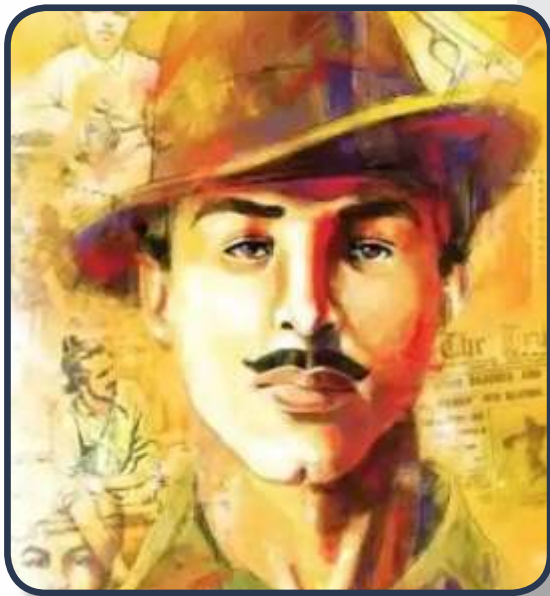

“शहीद होने की घड़ी में वह अकेला था, ईश्वर की तरह”

क्रांति - पाश

भगत सिंह सिर्फ क्रांतिकारी नहीं, बल्कि एक सुलझे हुए विचारक भी थे। अपनी फाँसी से पहले उन्होंने जेल में विद्यार्थियों के नाम पत्र में संदेश दिया था कि 'इस समय हम नौजवानों से यह नहीं कह रहे हैं कि वे बम और पिस्तौल उठावें। आज विद्यार्थियों के सामने इससे भी अधिक महत्वपूर्ण काम है।' उनका यह इशारा देश में फैली अज्ञानता और गरीबी को दूर करके भारत को एक ताकतवर राष्ट्र बनाने की ओर था इसीलिए उन्होंने कहा कि 'वे (विद्यार्थी) पढ़ें और जरूर पढ़ें' हम सब जानते हैं कि ८ अप्रैल १९२९ को दिल्ली की केंद्रीय एसेम्बली में बिना किसी को घायल किए उन्होंने बम फेंका और जान बूझकर खुद को गिरफ्तार करवा दिया।

२३ मार्च १९३१ को जब उनको फाँसी दी गयी तब उनकी उम्र सिर्फ २३ साल ६ महीने की थी। अपनी वीरता और साहस के लिए, भगत सिंह आज भी युवाओं के बीच आदर्श तो हैं ही पर साथ ही साथ वे विद्यार्थियों के आदर्श इसलिए, भी हैं कि छोटी सी उम्र में उन्होंने देश और दुनिया के बहुत सारे महत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ, विचार, साहित्य, इतिहास और दर्शन पढ़ डाले थे। किताबें उन्हें पिस्तौल से ज्यादा प्यारी थीं, इसलिए वे आज़ादी को “मानसिक गुलामी” से आज़ादी भी मानते थे जिसका रास्ता किताबों से होकर ही जाता है। उन्होंने लिखा कि “क्रांति बम और पिस्तौल का सम्प्रदाय नहीं। क्रांति का अर्थ है आमूल परिवर्तन।”

भगत सिंह की शहादत के इस ९३वें वर्ष में विद्यार्थियों के आगे भारत-निर्माता की कई सारी चुनौतियाँ हैं। हमें पूरा विश्वास है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज में प्रवेश पाने वाला हर विद्यार्थी भगत सिंह के उस सपने से खुद को जोड़ेगा। हमें यह जानकारी देते हुए अपार हर्ष है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज अपने स्थापना वर्ष १९६७ से ही विद्यार्थियों के जीवन को राष्ट्र-प्रेम और राष्ट्र-निर्माण की दिशा में अग्रसर कर शहीद-ए-आज़म भगत सिंह के संकल्पों को ही पूरा कर रहा है।

- Inculcate among the college community a sense of environmental responsibility to adopt environmental friendly practices as a way of life.

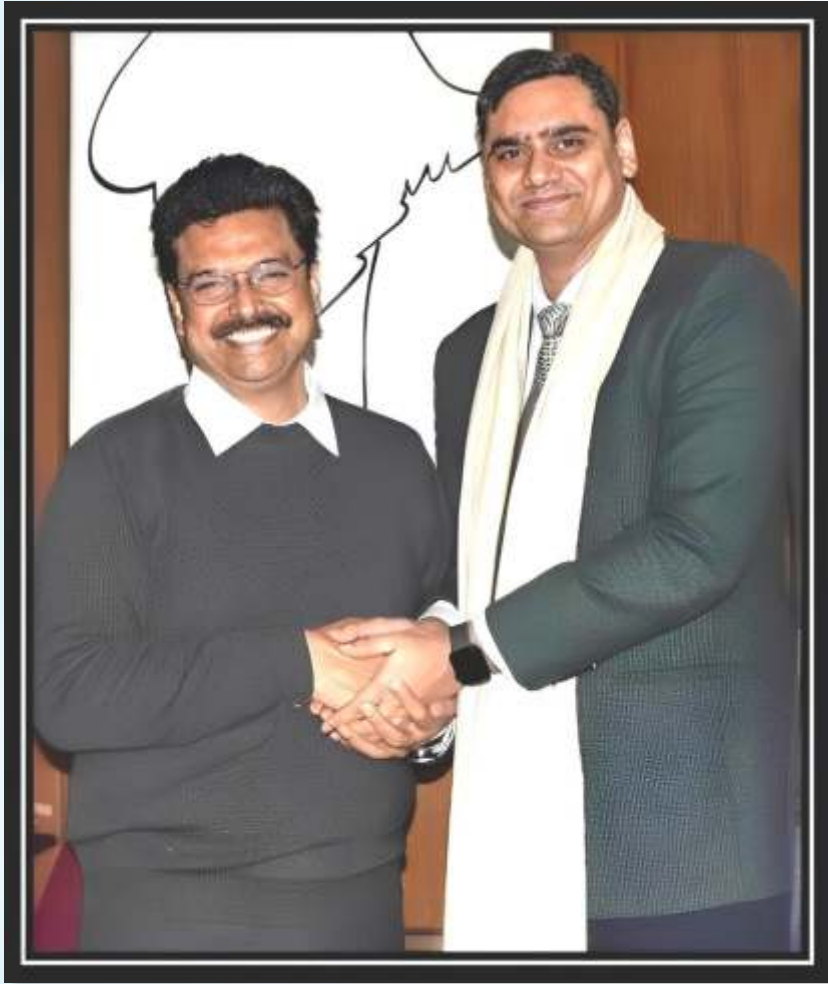

About the College

Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, named after the great son of India, Shaheed-e-Azam, Sardar Bhagat Singh, was established as a coeducational college in 1967 and functions as a constituent college of University of Delhi. It acquired postgraduate status in record minimum time of 09 years. The College takes pride in having an accomplished faculty. The college is NAAC Accredited 'A' Grade college with fully computerized library, seminar room, computer labs, Geography lab and impressive infrastructure including big sports ground with cricket pitch, volley-ball court, basket-ball court and a lawn tennis court.



The college functions through various Committees of faculty members. Students are also encouraged to volunteer for some committees under the guidance of competent faculty members. Ample opportunity is provided for talent to grow in cultural and their co-curricular activities. Over the years, in order to promote independence of thought and vision, the college has distinguished itself in diverse academic and professional fields by providing a vibrant and intellectually stimulating academic culture.

LIBRARY: Knowledge And Learning Resource Centre

Library has been functioning as an integral part of the college since its inception. Library's pleasing ambience and modern infrastructure provides congenial environment for study and research. The college library has undergone a transformational journey from a complete manual system into a fully automated Knowledge and Learning Resource Centre in 2010. Since 2010, the library of the college is equipped extensively with modern information and communication technologies and CCTV based security system



INFRASTRUCTURE

It is spread across 3 floors with total seating capacity of around 200+ seats, with reading halls on first and second floors of the library along with the stack area. The first floor of the library is newly renovated and is being supported by modern infrastructure and extensive signage. Special emphasis has also been placed on provision of comfortable furniture, adorning the space with portraits/pictures of notable personalities and proper illumination of the library to give it a completely organized and high-tech look. The second floor of the library has a classical and contemporary touch. CCTV based Security System is in place along with basic facilities like RO water, etc. In order to make online resources accessible, to both students and faculty, exclusive e- resource centres are an important part of the library infrastructure. The students' e-resource centre is equipped with 22 laptops and a computer system to access internet, Wi-Fi connectivity along with Projector and Screen for screening of movies and documentaries. The library also has a fully air-conditioned, exclusive and separate e resource centre for faculty members. The library has an Online Catalogue of its entire collection. Library is also equipped with Xerox facility.

RESOURCES AND SERVICES

Library has a rich collection of resources, both in print and online, and has emerged as a launch pad for teaching, learning and research. The library has a total collection of about 91,500 (Ninety One Thousand Five Hundred) volumes on all the subjects being taught by the college, ranging from Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, History, Geography, Political Science, and Languages, etc. It also has a sizeable number of rare, ancient and not-to-be-issued text.



SOME HALLMARK SECTIONS OF LIBRARY: Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research: It is a tribute to the heroes of our freedom struggle. It has exclusive material on freedom fighters, especially Bhagat Singh. The Centre was formally inaugurated during the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the college. Light Reading Section: This section has been set up keeping in mind the imperative need to expand our learning beyond the Curriculum in order to inculcate and cater to varied reading habits of students. This section has titles ranging from fiction, biographies, autobiographies, drama, cinema, travelogue, etc.



VOLUNTARY BOOK BANK: As part of the larger mission of the college, library has also created Voluntary book bank for needy students.

PERIODICAL SECTION: Apart from books, Library has an exclusive Periodicals section. In total there are 70 periodicals being subscribed by library. Apart from periodicals in 8 Subjects taught by the college, library also subscribes to good number of periodicals of general nature and 20 Daily Newspapers. Apart from these varied print resources, being a member of Delhi University Library System (DULS), library provides access to various electronic resources through its exclusive e-resource centres. Online support services such as Article search is provided to the faculty and students of the College. Plagiarism checking facility is provided to the faculty members on demand. Remote access service to electronic resources of university of Delhi is provided to all the users of the library. Students are provided membership of N-List to access electronic information resources. Question papers and

Syllabus in hard and soft copies are provided on demand to all the users. Alumni Students of the college are also provided support in case of requirement of Syllabus for Transcripts. The footprints of library services rendered by its hard-working staff are spread all over the college campus and have earned kudos, acclaim and recognition from its strong user community. Having its wings spread continuously, the SBSC library is truly a happening place.

COMPUTER LABS

The computerization committee and IT Cell of the college are committed to the best IT infrastructure in the college for the best teaching-learning-research activities. Here are the details of tasks completed and the vision for the forthcoming year.

1. Established 5 new computer labs for the students of the commerce and mathematics departments. A total of 60 All-in-one (AIO) computers with the latest specifications have been already installed in these labs, while ~90 more AIO computers shortly. In addition, these labs have been provided with up-to-date projectors and the necessary sound system.



2. This year, two remote sensing labs and one digital Cartography lab of the Department of Geography have been provided with more than 50 latest AIO computers.
3. Computer infrastructure of the admin and account office has been also updated wherever needed.

VISION FOR UPCOMING YEARS

1. Upgrade all the existing classrooms with IT infrastructure, including high-speed wifi connection and projector facility.
2. Setting up a dedicated computer lab/section for students with special abilities.
3. Implementation of Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) solution in the college to smoothly manage activities related to students and teachers (e.g., time table, classroom management, students' list/section), college administration, lab management, etc. infrastructure

Department of Commerce



The Department of Commerce is the largest department of the college imparting education in the field of Commerce. It is one of the finest departments which offers education not only in the popular undergraduate courses i.e., B.Com.(Hons.) and B. Com, but also runs the post-graduate course i.e., M. Com. Apart from this, it also offers Commerce subjects to B.A.(P) students in combination with Economics. The Department comprises highly qualified, vibrant and committed faculty members with specializations in diverse fields of commerce discipline.

Apart from classroom teaching, the Department envisions a holistic development of its students by giving them exposure to leadership and entrepreneurship under its various societies viz. Commerce Association, Marketing Society, 180DC Consulting, and Ardent.

The Commerce Association is a prominent society representing the Department for 14 years since its inception in 2009. The association organizes a myriad of events throughout the year, a few of which are Contrivance- A Case Study Competition, Uddayam - the Annual Commerce Fest, Adwitiya- Talent Hunt Show for specially-abled students, Business Colloquium- a series of workshops covering multiple aspects of the corporate world, numerous webinars, workshops and academic talks by eminent personalities to disseminate knowledge among the audience covering various aspects of commerce discipline. Uddayam-2023 received the participation of over 2200 students across universities. This year the association broke all previous records during Adwitiya by collaborating with more than 10 NGOs and receiving over 50 entries. The association also publishes "SBSC COMMUNIQUE", a monthly newsletter that provides insights into the world of business and caters to



the interests of our student readers, with a dedicated student corner.

With the goal of fostering a deep understanding and exposure in the Marketing realm, the Marketing Society has been formed. It has departed from conventional methods and is dedicated to honing essential skills among the students for real-world application. Throughout the year, Marksoc has notably published insightful articles on marketing topics, conducted engaging Mark-Talks, and published informative and engaging posts on LinkedIn for its growing network. Marksoc's website serves as a platform for showcasing all the contributions and captivating marketing phenomena. Additionally, the society has embarked on live projects in collaboration with Business Charcha, Unlock.fit, Wisefinserv and Technocratig Dgital.

180 Degrees Consulting is a leading student-run consultancy for non-profit and social enterprises. It envisages providing the most affordable and effective consulting services to Non-Profit Organizations and inspires positive change and growth by providing solutions to the challenges they face. In three years, 10+ Consulting projects have been done with organizations and a Net Promoters score of 100/100 has been maintained. Apart from Consulting Projects, 180DC also conducts mentorship sessions, by Working Professionals Consultants, for the team, which enables our student consultants to hone their skills. Multiple research reports on varied topics, curated by our consultants' team, discussions and Case/Guesstimate Battles conducted for the consultants with various Consulting Societies of Delhi University are some of the achievements. 180Degrees DC will also be launching its first-ever Case Book in the coming session.

Ardent, the Tech and Analytics Society run by the Department, is built on the motto of self-development and self-enhancement through various live projects and workshops based on our diverse set of verticals- Bourse and Finance, Content Creation and Artificial Intelligence (AI). The society provides practical exposure to the students with the help of multiple live projects based on our verticals which includes SEO, SEM, financial modeling and valuation, graphic designing, and content creation. AVISHKAAR, an annual flagship event of the society, with a footfall of 500+ students, enabled the participants to metamorphose themselves in a holistic manner for the practical world.

Promoting the research angle, the Department publishes a Peer Reviewed Refereed 'Journal of Business Studies' that provides the researchers with a major platform to publish their quality research work. The Department also organizes an International Conference every year which sees participation from across the globe.

Department of Economics



The Department of Economics of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (SBSC) offers undergraduate programmes in Economics – B.A.(Honours) Economics and B.A.(Prog.) with Economics as major and minor. B.A.(Hons.) Economics is one of the most prestigious courses of the college and the University of Delhi. It attracts the best students from all over the country. SBSC is one of the few colleges that offers B.A.(Prog.) with Economics & Commerce and Economics & Mathematics as subject combinations. The Department also offers Generic Electives (GE), which are the most popular GE in the college.

The department was set up in 1967 with the establishment of the college. At that time the number of students rarely exceeded 40 with no female students and only 3 faculty members in the department. Over the 56 glorious years, the Economics department of SBSC has not only grown in strength but also in reputation training the brightest of economics graduates who are well placed both at national and international platforms.

The strength of faculty members in the department has also increased to 19 committed and dynamic teachers with specializations in various branches of economics and a tremendous research base. Total number of students in the department has also increased to 200 at present. The department has been able to attract a number of students from different parts of India. Our students have outperformed not only in academics but also in sports and other extracurricular activities.

The department makes a constant effort to encourage students not only in academics but also in their





overall personality enhancement. A brief glimpse of that includes the Economic Society now called 'Ecospire' has been playing the vital role in developing and showcasing the talents of the students in the sphere of economics while cultivating their interest and applicative ability. The annual Economics Fest, named 'Econotise', gives an opportunity to all the aspiring economists at inter as well as intra college/university level to participate in various activities like panel discussions, paper presentation, MUN, extempore, economic quiz etc., to enhance their pioneering ideas through interactions and debate drawing an overwhelming response each year.

The department also organizes national seminars, lectures series, workshops & webinars by eminent speakers and experts on contemporary economic issues. Along with it department also organizes industrial visits, plantation drives and recreational tours which would help in overall personality building and raising

environment sensitization.

The results of the department grew exponentially on a year on year basis. More than 50 % of our students have scored first division marks in their bachelor's degree. Many alumni of the department have opted for higher education from prestigious institutions like Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, Jawaharlal Nehru University, IIMs, ISB and IIFT in India. Many of the students have joined international universities like London School of Economics, University of Scotland and University of Chicago for their masters and research. Our students are well placed in various think tanks in both government and corporate organizations.

The vision of the department this year is driven by a deep determination to uphold our commitment to disseminate knowledge and facilitate meaningful discussions in economics. In the light of the same the department this year proposes to initiate its own Research Journal, a separate 'Arthnaya': Economics Magazine cell, Economics Lecture Series and a dedicated economics Research cell. 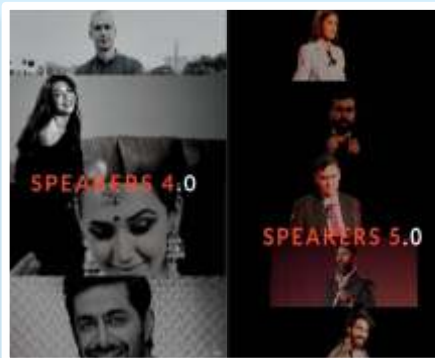
Entrepreneurship Cell

PM YUVA YOJANA

FOCUSING specifically on self-employment and entrepreneurship, our college was selected under the scheme, PM Yuva Yojana, which aims to provide proper training to the youth in this regard. In January 2018, the E-CELL was established to train the students on the practical aspects associated with entrepreneurship. An academic training for the same was organized last year between August-October 2018. More than 50 students enrolled for the course and benefitted from extensive lectures imparted in that duration. The centre has British Home Political records, memoirs of freedom fighters, manuscripts of interviews with the comrades of Bhagat Singh etc. An array of photographs, calendar art, and proscribed paintings and literature enables students to engage with the legacy of Bhagat Singh. The Centre hosts scholars and academics to have discussions around the themes on the lives, ideas and works of revolutionaries. The centre has organized lectures by eminent historians and academics like Professor Syed Irfan Habib, Dr. Chris Moffet and Dr. Aparna Vaidik.

The Centre intends to encourage research by providing mentorship and source material to the students who can further take up research in the light of the ideas of these revolutionaries and their pertinence in post-colonial India.



INTERNATIONAL COORDINATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME (ICDP)

Enactus SBSC was established in October 2014 with a team of only 8 members. The team aimed at teaching both the communities about the basic knowledge required for the setting up of a proper organized business. This was just the beginning. Thereafter the



team took up 5 more projects namely Project Roshni, which aimed to train the visually impaired the art of candle making, Project Aahar, which helps in providing employment opportunities to seasonally employed migrant workers from the neighboring states of Delhi, and Project Vidyut, which works towards the unique cause and ingenious idea of sustainable energy and the importance of use of alternative sources of energy in the future, Project Safar which is in its ideation stage for new verticals aims at better waste management while also improving the livelihood of local artisans and Project Pavitra which is an initiative undertaken to serve the underprivileged and raise awareness on adulteration, animal cruelty and environmental degradation.

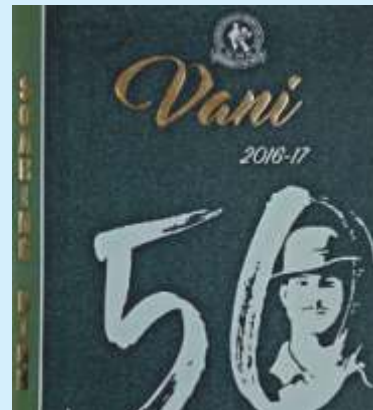

Blood shortage is a pressing issue in healthcare systems across the country. To address this problem and contribute to the welfare of society, our college initiated a partnership with AIIMS, a renowned medical institution known for its expertise in healthcare and blood donation drives. This collaboration aimed to leverage the collective strength of both institutions to make a meaningful impact on the availability of blood for patients in need. The key objectives of the Blood Donation Camp were to collect a substantial amount of blood units to address the scarcity of blood in hospitals and to educate participants about the importance and benefits of voluntary blood donation. Also, to create a sense of social responsibility among students and staff towards the cause of saving lives. Promotional activities were carried out through various channels, including posters, social media, and announcements during college events. Additionally, pre-registration facilities were made available to encourage a larger number of donors and to manage the donation process efficiently.

As a society, we must realize the necessity of being aware and making others aware of the buzzword menstrual hygiene. On 15th February we at NSS conducted a menstrual hygiene and pad distribution drive. The primary objective of this drive was to distribute menstrual hygiene pads to women and girls in underprivileged communities, thereby promoting their health, hygiene, and overall well-being. Also, to empower women and girls by providing them with the necessary resources to manage their menstruation with dignity and confidence. The planning phase was crucial in ensuring the successful execution of the NSS Pad Distribution Drive. Conducting a comprehensive needs assessment to identify the target communities that would benefit the most from the distribution



drive. Securing the necessary funding and resources to acquire menstrual hygiene pads in sufficient quantities. Collaborating with local NGOs, healthcare organizations, and educational institutions to support the distribution and provide additional educational resources on menstrual hygiene. Organized logistics for pad distribution, transportation, and recruiting and training volunteers to assist in the drive.

The departments work together with the efforts and dedication of NSS volunteers, working towards serving the community and addressing social issues, aiming to create a positive impact on society. The specific departments and their roles may vary depending on the institution and its particular approach to NSS activities. Blood Donation Camp in collaboration with AIIMS was a remarkable success, exceeding our expectations in terms of participation and impact. Through this initiative, we contributed to resolving the blood shortage and instilled a sense of responsibility and altruism among our college communities. The pad distribution drive exemplified the importance of community-driven initiatives to address essential needs and create lasting change. Despite challenges, the cells' success motivates future endeavours to continue supporting vulnerable communities in their pursuit of better health and well-being.

Benefits of Being a NSS Volunteer:

A NSS volunteer who takes part in the community service programme would either be a college-level or a senior secondary-level student. Being an active member, these student volunteers would have the exposure and experience to be the following:

- an accomplished social leader
- an efficient administrator
- a person who understands human nature

Major Activities

1. **National Integration Camp (NIC):** The National Integration Camp (NIC) is organized every year and the duration of each camp is of 7 days with day-night boarding & lodging. These camps are held in different parts of the country. Each camp involves 200 NSS volunteers to undertake the scheduled activities.
2. **Adventure Program:** The camps are held every year which are attended by approximately 1500 NSS volunteers with at least 50% of the volunteers being girl students. These camps are conducted in Himalayan Region in the North and Arunachal Pradesh in North East region. The adventure activities undertaken in these camps includes trekking of mountains, water rafting, Para-sailing and basic skiing.
3. **NSS Republic Day Parade Camp:** The first Republic Day Camp of NSS Volunteers was held in 1988. The camp takes place in Delhi between 1st and 31st January every year with 200 NSS selected volunteers who are good in discipline, March-past and cultural activities. A Contingent of selected NSS volunteers participates in the Republic Day Parade at Rajpath, New Delhi on 26th of January every year in accordance with the guidelines and requisition of the Ministry of Defense. Objectives of NSS Republic Day Parade Camp
 - Enable the volunteers to interact with fellow members hailing from various parts of India.
 - Experience the tradition, custom, culture, language of all states of India.
 - Provide a chance to develop overall personality of the student volunteers.
 - Constitute the bond of patriotism, national integration, brotherhood and communal harmony.

4. **National Youth Festival:** National Youth Festivals are organized every year from 12th to 16th January by the Government of India, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports in collaboration with the State Governments in different parts of the country. Eminent guests, speakers and youth icons are invited to address and interact with about 1500 participating NSS volunteers during the National Youth Festivals. Objectives of National Youth Festivals

- Make the volunteers aware of the various festivals celebrated in the country.
- Remind the volunteers of the cultural importance of festivals celebrated in our country.
- Provide a chance to the NSS volunteers to interact with the resource person/speaker/youth icons.

Varadharaj, Department of English is the co-convenor of the Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) of the College.



FINANCE AND INVESTMENT SOCIETY

The Finance and Investment society of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College (M) is one the most renowned societies in the University of Delhi committed to its vision of imparting financial literacy among students and helping them with their holistic growth and development. The society has managed to set higher standards and overdeliver each session coming up with newer initiatives helping students pan India with all things finance. This season, the society conducted various workshops, seminars and lectures under its flagship FinTalk series inviting speakers from diverse domains of the finance world ranging from financial literacy, equity valuation, green finance and wealth creation. The two events - Bar Trader and Invest-o-tank tested the financial acumen, creativity, problem solving, competitor analysis, investment management and business knowledge of participants. The society also established a trading community to ignite collaborative learning along with publishing engaging articles, posts, infographics, daily market updates and a resource bank on our website and social media handles covering the nitty gritty of business and finance.

Lastly, the Finance and Investment society is ever confident and aims higher for the upcoming sessions and looks to impart constant knowledge and insinuate an inclusive learning experience for all.

QUEER FEMINIST COLLECTIVE (QFC)

Created informally in 2021 with the objective of recognizing the concerns of students belonging to gender and sexual minorities and encouraging a discourse around feminist concerns in the campus, the Queer-Feminist Collective was ratified by the institution in May, 2022. The collective has 3 visions to fulfill: to create safe space and a support group for queer students, to represent feminist concerns, and to encourage the discourse of allyship. In 2022-23, QFC conducted scholarly talks, webinars, documentary screenings, and open discussions. An interaction with Vqueeram Aditya Sahay was held to discuss Intersectionality and Queer Legal Reform in January. A seminar on the topic, 'Women's unpaid labor in contemporary India' was organized in February 2023 which saw relevant deliberations from Prof. Archana Prasad (Centre for Informal Sector and Labor Studies, JNU) and Shweta Raj (General Secretary, Delhi Asha Kamgaar Union). April observed the first annual fest of the QFC in which students from several colleges of DU, IIT Delhi, and Ambedkar University participated.



CENTRE FOR INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEMS (CIKS)

The Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems (CIKS) at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College in is a first in University of Delhi. It was inaugurated on January 16, 2023 during the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav and the Centenary celebrations of University of Delhi. The centre has been established in adherence to the goals of the Ministry of Education, Government of India, and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for the facilitation and dissemination of Bharatiya Gnana Parampara (Indian Traditional Knowledge Systems) based interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research and outreach activities. CENTRE FOR WRITING AND COMMUNICATION

The Centre for Writing and Communication (CWC), SBSC, established under the sagacious leadership of our honourable Principal, Prof. Arun Kumar Attree, is a one-of-a-kind space for DU. It intends to blaze a trail of best practices for HEIs by emerging as a one-stop hub for students who want to improve their English language proficiency, need guidance on independent research, creative writing or publication, or want to perform well during an interview, entrance exam, competition, or any such events that test a multitude of communication and interpersonal skills. This is in accordance with the NEP 2020, which is firm about providing a holistic, liberal arts education to all students and “developing a research mindset in the country” through all possible means (46). The Centre intends to develop communication, critical thinking, and research skills within the college community by working with a diverse section of students, teachers, and external experts and offering a multidisciplinary understanding of best practices in writing, communication, and research. The primary impetus for the establishment of the Centre was the aspiration to ensure parity among our students and give each of them an opportunity and a relaxed space to work on their communication and soft skills so that their creativity and critical thinking can flourish unhindered by lack of confidence or exposure to the English language. There are talents and potentials hidden in each individual. It is our duty to identify and showcase them to the world. Our college is providing ample opportunities for those teachers and students who are aiming to develop this college and the University to greater heights. In order to reach the above given mission and to cater the needs and requirements of students with disability, I would like to start an enabling unit in our college.

Objectives Of This Enabling Unit:

1. Providing required facilities and gadgets for students and teachers with disability to carry out their studies and research in a comfortable and conducive environment through enabling unit following the guidelines issued by article 39 of UNCRPD act 2016.
2. Creating reading center for the disabled students with the help of non-disabled students to fulfill the reading and writing needs of disabled/visually impaired students which will enable them to write their end semester exams without difficulty.
3. Conducting short-term/diploma and certificate courses for non-disabled students, scholars and teachers across universities to create sensitivity towards the understanding on disability related issues.
4. Conducting outreaching programs to build a sustainable social environment for the disabled students to mingle with their non-disabled counterparts.
5. Organizing sensitization sessions for the students and faculty members across Delhi University to create familiarity with the life style of the disabled individuals.

Vision: “Your present circumstances don’t determine where you can go; they merely determine where you start.” Even a journey of thousand miles begins with a single step. Through this small initiative, the students with impairment can reach towering heights by competing with the rest of the society guided and supported by the empathizing crowd not by the sympathizing narrow- minded population. Taking the guidance and motivation from the UNCRPD “nothing for us without us” along with the path shown by the 2016 RPD act (“the appropriate Government shall ensure that the PWD enjoy the right to equality, life with dignity, and respect for his or her own integrity equally with others), I would like to emphasize that a disabled person can understand the needs and requirements of the other fellow disabled students.

Mission: Center for inclusiveness which is already established in our college will deal with students’ motivation and inclusive participation of disabled students in all college and events across the university. This enabling unit will operate by focusing purely on fulfilling the intellectual requirements of the disabled students and creating awareness among the general public through academic courses and programs. All the above-mentioned goals will be reached through grant from UGC to purchase proper equipment’s such as 3 to 4 computers with screen reading and book reading software’s along with voice enabled scanning machines in a full-fledged enabling unit room with properly divided cabins. 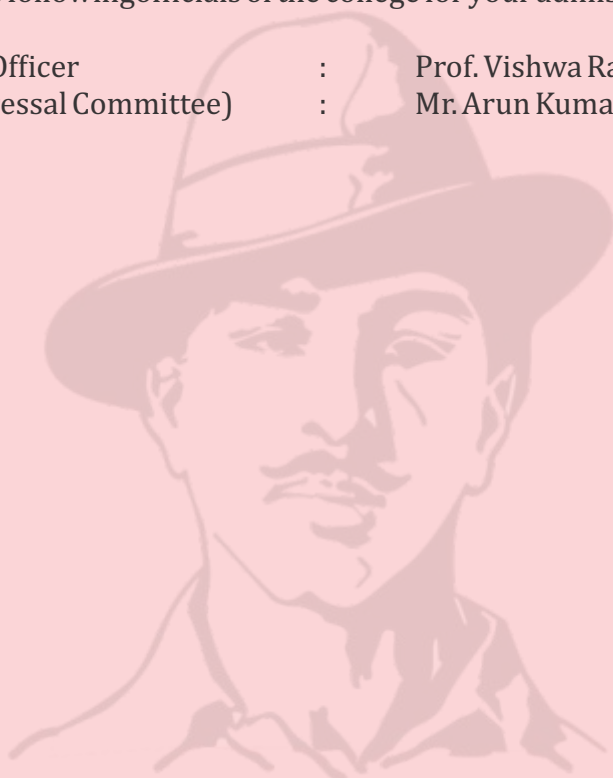

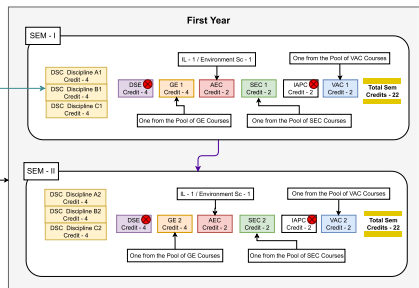


Structure of UG Multidisciplinary Program (with Three Core disciplines)

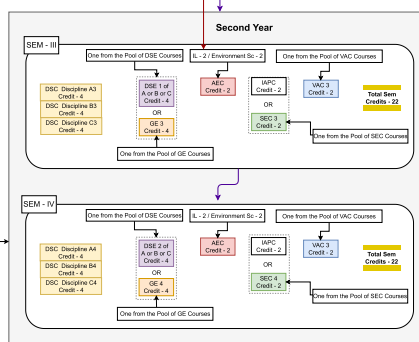

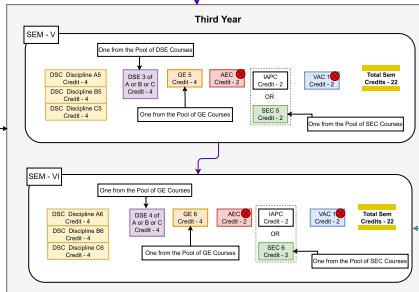

Research Methodology shall be offered as one of the DSE courses in the VI and VII semesters. Students can opt for it either in VI or VII semester. However, a student pursuing multidisciplinary studies in three core disciplines is advised to choose research methodology in VI semester, as DSE of the discipline he/she wishes to Major in.

Important note: Students studying DSEs of varied types/Discipline other than His/Her Core Discipline will be treated as GE for Him/Her.

In the fourth year (Sem VII and Sem VIII), students will study only one of the discipline i.e., either A or B or C in both of the semesters.

Honours Degree: To pursue an Honours degree in a field of multidisciplinary study, candidates will have to choose, in the fourth year, only one of the disciplines (either A or B or C). Candidates will have to study Two DSCs and Six DSEs in the chosen discipline in the VII and VIII semesters and write dissertation.

Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfillment of the following conditions.
Major -> 80 credits, Minor -> 28 credits

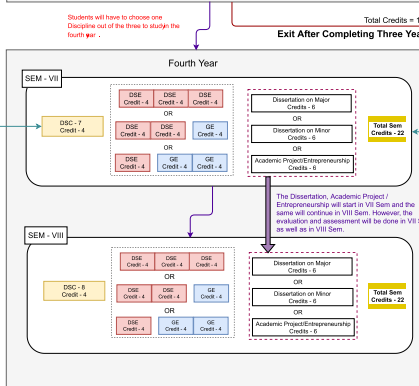
Example: B.Sc. Life Sciences programme with Botany, Zoology and Chemistry as core disciplines.

Case I: He/She shall get Major in Botany, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits in Botany from Eight DSCs and at least Nine DSEs of Botany and writes dissertation in Botany.

Advice: Students are advised to choose the discipline in which they wish to Major and must study at least Three DSEs of that discipline in the first three years. Like in this example, student must decide earlier and study three DSEs of Botany in the first three years as a maximum of six DSEs are available in fourth year. Similarly, if the student wants to minor in any of the remaining two disciplines, he/she should study DSE of that discipline in the first three years.

He/She shall get a Minor in Zoology, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from Six DSCs and one DSE of Zoology. Or He/She shall get a Minor in Chemistry, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from Six DSCs and One DSE of Chemistry.

Case II: If a student doesn't do dissertation in Botany, but in other disciplines, say Zoology/Chemistry, or does Academic Project or Entrepreneurship, then he/she will not be awarded Major in Botany; he/she will be unable to get 80 credits, in such cases, he/she will be awarded B.Sc. (Honours) Life Sciences.

RULES, DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance Requirement

No student will be eligible to appear in the Semester Examination, if he/she has not attended two-third of lectures, tutorials and practicals held during the academic semester as per rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. Exemption from this requirement will be as per the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi.

Internal Assessment

The staff council resolved that a student should secure minimum of 40 percent attendance in each paper to be eligible to appear in internal assessment of that paper in a semester. A student can get rebate of maximum 20 per cent of total attendance on part of the Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA).

Anti Ragging Rules

1. ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING (NOT EVEN FOR FUN) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the Delhi University system as well as public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under the Ordinance XV-B and C.
3. Ragging for the purpose of this, ordinarily means, any act, conduct or practice by which the dominant power or status of senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - A. Involve physical assault or threat or use of physical force
 - B. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students.
 - C. Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
 - D. Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
 - E. Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. In case any student, who has obtained the degree of University of Delhi, is found under this Ordinance, committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected under Ordinance Xv to appropriate action for the withdrawal of degree conferred by the university.
5. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging.

Ragging Related Complaints

Any student aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach Mr. Naman Jain, Convener of the Discipline Committee or any staff member of the college for speedy disciplinary action.

Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college.
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or Fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in college events.
- Withholding results.
- Handing over case to the police, if need be.

NOTE: It is mandatory as per the Honourable Supreme Court and UGC/AICTE Regulations that all students fill in an Anti-ragging Affidavit each year. To make the process easy MHRD has developed an ONLINE facility. Affidavits can be filled ONLINE at: www.amanmovement.org

www.antiragging.in The student is required to submit this affidavit in the college within 1 month of close of admission.

Code of Conduct

1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline and shall endeavour to promote the honour of the college and to inculcate healthy fellow feelings.
2. Student against whom disciplinary action has been taken will not be allowed to contest elections also.
3. Student shall refrain from:
 - i. Misbehavior towards members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students;
 - ii. Smoking, drinking, gambling and drug-taking in any form; Eveteasing;
 - iii. Obstructing passage in the verandah;
 - iv. Causing damage to college building, furniture, fixtures, garden, canteen crockery or to any other property;
 - v. Use of Mobile Phone in the class rooms;

vi. Associating with outsiders to create indiscipline in any form in the college. (No outsider will be allowed in the college without any expressed purpose and all visitors will have to make entry in the Visitor Register).

- a. Unauthorized entry in the college building on holidays;
- b. Loitering in corridors and making noise outside and inside the class rooms.

For any of the above offences students are liable to punishment which may amount to fine, suspension or even expulsion from the college

4. Students are expected to be regular in the classes.
5. Students must keep the college neat and clean.
6. Students must maintain perfect silence in the Library and obey standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
7. Students may participate in their favourite games or sports obeying standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
8. Students must always carry identity card with them.
9. Students must always see the College Notice Board, the Sports Notice Board and the Library Notice Board daily for obtaining up-to date information of college notices.
10. Students are expected not to bring any guests during the teaching hours in the college.
11. Suggestions from students are always welcome and will be given proper attention.

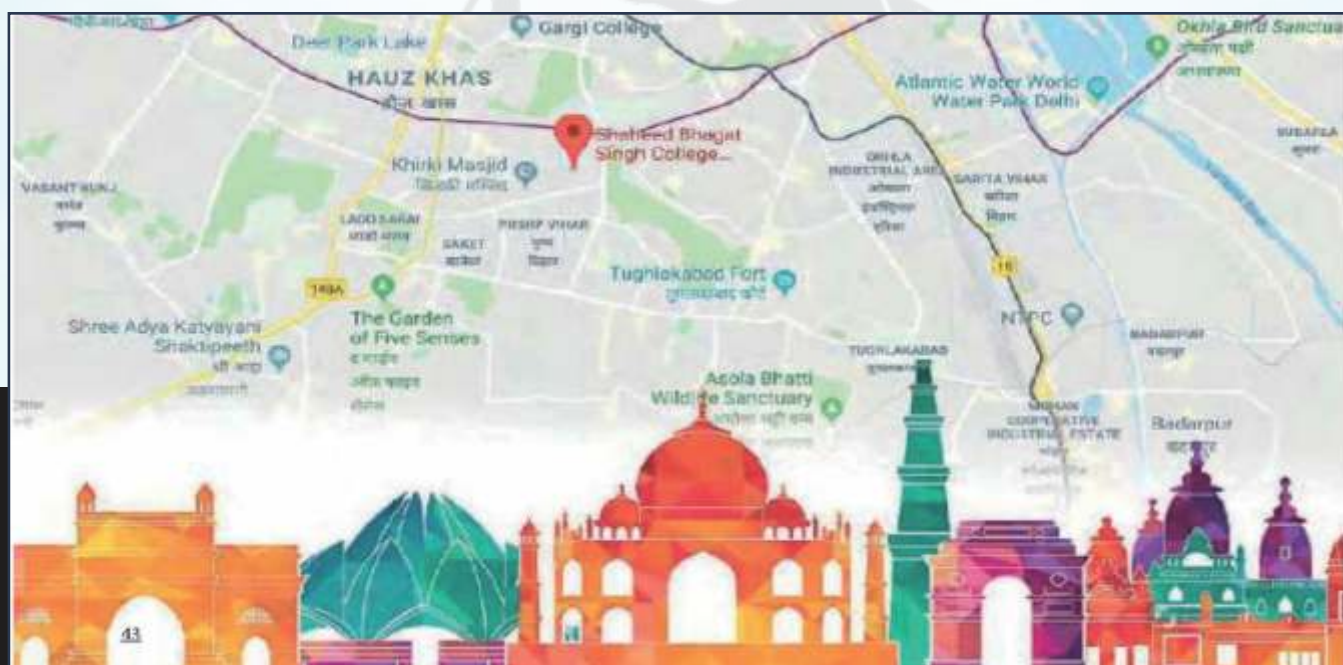
LOCATION: SHAHEED BHAGAT SINGH COLLEGE, NEW DELHI
