: Relevance in Today's Times” was held on 1st October 2024, led by Professor Manoranjan Mohanty. Drawing upon the ideas of Gandhi and Nelson Mandela, the lecture explored the enduring relevance of non-violent resistance in democratic societies.

In collaboration with the Department of Economics, a workshop on “The Gender Lens: Approaches and Praxis” was organised on 7th October 2024. Dr Nupur Ray facilitated interactive discussions on gender roles, inclusivity, and societal expectations.

The Magazine Committee hosted several interview sessions with successful civil servants. On 8th October, Mr Rituraj Sarma (AIR 462, UPSC 2023) shared strategies for exam preparation. IPS officer Aashna Chaudhary, in a session on 25th October, discussed her preparation journey and responsibilities as a civil servant. On 27th October, IAS officer Anubhav Singh (AIR 34, CSE 2022) shared his experiences balancing teaching and preparation. On 28th October, Mr Shiv Shankar Menon, former Foreign Secretary and National Security Advisor, discussed India’s evolving foreign policy landscape.

On 8th November 2024, the Book Discussion Committee hosted a review of *Hobbes Against Friendship* by Prof. Gabriella Slomp, followed by a lecture by Prof. Ashok Acharya on Hobbes’ relevance in modern political thought.

To support academic development, the department conducted a workshop on “Writing Research Articles” on 12th November 2024, led by Dr Rupak Kumar. A session on international postgraduate applications, held on 16th November in collaboration with Project EduAccess, featured speakers who shared their journeys to global universities.

A session on judicial reform on 23rd November 2024, led by journalist Saurav Das, addressed issues of judicial efficiency and transparency, with a particular focus on Justice DY Chandrachud’s tenure.

On 1st February 2025, the department and Gandhi Study Circle co-hosted a roundtable discussion with Gujarat Vidyapith on the relevance of Gandhian philosophy today. A policy research workshop followed on 3rd February, led by political strategist Mr Ritwik Mehta, and a session on blockchain in financial services was conducted on 13th February by Prof. Sanjay Mansabdar from Mahindra University.

The department’s annual fest, CHANAKYA 2025, held on 1st March 2025, celebrated intellectual discourse and cultural expression. The event featured an address by Prof. Bijayalaxmi Nanda, the launch of the department’s magazine “चक्रviewह”, competitive events such as शास्त्रार्थ (semi-parliamentary debate), *Policraft* (policy-making challenge), and concluded with *Shaam Shandaar*, an evening of cultural performances.

Overall, the department's initiatives reflected its commitment to interdisciplinary scholarship, policy discourse, and student development across academic and co-curricular dimensions.



ACTIVITIES OF SBSC CENTRES

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

Presiding Officer: Prof. Poonam Sharma

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) continued its efforts to promote awareness about its role and the legal framework under the POSH Act, reinforcing the college's commitment to maintaining a safe and harassment-free environment for women. Key information regarding the ICC's functions and complaint procedures was prominently displayed across the campus to ensure accessibility and transparency. Student members were elected for the session, and communication was effectively established with the student body.

An interactive orientation session was organised for student nominees, during which ICC members explained the committee's responsibilities, the provisions of the POSH Act, the complaint-handling process, and the duties of involved parties. The session was informative and well-received, encouraging student engagement with institutional safeguards.

To improve clarity and accessibility, the ICC developed a set of Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) outlining the complaint process, inquiry procedures, implications of false complaints, and other relevant aspects. These are available on the college website to support wider understanding.

Prof. Poonam Sharma, Presiding Officer of the ICC, delivered a lecture on the occasion of International Women's Day at Sripat Singh College, Murshidabad, West Bengal, contributing to broader discourse on gender sensitisation and institutional responsibility.

Gyan Prasar Kendra

Director: Dr. Mahesh Kumar Chaudhary

Gyan Prasaar Kendra, established at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi, stands as a pioneering initiative aimed at making quality education accessible to all. Under the leadership of Director Dr Mahesh Kumar Chaudhary, the centre provides structured learning resources tailored for university examinations, competitive exams, and academic contests across disciplines such as economics, mathematics, commerce, accounting, and the liberal arts. Recognising that many students face challenges in accessing quality instruction and study materials, this initiative bridges that gap by offering expert-led lectures and curated academic content.

Launched on 25th November 2023 under the guidance of Principal Professor Arun Kumar Attree, Gyan Prasaar Kendra functions from a state-of-the-art live studio located in Block A of the college. The facility is equipped with a soundproof recording room, high-resolution cameras, a green screen setup, a smart board, an editing suite, and a podcast studio furnished with professional-grade microphones. These features enable the production of high-quality educational content, including video lectures focused on semester syllabi and competitive exam preparation, covering key concepts and frequently asked questions.

Beyond traditional lectures, the Kendra also produces podcasts, interactive discussions, and expert interviews that foster intellectual and cognitive development. It further serves as a media hub, recording and streaming live college events, producing info-entertainment content, and generating short-form videos to inform and engage the student community.

The platform is open for use by all college societies, providing access to its advanced technological infrastructure for the enhancement of their respective events. Over time, Gyan Prasaar Kendra has evolved into a dynamic and expanding repository of academic content, garnering hundreds of thousands of views. Its increasing reach and monetisation success reflect the collaborative efforts of faculty, interns, and students dedicated to its mission.

By merging technological advancement with academic excellence, Gyan Prasaar Kendra is actively contributing to the creation of a knowledge-driven ecosystem, advancing the national vision of a “Viksit Bharat” through inclusive and innovative education.

Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research

Formed with the aim of fostering a research-oriented academic environment, the Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research has, since its inception, worked towards cultivating a deeper understanding of India’s revolutionary history. In its founding year, the Centre curated an extensive repository of books, articles, and archival material on Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh and fellow revolutionaries through sustained archival visits. In recent years, the Centre has organised a series of online and offline lectures, book readings, academic excursions, and documentary screenings to sensitise students about the revolutionary movement and to nurture academic engagement within the college community.

During the academic session, the Centre hosted several impactful events on India's freedom struggle. On 6th September 2024, in collaboration with *Historia – The History Society*, Department of History, the Centre organised a documentary screening on the *Quit India Movement*. Students from across years and disciplines attended the screening and participated in a group discussion exploring its key themes and historical nuances. The event concluded with a quiz competition for newly admitted first-year students, serving as both an academic orientation and a co-curricular introduction. The quiz, curated by student members of the Centre, challenged participants with thought-provoking questions and saw active, spirited participation.

On 4th October 2024, the Centre hosted an insightful lecture titled “*Revolutionaries on Trial*”, delivered by Professor Aparna Vaidik, Professor of History at Ashoka University. Professor Vaidik provided a critical and engaging account of historiographical representations of revolutionaries, with a focus on Shaheed Bhagat Singh. She discussed public perceptions of revolutionaries across different time periods and examined the dynamics of the Lahore Conspiracy Case trial, highlighting the roles played by the colonial state, the revolutionaries, and the public. Her lecture provoked thoughtful discussion and offered students a deeper analytical lens through which to study India's revolutionary past. Through these initiatives, the Centre continues to deepen historical awareness and promote critical discourse on India's freedom struggle, reinforcing the legacy of Shaheed Bhagat Singh through rigorous academic engagement.



Centre for Skill Development

The Entrepreneurship Cell (E-CELL)

The Entrepreneurship Cell undertook several impactful initiatives during the academic year to promote entrepreneurial thinking and skill development among students. The *Talk2Preneur* speaker series saw three engaging sessions with renowned entrepreneurs. On 11th April 2024, Chetanya Malhotra, founder of Kalakaram, spoke about creative entrepreneurship and the toy industry. In the second episode, Abhit Sinha, founder of Orbo AI, inspired participants through a multi-round competition including a quiz, elevator pitch, and strategic bidding round, before sharing insights on AI and startups. The third episode, held on 24th March 2025, featured Fabrice Grinda, co-founder of OLX, who shared his journey in global entrepreneurship and scaling ventures.

A comprehensive *7-Day Workshop Series on Entrepreneurship*, held from 23rd–30th November 2024, equipped students with practical skills in ideation, business models, finance, and pitching. The Cell's bi-annual flagship event, *E-NOVATION 6.0*, held on 21st and 25th February 2025, challenged participants with creative and strategic problem-solving tasks. On 6th March 2025, a seminar on *Effective Communication*, conducted by Ms Geeta Khurana, emphasised the importance of articulating impactful messages in business contexts. This was followed by a workshop on *AI in Entrepreneurship* on 27th March 2025, led by Mr Aman Kapoor, who highlighted AI's applications in business innovation and strategy.

The annual flagship event, *EMINENCE*, is scheduled for April 2025 and will feature panel discussions, industrial visits, and startup exhibitions, offering students a platform for networking and learning. The Cell has also secured live projects to provide hands-on exposure. A collaboration with **Ayouthveda**, a leading Ayurvedic skincare brand, will involve students in market research and consumer analysis. Another project with **Uttejana Foundation**, an NGO focused on youth and community development, will involve roles in social media, content creation, project coordination, and fundraising, nurturing leadership and social responsibility among participants.

Through these diverse initiatives, E-Cell continues to cultivate a dynamic ecosystem for innovation, enterprise, and experiential learning.

Incubation Cell

The Incubation Cell functions as a dynamic hub for innovation and entrepreneurship, guiding students through the entire entrepreneurial journey from ideation to execution. Focused on experiential learning, the Cell offers mentorship, live projects, industry collaborations, and startup incubation, positioning itself as a launchpad for impactful student-led ventures.

To promote entrepreneurial thinking, the Cell hosted *Udyamita Protsahan Sammelan* in association with *Udhmodya Foundation*, featuring expert talks and interactive sessions. Professor Ashwani Mahajan, noted economist and Rashtriya Seh Sanyojak of Swadeshi Jagran Manch, delivered the keynote address, encouraging students to view entrepreneurship as a driver of innovation and self-reliance.

The Cell also organised *Venture Vista*, a multi-stage competition comprising an online quiz, an auction round, and a business pitch, designed to test participants' strategic and analytical thinking. As part of its flagship event *Ignite 25*, an entrepreneurial challenge was held, where student teams tackled real-world problems with creative solutions. Both events fostered innovation, problem-solving, and collaboration.

In collaboration with other societies, the Cell also hosted *Eureka*, an event featuring a Startup Fair and a panel discussion with founders and CEOs of leading organisations. The initiative provided a networking platform and facilitated knowledge exchange between budding entrepreneurs and established industry leaders.

The *Venture Voices* podcast series, hosted by students of the Cell, brings forward inspiring conversations with entrepreneurs from organisations such as EventBeep Entertainment, AIRTH, and TaratanHQ. These episodes, shared on social media, offer students insights into entrepreneurial journeys and challenges, sparking curiosity and motivation among aspiring innovators.

The Cell has also successfully incubated *Educonse*, providing mentorship, industry networking, and professional guidance to help the startup scale effectively. By fostering such initiatives, the Incubation Cell continues to nurture a vibrant ecosystem of innovation and entrepreneurial growth within the college.

The Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems

The Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems participated in numerous IKS-related activities, symposia, and conferences, beginning with the inaugural ceremony of the Indian Knowledge Systems Programme—a sponsored research project of IIT Delhi held on October 17, 2025. Eminent speakers such as Dr. Rajiv Kumar, Former VC, Niti Aayog, Prof. K. Ramasubramanian, IIT Bombay, Dr. Sampadananda Mishra, Rishihood University, Shri Santosh Mishra, Former IAS, Secretary to Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Dr. Raj Vedam, Faculty at Arsha Seva Kendram and Shri Rajiv Vasudevan, Founder & CEO, Apollo AyurVAID Hospitals addressed the gathering on diverse issues such as Public Systems, Education and Pedagogy, Health and Well-Being and Technology.

Representatives from CIKS@SBSC also participated in and completed the workshop on “History and Global Spread of Indian Knowledge Systems” as part of the IKS Programme under the sponsored research project of IIT Delhi from October 17-20, 2024. The faculty for the 4-day workshop was Prof. Raj Vedam, Faculty at Arsha Seva Kendram.

Faculty from CIKS@SBSC also participated in the round table discussions on Indian Knowledge Systems and Public Policy at the IRD Conference Hall, IIT Delhi from Jan. 31-Feb 2, 2025. The speakers for the different sessions were Dr. R. Balasubramaniam, Member-Human Resource, Capacity Building Commission, Shri Vikramjit Banerjee, Additional Solicitor General of India, Shri Santosh Mishra, Shri Sridhar Potaraju, Shri Rahul Goswami, Dr. Srinivas Jammalamadaka, Shri Shivakumar GV, Prof. Nomesh Bolia and Shri Shankar Bharadwaj.

The Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems of the College organized an Essay Writing Competition on “Swadesh Darshan: Revisiting Bharata’s Itihasa” on March 26, 2025, for which we received 26 registrations from different colleges. The first prize went to a student of Daulat Ram College, and the other prize winners were from Shaheed Bhagat Singh College.

Centre For Writing and Communication

The Centre for Writing and Communication (CWC) is a pioneering initiative within the University of Delhi, established as a dedicated space to enhance communication, critical thinking, and research skills among students and faculty. The Centre engages with a diverse academic community and external experts to promote a multidisciplinary understanding of writing and communication.

CWC was envisioned to address gaps in language confidence and soft skills, providing students with the opportunity to develop their creativity and critical thinking without the constraints of linguistic barriers. The Centre offers structured *Add-On Courses* in English grammar and the

core competencies of listening, reading, writing, and speaking, along with guided conversation circles, personalised tutoring, and regular workshops on academic and creative writing, research, and publication.

Throughout the academic year 2024–25, CWC has conducted regular *Grammar Classes* using a student-centric approach, and *Conversation Circles* that allow students to practise communication and interpersonal skills through structured discussions led by peer educators and faculty facilitators.



On 12th November 2024, the Centre organised an interactive workshop titled, What's AI Got to do With It: A Comprehensive Workshop on the Promises, Perils, and Purposes of Artificial Intelligence. Led by Dr Sudeep Raj Kumar (Hindu College) and Mr Gaurav Kumar (SBSC), the workshop introduced participants to essential concepts of AI through three modules: Understanding Artificial Intelligence, Rethinking Artificial Intelligence, and Tools of the Trade. It concluded with a thoughtful discussion on the implications of AI on human cognition, skill, and future employment, highlighting the continuing importance of communication and writing in an evolving digital landscape.



The Centre for Writing and Communication continues to serve as a space for inclusive learning, empowering students to meet academic, professional, and personal challenges through enhanced language and communication skills.

The Center for School of Happiness - Har Ghar Dhyaan

As part of the *School of Happiness* initiative, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, in collaboration with the Art of Living, organised a transformative session titled *Know Your Mind* for its faculty and staff on 1st May 2024. This one-hour workshop focused on harnessing the power of breath to calm the mind and revitalise the body. Participants were introduced to meditation techniques, stress reduction strategies, and practices to improve overall well-being. Centre for Blended Learning

The Center for Blended Learning in collaboration with IIM Bangalore, successfully launched the Essentials of International Marketing, a 3-credit course under the aegis of SWAYAM, the Ministry of Education, Government of India. This course, offering 6.5 (NrCF) credits, has witnessed two successful runs, with over 1800 students in the first cohort and 1000 in the second. Designed to equip students with key concepts of global marketing, the course provided an interactive learning experience, combining academic insights and real-world applications. The program has empowered students to gain a comprehensive understanding of international marketing dynamics, contributing to their academic and professional growth.

Women Development Centre

Amidst ongoing gender discourse, the Women Development Cell (WDC) remained steadfast in its mission to foster awareness, inclusivity, and empowerment. Throughout the academic year, the Cell undertook a series of impactful initiatives designed to challenge indifference and dismantle entrenched gender stereotypes. Rooted in the belief that solidarity across all genders is key to meaningful social transformation, WDC focused on creating inclusive spaces for dialogue and advocacy.



The year began with the *Inaugural Orientation Ceremony* on 6th September 2024, where incoming students were introduced to the Cell's objectives and engagement opportunities. Guest speaker Ms Kriti Sehgal shared valuable insights on personal development and life choices. On 13th September, a collaborative event with Aashray Foundation and Girl Up featured a *Period Pain Simulator* and a *Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign*, encouraging empathy and



open conversations around women's health.

A *Personality Development Workshop* titled *BYOB (Be Your Own Boss)*, held on 18th October in partnership with Right Side Story, focused on communication, self-confidence, and personal branding. On 24th October, WDC presented a musical performance titled *VIRANGNA* at Divyotsav 2.0, celebrating themes of empowerment and fearless womanhood.

WDC also led several community outreach initiatives. A *Diwali Drive* in Okhla on 20th October brought festive joy through the distribution of diyas, sweets, and essential supplies, while a *Donation Drive* on 14th November, conducted with Sankalp NGO and Kerrimo India on International Girl Child Day, supported underprivileged children with educational and daily-use materials.

On 1st March 2025, a *Health Seminar* was conducted in collaboration with World University Services–DUC, with Dr Sheetal Agarwal addressing preventive healthcare and holistic wellness. This was followed by the launch of an original *Short Film* on 8th March, marking International Women's Day, advocating for gender empowerment and the importance of embracing feminine perspectives.

The *Sanitary Pad Distribution Drive* in Lal Bagh, Azadpur on 19th March promoted menstrual hygiene and encouraged participants to share personal experiences, helping to normalise conversations around menstruation. Regular group discussions were held throughout the year, offering a platform for critical engagement on topics related to empowerment, identity, and equality.

The year concluded with *Ruhani*, a culminating event featuring a panel discussion on *Sacred Success: Merging Spiritual Wisdom with Modern Ambitions*. The celebration also included *Policraft*—a policy-making challenge, *O-Womaniya*—a Bollywood-themed event, and *Symposium*—a case-based analytical competition. Collectively, these initiatives exemplified WDC's commitment to holistic empowerment and social awareness through creative, academic, and community-driven platforms.



Enabling Unit

The Enabling Unit of the College, committed to ensuring equitable and inclusive development for students with disabilities, organised two significant events during the academic session.

The first event, held on 23rd September 2024 in the college conference hall, was an interactive panel discussion on “*Accessibility and Rights of the Physically Challenged Students*”. The session began with an opening address by Dr V. A. V. Raman, Coordinator of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), followed by a keynote address from Dr Sanjay Kumar H. M., Professor of International Relations and Director, Centre for India-Canada Studies, University of Delhi. Dr Kumar’s remarks highlighted the systemic insensitivities faced by students with disabilities and contextualised the limitations of current frameworks such as the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. The panel also featured insights from Dr S. Vardharaj, who enriched the discussion with reflections on the historical and institutional aspects of accessibility in education. The event concluded with an engaging Q&A session.



The second event marked the observance of *World Braille Day* on 4th January 2025 and was conducted virtually via Microsoft Teams. Titled “*Evaluation of Braille: Past, Present and Future*”, the event commemorated the legacy of Louis Braille and explored the continued relevance of Braille literacy in a digitally evolving world. Following opening remarks by Dr Raman and Dr Charu Chopra, who offered a brief overview of Braille’s historical development, Ms Ritam Gupta discussed recent technological innovations promoting inclusivity for the visually impaired.

The keynote speaker, Mr Venkatesh Chari, CEO of Orbit Research, delivered a comprehensive presentation on emerging assistive technologies. He showcased the *Orbit Reader*, a cost-effective, multifunctional Braille display device that functions as a book reader, note-taker, and external Braille display. He also discussed other innovations such as the *Graphiti Interactive*, a modern tactile-graphic display system. Mr Chari’s contributions, grounded in research and product development, highlighted the transformative potential of accessible technology.



The event concluded with a Q&A session, followed by a formal vote of thanks delivered by Mr Pranay Sood. Through these initiatives, the Enabling Unit reaffirmed its commitment to accessibility, advocacy, and inclusive academic spaces for all.

Gandhi Study Circle

During the academic year 2024–25, the Gandhi Study Circle undertook several impactful initiatives aimed at deepening understanding and engagement with Gandhian philosophy.

On 1st October 2024, the Circle, in collaboration with the Department of Political Science, organised a *Special Lecture on “Gandhi’s Concept of Satyagraha – Relevance Today”* in Seminar Room C1. Delivered by Prof. Manoranjan Mohanty, the lecture explored the core principles of Satyagraha—truth, non-violence, and civil resistance—while emphasising their continued relevance in contemporary socio-political contexts. The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from students and faculty, sparking reflective dialogue.



From 21st to 25th January 2025, members of the Circle embarked on an educational visit across Gujarat to trace Mahatma Gandhi’s legacy. On 22nd January, a roundtable at Gujarat Vidyapith, Ahmedabad, explored *“Gandhian Philosophy: Teaching and Praxis”*. Visits to Sabarmati and Kochrab Ashrams on 23rd January provided a profound experiential connection to Gandhi’s ideals. On 24th January, members attended a workshop on Gandhian Studies at the Central University of Gujarat, Vadodara, followed by a rural field visit that offered valuable insights into community empowerment. The itinerary concluded with academic interactions at the Forum on Contemporary Theory, enriching participants' perspectives on Gandhian relevance in the modern world. The trip proved to be a deeply transformative learning experience.



On 1st February 2025, a *Roundtable Discussion on “Gandhi’s Relevance in the Modern World”* was held in Room C5. Organised by Dr Saima Iqbal and Dr Rityusha Mani Tiwary, and joined by a delegation from Gujarat Vidyapith, the event facilitated vibrant interdisciplinary exchange on Gandhi’s multidimensional thought and its applications in addressing present-day challenges.

Throughout the academic year, the Circle has also hosted *Samwad*, a weekly forum dedicated to the discussion of Gandhian themes such as non-violence, self-reliance, democracy, and education. These 1–2-hour sessions provide an open platform for critical engagement and contextual exploration, fostering analytical thinking and thoughtful dialogue among participants.

Through awareness campaigns, hands-on initiatives, and reflective dialogues, the society worked to embed a sense of environmental responsibility within the college community.

The year commenced with the celebration of **World Environment Day** on 5th June 2024. Activities included sapling plantations on campus, an eco-pledge, an online quiz, and a documentary screening. The highlight of the day was the collective pledge-taking ceremony where students, faculty, and staff reaffirmed their commitment to sustainable living.

On 21st August, Harithkram volunteers visited Satpula to observe developments in local water management. On 28th August, a delegation of faculty and student members participated in the *International Green Boardroom* hosted by Indraprastha College for Women as part of the international seminar “*Envisioning Bharat as the Voice of the Global South: Revisiting COP 28.*”

Harithkram's 13th Foundation Day, observed on 7th September 2024, brought together past and present members to reflect on the society's journey. Alumni environmentalists including Mr Lakshya Yog, Mr Arghadeep Das, Mr Ashraf Nehal, Ms Analiya MJ, and Mr Abhishek Rajhans shared their experiences in environmental research and advocacy. An informal interaction followed, highlighting the long-term impact of Harithkram's values on its members.

On 18th October, a workshop on *Sustainable Living* was conducted at Pragyan School, Greater Noida, by alumnus Abhishek Rajhans, volunteer Kamakshi, and Staff Advisor Dr V. A. V. Raman. It engaged students from grades VI–VIII and promoted simple, mindful environmental practices.

The **Delhi University Sustainability Forum (DUSF) 6.0** was held on 25th October with the theme “*Resilient India for a Sustainable Future: Rediscovering Indigenous Wisdom and Embracing Holistic Practices.*” The forum was inaugurated with a keynote address by Mr Ravi Singh, Secretary General and CEO, WWF-India. A compelling presentation by alumnus Abhishek Rajhans on the Piplantri Village case study followed. The panel discussion featured Dr Fawzia Tarannum, Mr Samarrth Khanna, and Mr Chetan Agarwal, and was moderated by Mr Lakshya Yog. Col. Prof. Sanjay Srivastava of TERI SAS delivered the valedictory address.

The forum also included the **Harithkram Youth Summit**, focused on *Green Entrepreneurship: Harnessing Indigenous Wisdom for a Sustainable Future*. Undergraduate participants presented innovative ideas before a jury comprising Ms Payal Rastogi (Carbon Fixers) and Mr Harvinder Singh (Department of Environmental Science, SBSC). School students took part in an online essay competition, and a national photography contest was organised, both centred on the forum's theme.

Harithkram members engaged in external dialogues as well. Gaurav Kaundinya attended the *Youth Dialogue on the Living Planet Report 2024* hosted by WWF-India, while Anuj Mudgal represented the college at the *Youth Climate Conclave 2025* organised under the India-EU Clean Energy and Climate Partnership by TERI.

The society hosted an **alumni interaction session** with Mr Ashraf Nehal, alumnus and Secretary at the Grenada High Commission in London. As a youth leader at the Commonwealth Secretariat and a former Harithkram volunteer, he inspired students with his journey in environmental diplomacy.

On **22nd March 2025**, Harithkram observed **Earth Hour**, which coincided with **World Water Day**, through a series of creative activities including a documentary screening, quiz, open mic, jamming session, and dark photography competition. Participation extended beyond the college community, reflecting growing engagement with climate consciousness.

Two sessions of **Eco-Confluence** were organised during the year. These free-flowing discussion forums provided space for students and volunteers to reflect on environmental issues in a more conversational and participatory manner.

Harithkram continues to evolve as more than just a society—it stands as a collective movement towards sustainable living. Every event, workshop, and dialogue serves as a step towards a future where environmental responsibility becomes a way of life. 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Udaan

(The Civil Services Society)

UDAAN, the Civil Services Society, was founded with the objective of mentoring and guiding students preparing for the UPSC Civil Services Examination. The society is committed to nurturing future public servants by fostering analytical thinking, current affairs awareness, and effective answer-writing skills—qualities that are fundamental for success in civil services. Throughout the academic year 2024–25, UDAAN organised a range of academically enriching initiatives, including expert lectures, alumni interactions, and targeted academic programmes aimed at providing real-world exposure and strategic preparation.

Among the most impactful activities were interactive sessions with distinguished alumni and serving officers. Mr Priyanshu Jain (Batch of 2018, AIR 808 – UPSC CSE) shared a detailed strategy covering all three stages of the exam and offered motivational guidance on resilience and overcoming setbacks. Mr Ashraf Nehal (Batch of 2018), now Secretary at the Grenada High Commission, London, discussed the role of civil servants in international diplomacy and policy formulation. Sessions with serving officers included one by Mr Viney Kumar Yadav (IPS), who shared his preparation journey, insights into the duties of the Indian Police Service, and guidance on physical and mental fitness. Mr Sudhir Pratap Singh Charan (Probationary IPS) conducted a session on “Challenges to India’s Internal Security”, addressing contemporary issues such as terrorism, cyber threats, and the IPS’s role in national safety.

Under the UPSC Diaries ’25 initiative, a seminar titled “Unleashing the Path to Success in UPSC-CSE” was held in collaboration with Vajiram & Ravi IAS. Mr Sanjai Oberai, former UPSC Head Examiner, offered expert guidance on answer-writing strategies and the demands of the Mains examination. Another seminar, “Role of Bureaucracy in Policy Making in India,” was delivered by Mr Girivar Dayal Singh, IAS and Revenue Secretary, Government of Bihar, who shared his administrative experiences and the impact of bureaucratic decisions on policy-making. These sessions provided valuable exposure to the responsibilities and realities of a career in the civil services.

To complement these engagements, UDAAN launched several academic and peer-led initiatives designed to support students' daily preparation. These included daily e-newspaper distribution via WhatsApp, weekly news analysis, and a Prelims Question Series with detailed solutions on WhatsApp and Telegram. The society also curated infographic-based current affairs resources to support visual learning and produced student-led videos on major national and international developments. These efforts not only enhanced students’ subject understanding but also strengthened their articulation, presentation, and writing skills.

UDAAN remains a cornerstone of civil services preparation at the college, committed to empowering students through structured support, exposure to real-world challenges, and a disciplined, aspirational academic culture.

The society's semi-annual flagship event, *Yuvamanthan*, was held on 21st–22nd September 2024. Themed “*Shaping the Future of India – A Vision for 2047 (Viksit Bharat)*”, the event attracted over 150 enthusiastic participants. It served as a dynamic platform for individuals passionate about global governance, diplomacy, and national development, offering students meaningful insights into international relations and public policy.

The annual flagship event, *Youth Conclave 2025*, was held on 22nd–23rd February 2025, under the theme “*Ek Nayi Udaan: Shaping a New Era of Progress*”. With over 300 delegates from across Delhi and surrounding regions, the event provided an opportunity for young minds to engage in structured dialogue on global challenges and diplomatic responses. The conclave successfully cultivated public speaking and negotiation skills among the participants through engaging simulations and debates.

In pursuit of capacity building, *Sankalp Samvad*, a mentorship and training initiative, was launched to introduce students to the world of Model United Nations. The workshop featured sessions by experienced executive board members and experts from the MUN circuit, who offered lectures on committee procedures, diplomatic strategies, resolution drafting, and public speaking. The initiative was well received by students seeking to refine their understanding of international diplomacy and simulation-based discourse.

To reinforce internal learning, the society organised an *Intra-Society MUN Conference*, exclusively for its members. This event enabled participants to experience competitive committee simulations in a familiar environment, encouraging practical application of MUN protocol, policy research, and collaboration.

The society earned major accolades at prestigious national platforms, including BITS Pilani, Mood Indigo, and IIM Kashipur. The session began with Spardha's annual auditions on 17th September 2024, which saw enthusiastic participation from students across all years.

Among the society's notable initiatives was *Pre Rev-Up*, an offline bidding game conducted on 15th March 2025, attracting 60–75 participants from dance societies across Delhi University. The event encouraged on-the-spot thinking, social interaction, and collaborative problem-solving. The highlight of the session was *Rev Up*, the National Inter-College Dance Competition held on 9th April 2025, which witnessed participation from institutions across India and a vibrant audience of over 800 attendees.

Spardha's collaborations with multiple sponsors throughout the year provided members with valuable exposure to professional environments, helping them develop organisational skills and real-world experience. The society continues to blend performance excellence with experiential learning, strengthening its presence on national platforms.

Audiophile

(The Music Society)

Audiophile, the Music Society, has consistently upheld its reputation as a leading musical ensemble within the University of Delhi. The academic session began with in-house performances during Saraswati Vandana and Orientation Day (29th–30th August 2024), followed by auditions on 17th September 2024, where promising new talents were welcomed.

The society's band, *Lazy Bends*, had a remarkable year, emerging as one of the most victorious in the Battle of the Bands competitions across Delhi University. Their journey commenced with *Whiplash* at MSIT (31st January 2025), and included 1st positions at *Unmaad* (TRINITY, 22nd February), *Euphonious* (Bharti College, 1st March), *Fiesta* (IITM, 26th March), and *Mehak* (Aurobindo College, 28th March). They also secured 2nd positions at *Acoustica Originals* (St. Stephen's, 14th February), *Montage* (Jesus & Mary College, 20th February), *Quo Vadis* (IIFT, 22nd February), and *Spandan* (NDIM, 26th March), and 3rd at *Tarang* (LSR, 20th March) and *Valhalla* (GTB Hospital, 23rd March). Other notable participations included events at Maitreyi, Ramanujan, Maharaja Agrasen, Venky, DCAC, Dyal Singh, DUCC, IIT Delhi, and ANDC, earning widespread recognition.

In the solo category, Audiophile's vocalists and instrumentalists demonstrated exceptional skill. The season began with 1st and 3rd positions at *Divyotsav – Swaranjali* (23rd–24th October), followed by accolades at *Malhar* (Lady Hardinge, 10th November), *Symphony '25* (JDJMC, 7th February), *Cadenza* (St. Stephen's,

15th February), and *Bel Canto* and *Sur Sadhana* (Dyal Singh, 5th–6th March). A Special Mention was earned at *Solo Sutra* (SBSC, 8th March).

The Indian Choir and Acapella teams equally impressed, with standout performances at *Thomas 24* (IIT Roorkee, 3rd October) and *Oasis '24* (BITS Pilani, 24th–27th October), where both groups secured 3rd positions. Their excellence continued into the second semester at *Pich Sangeet* (DCAC, 4th March) and *Spectrum* (Dyal Singh, 6th March).

In instrumental solo categories, Audiophile secured 2nd positions at *Oasis 24 – Swaranjali* (BITS Pilani, 27th October) and *Anunaad* (Jesus & Mary College, 20th February), alongside commendable performances at events such as *Solo Sutra*, *Swaranjali*, and *Goonj*.

Through its dedication to excellence, Audiophile continues to foster musical talent, uphold cultural tradition, and elevate the college's standing across the wider university music community.

Natyamantra

(The Indian Classical and Folk Dance Society)

Founded in 2023, Natyamantra promotes the rich traditions of Indian classical and folk dance, including Bharatanatyam, Mohiniyattam, Kathak, Odissi, and semi-classical forms. A major highlight of the year was the successful organisation of *Lasyakeli* and *Taal Tarang* on 29th April 2024, which saw participation from over 150 students across Delhi University, celebrating cultural diversity through dance.

The society also participated in over ten inter-college competitions, securing several accolades, and engaged in more than 20 collaborations with various dance and cultural societies. These initiatives enriched members' learning experiences and fostered a spirit of artistic exchange and community.

Rotaract Club

The Rotaract Club's journey in 2024–25 was defined by dedicated service and impactful community initiatives. The year commenced with a Blood Donation and Thalassemia Check-Up Camp, resulting in 90 units collected and 120 screenings conducted. In collaboration with the Delhi Police and Hero MotoCorp, a Road Safety Awareness programme educated over 250 students on traffic rules, emergency response apps, and CPR techniques. A Plantation Drive in Sheikh Sarai led to the planting of 100 trees, furthering the club's commitment to a greener future.



Public health initiatives under Project Aarogya included a lung cancer webinar (120+ attendees), a session on testicular cancer (150+ attendees), and a wellness drive promoting yoga and balanced nutrition. Project Rehmat reached approximately 200 schoolchildren with awareness sessions on safe and unsafe touch, while Project Raahi supported mental health through webinars on stress management, mindfulness, and positive peace. Project Bhavishya helped over 100 students explore career paths through a focused MBA and career-building seminar. Project Innayat advanced animal welfare through dog collar drives, an awareness webinar, and a donation campaign for the Sanjay Gandhi Animal Welfare Centre.

Project Aahar and Project Zindagi delivered relief through the distribution of 100 food boxes near Hanuman Mandir and a menstrual hygiene awareness drive, including a Period Pain Simulator workshop and pad donation, benefitting over 150 individuals. Club Services initiatives—such as Skkribl Night, social outings, and a cricket match—fostered community spirit among members.

The year culminated in *Ulhaas*, the club's flagship Diwali celebration, which brought joy to friends, senior citizens at an old age home, and children at an orphanage. A special appearance by **Mickey Mouse** delighted the children, making the event an unforgettable celebration of warmth, shared happiness, and fellowship.



Enactus

Enactus Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (SBSC), part of the global Enactus network headquartered in the United States, works in alignment with the 17 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UNSDGs). With the guidance of faculty advisor Dr Pooja Talwar, the team leverages business acumen to foster social and environmental impact by creating self-sustaining models that empower underprivileged communities.

On 31st March 2024, *Campaign Nazaafat* was conducted in collaboration with CRY, India's largest NGO for child rights. The campaign reached over 60 children in Dwarka, New Delhi, promoting basic hygiene practices and distributing hygiene kits and refreshments.

At the *Enactus Nationals 2024*, held on 25th–26th July, *Project Vrajya* stood out by repurposing *Lantana camara*, an invasive plant species, into eco-friendly products. The initiative empowered members of the Bhoksa tribe and placed the team in the top 20 Enactus units nationwide. On 14th September 2024, *Campaign Vyanjan* involved a visit to Sanjay Gandhi Animal Care Hospital, where members nurtured, fed, and comforted over 1,000 abandoned and injured dogs as part of their outreach under *Project Vyanjan*.



Project Naayaab's tote bags were showcased at stalls on 23rd October 2024, and again on 4th and 22nd March 2025, at SBSC, SGGSCC, and LSR, generating over ₹25,000 in revenue to fund upcoming initiatives. On 15th February 2025, *Project Granth* facilitated the collection and distribution of over 100 used books to 60 students from the Uttam Foundation. The event also included a tote bag painting workshop to promote creativity among the children.

Furthering innovation, on 21st February 2025, the team conducted R&D on a new project involving reflective wear for stray cows, crafted using discarded chip packets and denim—enhancing road visibility while addressing plastic waste.

On 20th March 2025, the team achieved notable success in competitions held at JMC, Kalindi College, and CVS, highlighting Enactus SBSC's excellence in social entrepreneurship and intercollegiate engagement. Finally, on 27th March 2025, the society launched its original podcast, *Mic and Mission*, aimed at amplifying the voices of social entrepreneurs and celebrating impact-driven narratives.

Young Entrepreneurs Society

The **Young Entrepreneurs Society (YES)**, established in 2013, aims to bring together aspiring entrepreneurs from diverse academic and cultural backgrounds. Committed to fostering innovation, integrity, and business excellence, YES cultivates an entrepreneurial mindset by equipping students with the necessary skills to transform ideas into viable ventures.

During the academic session 2024–25, YES initiated and executed several impactful activities, contributing to its growing reputation within the college community. The year commenced with *Bizminds 2.0*, a college-wide business quiz competition held in October, followed by an *Induction Programme* in November that included a warm welcome for new members through engaging team-building activities. In December, the *Bplan Workshop* provided an insightful session on crafting business plans and pitch decks.

In February, YES hosted two informative workshops: one on the *Union Budget 2024–25* and the other on *Canva* for effective design and communication. The same month saw the successful organisation of *Corporate Clash*, an inter-society business debate competition that encouraged analytical thinking and strategic argumentation. Throughout the tenure, the society published *Forstarters*, a monthly newsletter that provided curated insights into entrepreneurship, current affairs, and market trends, thereby enriching the knowledge base of the student body.



Girl Up Adira

Girl Up is a leadership development organisation under the United Nations Foundation that engages, trains, and mobilises girls across the globe to take action in support of gender equality. As part of this global movement, *Girl Up Adira* at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College strives to create a safer and more inclusive community for all genders through projects, fundraisers, awareness campaigns, and outreach initiatives. The name *Adira*, meaning empowerment, nobility, strength, and growth, reflects the core values and vision the society upholds.

On the occasion of Children's Day, Girl Up Adira collaborated with the NGO *Warriors Without Cause* to organise an outreach programme in a slum community in Vasant Kunj, New Delhi. The event aimed to bring joy, learning, and a festive spirit to children living in underserved areas. Activities included an interactive drawing session designed to encourage creativity and self-expression. The initiative exemplified a shared commitment to grassroots change and demonstrated how youth-led efforts, driven by empathy and action, can make a meaningful impact in marginalised communities.



On 27 February 2025, Girl Up Adira hosted an inspiring panel discussion titled “*Inspire Inclusion*”, celebrating the achievements of women redefining leadership, influence, and inclusivity in today's society. The panel featured three distinguished speakers. CA Kritika Bhatia, Chartered Accountant at Deloitte Asia Pacific and a proud alumna of the college, spoke about her professional journey in the finance industry. CA Sanskriti Pandey, a gold medallist from SRCC and prominent LinkedIn creator with over 71,000 followers, discussed the power of content creation in shaping narratives and inspiring social change. Anusha Attree, Founder of Warriors Without Cause and a REX Karmveer Chakra Youth Fellow, offered a powerful grassroots perspective. As the founder and former president of Girl Up Adira, her participation added a meaningful dimension to the event. The session stimulated insightful discussion, engaged students through thought-provoking questions, and reinforced the society's mission to foster inclusive environments both on and beyond campus.



Queer-Feminist Collective (QFC)

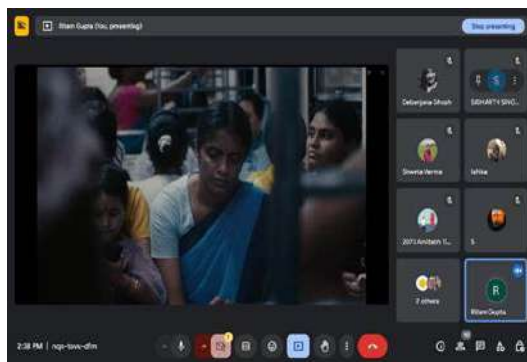
The Queer-Feminist Collective (QFC) continued its mission in the academic year to provide a safe and inclusive space for dialogue on gender, identity, and intersectional feminism. The Collective began its activities with an Orientation session on 24 September 2024, introducing first-year students to the ethos, objectives, and initiatives of QFC. The event was well-attended by over 25 individuals, including faculty members, and concluded with a registration link for those interested in officially joining the Collective.



On 15 November 2024, QFC organised an online screening of a video essay by Abigail Thorn focusing on social constructs. The essay examined concepts such as identity, gender, and race through a metaphysical lens, drawing heavily on Judith Butler's theories. The session prompted rich discussion around the fluidity of these constructs, their influence on politics and justice, and the scope for societal transformation through critical reflection and awareness.



In a continuation of its thought-provoking programming, QFC hosted a screening of the film *All We Imagine as Light* on 1 February 2025. This was followed by a vibrant group discussion that delved into the film's portrayal of unity, hope, and the light carried by individuals. Participants engaged in thoughtful conversations on the film's narrative, cinematic techniques, and broader social impact, reinforcing the Collective's commitment to fostering critical thinking and inclusive discourse.



On 28 February 2025, QFC collaborated with the B.A. Programme Association to conduct an Art Therapy Workshop facilitated by Mr Piyush Jain, Founder of Art Adventures Studio, and his team. Approximately 25 students from various disciplines participated in the 2.5-hour phone-free session. The workshop offered participants a unique opportunity to explore expressive art therapy, enabling them to connect with their emotions and inner selves through creativity and visual expression.

DELTA

(The Articulation Society)

Delta, the Articulation Society, champions effective communication and personal development, celebrating expression as a tool to shape thought, inspire action, and foster meaningful connection.

Throughout the year, Delta conducted engaging group discussions, vocabulary-building exercises, and idea exchange forums to enhance members' articulation skills and broaden their perspectives. The society's core initiatives included *Article for Change*—a series of socially relevant articles; *Talk-A-Thon*—lively thematic group discussions; *Abhivyakti*—a podcast spotlighting experts and changemakers; and *Tongue Fu Hustle*—a public speaking event paired with movie screenings to refine oratory.

Delta's outreach extended beyond campus through collaborations with organisations such as the Vishalakshi Foundation, contributing to food drives and literacy efforts. Its bi-annual magazine, *Expresso*, celebrated student creativity and critical thought, while workshops on précis writing reinforced the society's commitment to clear and concise communication.

VIRASAT'24, Delta's annual flagship event, celebrated the heritage of expression. Drawing over 1,000 participants from across Delhi University, the event commenced with a ceremonial lamp-lighting and keynote addresses. A highlight was *Parivartan*, a powerful session featuring decorated veterans such as Capt. Sunaina Singh, Commodore V. S. Rawat, and Capt. Chetan Cheetah. Competitions like *Roundtable Rumble*, *Film Fiesta*, and *Spell Bound* energised the audience, culminating in a closing address and felicitation ceremony.

Abhivyakti, Delta's podcast series, featured insightful episodes including “*Beyond the Balance Sheet*” with CA Parag Gupta on soft skills for finance professionals, and “*Building a Strong Professional Network in College*” with Nandini Sharma.

With each initiative, Delta reaffirmed that strong communication is not just a skill but a transformative force - one that nurtures confidence, leadership, and meaningful change.

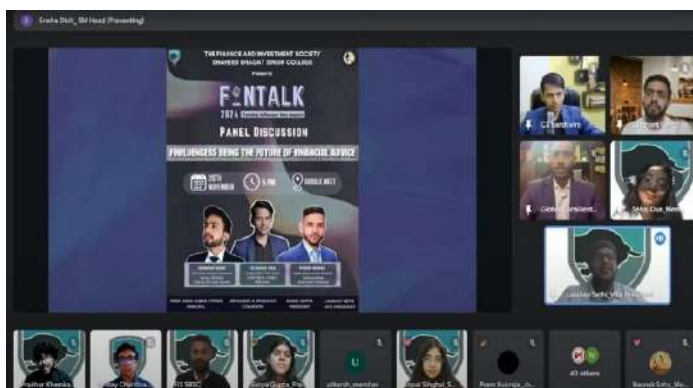
Finance and Investment Society

The Finance & Investment Society (FIS), established in 2013, stands as one of Delhi University's premier finance societies. A defining initiative of the society is Project Sikka—a real-time virtual stock market simulator that enables students to gain hands-on trading experience across equities, cryptocurrencies, and commodities.

The academic session 2024–25 began with a vibrant orientation held on 24th September, introducing freshers to the society's culture and highlighting past initiatives such as Sikka, Compassion Catalyst, and competitions under Cromulent like The Global Gambit and OTT Odyssey. The three-phase recruitment process included an initial Google Form with 370 responses, followed by group discussions on 5th and 6th October involving 220 participants, and personal interviews with 105 shortlisted students



on 8th and 9th October. The final selection inducted 53 new members during an off-campus event on 16th October, designed to foster camaraderie and teamwork.

Throughout the year, FIS organised several educational and skill-building sessions. A seminar on commodity markets in collaboration with NCDEX was conducted on 10th September, followed by workshops on stock market fundamentals, technical analysis, and fundamental analysis held on 20th October, 5th November, and 8th November respectively. To complement financial knowledge with creative skills, a Canva workshop led by designer Shubham Jain was held on 11th November, and a financial modelling session with Mr. Chirag Gupta took place on 17th November.

Project Sikka was one of the year's major highlights, enabling student teams to engage with over 1,800 real-time assets. The simulation concluded with a competitive finale, recognising the top-performing team for strategic excellence.

FIS further enhanced its outreach and educational impact through a monthly newsletter covering IPO trends, economic updates, and financial insights; a dedicated YouTube channel (@fissbsc3085) featuring recordings of all sessions; and the publication of the November 2024 Investment Report, offering detailed sectoral analysis, particularly on NIFTY and the automobile industry.

The session concluded with the society's flagship event, Fintalk'24, themed "Finfluencers: The Future of Financial Advice." The event featured renowned speakers including Mr. Piyush Kumar, CS Harsh Vira, and Mr. Siddhant Garg, who explored how financial influencers are reshaping the landscape of personal finance

and digital financial literacy. Through its diverse range of initiatives, FIS continued to uphold its mission of advancing financial literacy, practical skills, and student engagement.

Principal's Internship Scheme

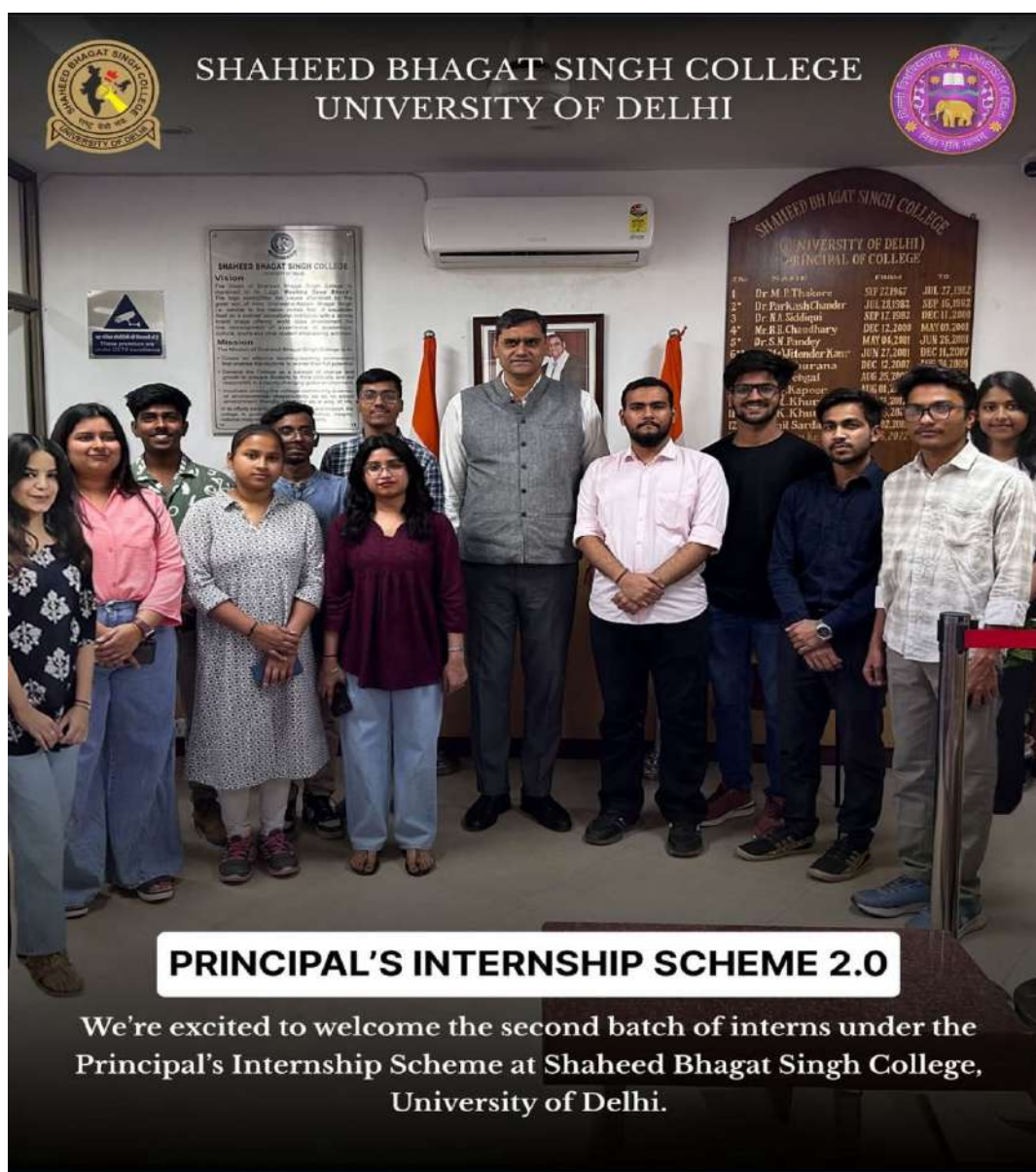
The **Principal's Internship Scheme 1.0 and 2.0** at the college, successfully completed two tenures, offering students invaluable hands-on experience in the college's administrative and operational framework. Designed to provide practical exposure without disrupting academic commitments, the scheme enables students to engage with various departments while effectively balancing their coursework. Under the able convenership of Dr Mahesh Kumar Chaudhary, the scheme has been implemented seamlessly, providing students with structured access to institutional functions.

In the current academic year, the internship programme received over 300 registrations from both the morning and evening colleges. Following a rigorous selection process, students were placed in key departments such as the **Administration Office, Library, and Knowledge Dissemination Centre**. Interns contributed to daily operations, records management, and academic support services, gaining firsthand insight into institutional administration. Many participants greatly benefited from this real-time exposure—some securing direct placements, while others were offered part-time roles within their respective fields.

The interviews for **Principal's Internship Scheme 2.0** were conducted on **24th and 25th March 2025**, ensuring the selection of only the most dedicated and capable candidates. In addition to administrative training, the scheme focuses on equipping students with essential life skills, preparing them for group discussions, interviews, and practical application of their academic knowledge.

The vision behind this initiative has always been to foster a holistic learning environment—one that integrates theoretical understanding with practical experience, enabling students to develop key workplace competencies such as teamwork, time management, and problem-solving. Over the years, the Principal's Internship Scheme has become a flagship initiative of SBSC, consistently attracting enthusiastic participation from both shifts. As the college continues to build upon this initiative, it remains committed to enriching its impact and ensuring that students are well-prepared to face future professional challenges with confidence.





Students Aid Fund and Fee Concession Committee

Shaheed Bhagat Singh College remains dedicated to providing quality education with equal opportunity and accessibility. To support financially constrained students, the college operates a Student Aid Fund and Fee Concession Committee, which reviews applications and grants concessions ranging from 10% to 100%, based on financial need, academic performance, attendance, and discipline. Students may apply online or offline at the start of the academic session. In 2024–25, two extensive interview sessions were conducted for students across all years, resulting in over 300 students receiving concessions, including full waivers for those in severe financial need.

The Placement & Internship Cell

The Placement and Internship Cell aims at developing solid corporate partnerships along with handling effective recruitment activities. Through continuous recruiter outreach, the cell secures quality career exposure and industry connections for students. Additionally, the cell strives to enhance students' skill sets by organizing insightful workshops and seminars on relevant topics.

Recruitment Season (2024-25)

During the ongoing recruitment season, the college witnessed a significant increase in the number of new recruiters, offering a diverse range of profiles to students. Over 160 offers have been extended thus far, with more than 40 companies recruiting across 60+ roles spanning sectors such as Consulting, Audit and Taxation, Finance, Sales and Marketing, Operations and Research, Education, Human Resources, and Start-ups. The highest package offered this season was ₹23 LPA by the D.E. Shaw Group. Renowned accounting firms such as Deloitte USI, KPMG India, PwC India, and EY GDS collectively hired over 80 students, offering positions across Audit, Consulting, and related domains. Additionally, longstanding recruiters like RSM, Zomato, and Intellipaat continued their association with the institution, while new firms such as Uniquis and Preferred Square, boutique consulting firms, were also welcomed into the recruitment roster.



Sessions and Webinars

The Placement and Internship Cell organised different workshops along with virtual lectures to support students preparing for their placements and internships. These sessions were focused on empowering students by sharpening their soft skills, employability skills and helping them to widen their horizon while considering future job and education opportunities. Some relevant topics on which seminars were conducted included the following: Career opportunities in Aviation Management, Scope for Actuarial Sciences in India; Opportunities to study abroad; Preparing for Master's programmes, how to crack GD-PI, etc.

Articleship Drive

The Placement Cell at the institute conducted an articleship drive at Grant Thornton to support Chartered Accountancy students, while additional drives are taking place at present. The opportunities support CA students in obtaining practical experience, which enables them to build their careers in accounting and finance.

Actuarial Science Opportunities

The Placement Cell worked with both WTW (Willis Towers Watson) and Accenture to provide students with opportunities to explore actuarial science careers because of rising student interest in the field. Through this initiative, students can discover employment possibilities in risk analysis and financial modeling and the insurance sector.

CV Vetting Drive

Before releasing student applications to recruiters, the Placement Cell performed a detailed CV assessment involving every applicant to guarantee accuracy. Standardized, verified information delivered to recruiters during this process resulted in enhanced credibility for both our students and their job profiles.

Internship Opportunities

The Internship wing of the Cell successfully conducted Winternovate – The Winter Internship Fair, in December, which witnessed participation from over 45 companies and 600+ students from various colleges registering for diverse internship opportunities. Further, on 26th March, 2025, the team organised Internovate – The Annual Summer Internship Fair, receiving over 1000 registrations from various colleges across different universities. With 50+ recruiters onboard, including the likes of Bajaj Capital, EaseMyTrip, Rekruters, The Leading Solutions, Insplore Consultants, Agile Capital Services, etc., the students explored diverse roles in consulting, content writing, human resources, business development, and marketing. With the zealous and concerted efforts of the team, more than 350 internship offers have been provided to the students during this academic session, with many more to follow.

Career Counselling and Guidance Cell

The Career Counselling and Guidance Cell (CCGC), plays a vital role in supporting students in navigating their career paths. Through the organisation of workshops, seminars, and interactive sessions, CCGC imparts valuable insights into a variety of industries, equipping students with the requisite skills and knowledge for professional success. The Cell also actively disseminates career-related content via its LinkedIn and Instagram pages, ensuring that students remain updated with the latest opportunities, industry trends, and expert advice. These platforms function as a centralised resource hub for event announcements and career guidance.

On 22nd August 2024, CCGC conducted a seminar focused on career guidance for the Company Secretary (CS) course. The session introduced students to the CS Executive and CS Professional stages under the Company Secretaries Act, 1980. Industry experts provided insights into corporate governance, examination strategies, and long-term career prospects. A significant student turnout reflected increasing interest in the field, with the interactive Q&A session offering clarity on potential career trajectories.



As part of its flagship initiative, *Lakshya 2024*, CCGC organised two impactful sessions on 4th October 2024. The first was a workshop on Geospatial Technology, led by Dr Ravindra Nath Tiwari, a domain expert with over 14 years of experience. 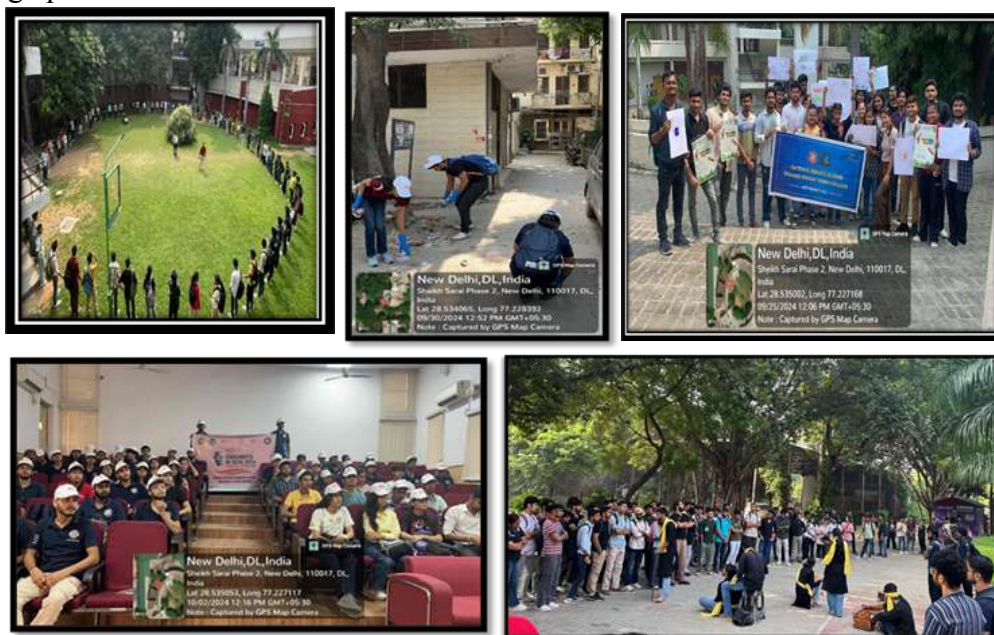


EVENT 2: Swachhata hi seva campaign 2024

Library - Knowledge & Learning Resource Centre

The college library continues to evolve as a vital academic resource, marked by consistent growth in its collections and services. During the academic year 2024–25, the library added 2,008 new titles across various disciplines, including Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, Geography, Political Science, History, English, and Hindi. In response to the academic and research needs of students and faculty, an additional 285 titles were incorporated into the Reference Section. This section now includes a diverse range of materials such as competitive examination guides, general knowledge books, yearbooks, government reports, and atlases.

The total number of accessioned volumes currently stands at 97,963. However, after accounting for systematic weeding of outdated or unserviceable materials carried out over the past 25 years, the current number of serviceable copies stands at 70,747. The library also subscribes to 74 periodicals, comprising 39 academic journals and 35 magazines of general and scholarly interest. Moreover, students and faculty benefit from access to over five lakh e-journals and e-books through the Delhi University Library System (DULS) and INFLIBNET consortia.

A significant development this year was the migration of the library's database to the cloud-based **KOHA Library Management Software**. KOHA is a globally recognised open-source system that offers enhanced functionality and a user-friendly interface. It enables features such as e-mail alert services, online book reservations, and a web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) for efficient book searches. Users receive automated notifications for check-outs, returns, and overdue items. The system also allows users to submit online suggestions for book acquisitions, thereby fostering a participative approach to collection development.

In an effort to support extended academic engagement, the operational hours of the Reading Hall have been increased. The facility is now open until 10:00 p.m., extending beyond the usual 4:30 p.m. closure. This initiative has been met with an enthusiastic response, with more than 150 students making use of the extended hours and library resources on a daily basis.

The consistent enhancement of library services underscores the institution's commitment to academic excellence, accessibility, and student-centric learning.

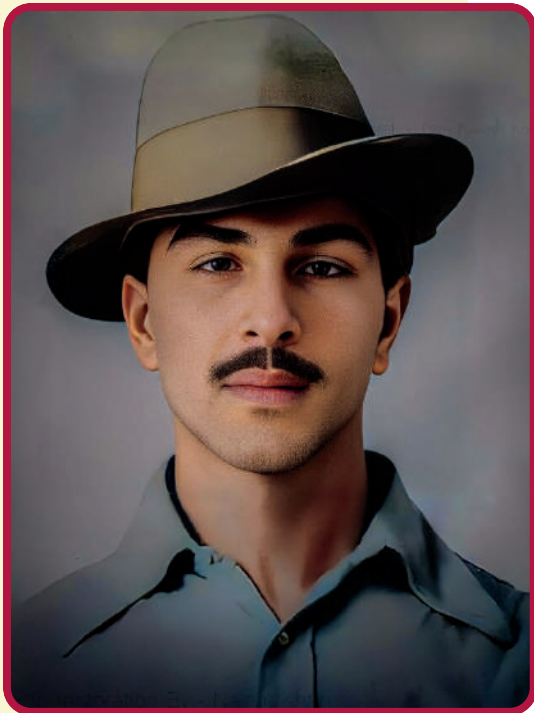

शहीद भगत सिंह

जन्म 28 सितम्बर 1907 : शहादत 23 मार्च 1931

"शहीद होने की घड़ी में वह अकेला था, ईश्वर की तरह"

भगत सिंह सिर्फ क्रांतिकारी नहीं, बल्कि एक सुलझे हुए विचारक भी थे। अपनी फाँसी से पहले उन्होंने जेल में विद्यार्थियों के नाम पत्र में संदेश दिया था कि 'इस समय हम नौजवानों से यह नहीं कह रहे हैं कि वे बम और पिस्तौल उठाएँ। आज विद्यार्थियों के सामने इससे भी अधिक महत्वपूर्ण काम है।' उनका यह इशारा देश में फैली अज्ञानता और गरीबी को दूर करके भारत को एक ताकतवर राष्ट्र बनाने की ओर था इसीलिए उन्होंने कहा कि 'वे (विद्यार्थी) पढ़ें और जरूर पढ़ें हम सब जानते हैं कि 8 अप्रैल 1929 को दिल्ली की केंद्रीय एसेम्बली में बिना किसी को घायल किए उन्होंने बम फेंका और जान बूझकर खुद को गिरफ्तार करवा दिया।

23 मार्च 1931 को जब उनको फाँसी दी गयी तब उनकी उम्र सिर्फ 23 साल 6 महीने की थी। अपनी वीरता और साहस के लिए, भगत सिंह आज भी युवाओं के बीच आदर्श तो हैं ही पर साथ ही साथ वे विद्यार्थियों के आदर्श इसलिए, भी हैं कि छोटी सी उम्र में उन्होंने देश और दुनिया के बहुत सारे महत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ, विचार, साहित्य, इतिहास और दर्शन पढ़ डाले थे। किताबें उन्हें पिस्तौल से ज्यादा प्यारी थीं, इसलिए वे आज़ादी को "मानसिक गुलामी" से आज़ादी भी मानते थे जिसका रास्ता किताबों से होकर ही जाता है। उन्होंने लिखा कि "क्रांति बम और पिस्तौल का सम्प्रदाय नहीं। क्रांति का अर्थ है आमूल परिवर्तन।"

शहीद भगत सिंह की शहादत के इस 98व वर्ष में, देश के युवाओं के सम्मुख भारत-निर्माण की अनेक चुनौतियाँ विद्यमान हैं। हमें पूर्ण विश्वास है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज से स्नातक होकर निकलने वाले छात्र-छात्राएँ शहीद-ए-आज़म भगत सिंह के स्वप्नों से स्वयं को जोड़ते हुए, राष्ट्रहित में सक्रिय भूमिका निभाएँगे।
