15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The College adopts Multidisciplinary / Interdisciplinary approach by offering generic elective courses where the students are encouraged to study the subjects of other disciplines apart from the core subjects of their discipline. With the introduction of NEP, the college adheres "Undergraduate Curriculum Framework 2022" implemented by the University of Delhi in order to bring the desired transformation in higher education. This Framework is formulated with a student centric approach and provides flexibility in terms of choice of disciplines of study, developing academic pathways having creative combinations of disciplines for study with multiple entry and exit points, determining semester-wise academic load and the ease to learn at his/her pace, to the extent possible. Increase in the number of choices of courses available to students will increase the need for more educators. The Framework also incorporates the spirit of NEP in terms of providing multidisciplinary and holistic education with the rooting in culture and ethos of the nation and emphasises on research, skill development and higher order thinking skills to promote innovation and employability.

The Centre for Skill Development organized events through its various cells and created a conducive environment for the student to develop their skills. Some of the events held in the college for the skill development is mentioned below - HULT PRIZE: The Hult Prize is the world 's largest international organization launching social impact startups. Their vision is to challenge young minds to ideate socially sound startups to solve a particular challenge given to them. The Hult Prize SBSC is a platform for SBSC students for participating in the Hult Prize Global Competition. We encourage young individuals to imbibe social entrepreneurship skills. We bridge the gap between ideating a challenge-based startup and

providing the platform to exhibit it to the world in a unique way. •

Humans of Purpose: In an endeavour to advance the freewheeler thinking and the layout of change producers, Hult Prize, SBSC hosted 'Humans of Purpose', a series of Instagram Live sessions that revolve around the world of entrepreneurship and beyond. The society invited Mr. Avelo Roy (Kolkata Ventures) who has been engaged in 500+ speaking sessions in US and India, Startup America, Invest India and more. He also has 1800+ start-up mentees across the world including India, US, China and Canada. The session received an audience of over 70+ students who eagerly participated and engaged with the speaker. Date: 17th September, 2022 (Online) •

ATARAXIA' 22: Hult Prize SBSC, in collaboration with the Supply Chain Management Cell successfully conducted Ataraxia'22 on 14th November, 2022. Ataraxia'22 was a competition focusing on bringing failed companies back to life, consisting of 3 Rounds. The first round was an Online Quiz round, where the top 15 teams qualified for the next round on the basis of speed and accuracy. The second round was the Auction round where the qualified teams had to bid on failed startups/companies and the top 5 teams with highest base points qualified for the final round. The final round was a presentation round where the shortlisted teams gave presentation on how to revive one of the companies they bought. The event received 17000+ impressions and closed about 200 Registrations. Date: 14th November, 2022 (Offline) •

ENCODE (The Internship Cell): Encode - The Internship Cell stands through its existence under the shadow guidance of the Centre for Skill Development of the college. Encode trusts every individual to pillar on a platform to understand one's potential and work towards the achievement of one's goals. We at Encode endure with an aim to provide the students with some substantial real-life opportunities by associating enriching internships which help them grab their share in the corporate world. We also assist the students's skill sets by organizing various workshops and seminars on relevant topics. •

Onboarding Corporates, Startups and NGOS for Providing Internships to Students: Encode as the name comments, we collaborate our cell around varied companies and corporates to serve layers of opportunities comprising domains at different levels of understanding and learning experiences. Some of the veteran companies our cell is associated with are Apollo 24/7, OYO, Travclan, Fundsroom, Ease My Trip etc. Our cell collated its way to an extent of renowned number of companies, where the number of companies goes around 66 in scale and 1.2k + registrations altogether, with a highest stipend of 20k and 75% of companies offering a decent number of incentives. •

Cracking Group Discussions Workshop with Mr. Daksh Sethi: With the increasing demand of college fresher students to clear Group Discussion rounds and Interviews. We conducted an informative workshop on the topic Cracking Group

Discussions by Mr Daksh Sethi - Founder at Guby Rogers. The highlights of the workshop covered body language assessment of a student, their dressing sense on the main day, efficient use of soft skills and tips like how to be mentally aware of facts and figures and use them into main effect. The workshop also included live conduction of group discussion where several students amongst the audience volunteered to be a part for the same. The event witnessed an overall footfall of 120+ students in October 2022. • WINTERNOVATE 2022: The Winter Internship fair was conducted in November 2022 wherein 800 + students registered for the fair. The fair was open for all colleges across India; for all courses and all year's students. This year we witnessed 33 recruiters coming onboard to offer internships to students in various domains like consulting, content writing, human resource, business development and marketing. Some of the recruiters included Arthan Consulting, Lenskart and Insurance Dekho. • The Entrepreneurship Cell: The Entrepreneurship Cell of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College was established under Centre for Skill Development with the aim to instill the spirit of entrepreneurship in young minds, the E-Cell SBSC has successfully created a remarkable presence in the DU Circuit • Talk2preneur: Series started by the E-CELL in the month of August 2022. In this series, we interview famous entrepreneurs and gain insights from their journeys and experiences. This series is receiving high viewership (20000+ views and insights) of episodes among the students at the university. Here is the list of guests interviewed till now - Mr. Ramani Iyer (Co-Founder Just Dial) - July 2022; Mr. Mikhil Innani (CoFounder Pharmeasy) - August 2022; Mr. Sachin Pubreja (CEO EazyDiner) - September 2022; Mr. Jash Shah (CEO Get-a-Whey) - October 2022; Mr. Varun Gupta (Co-Founder Boulton Audio) - November 2022 (OFFLINE) and Mr. Armaan Sood (Co-Founder Sleepy Owl Coffee) - December 2022 • Graphic designing workshop by Mr. Abhishek Anand: In September 2022, E-CELL organized a graphic designing workshop for the students. Mr. Abhishek Anand Pandey was invited as a trainer for this workshop. This 2-hour workshop included training in designing software like Adobe Illustrator and Photoshop. Our skill development session was house- full with more than 300+ registrations. Mr. Abhishek Anand Pandey is a renowned graphic designer who is associated with Adobe and is claimed to be the most followed creative designer in India. • India Start-Up Summit 2022-The Umrao: E-CELL under centre for skill development was the community partner for the India Start-up Summit 2022 which was held on 16th December 2022 at The Umrao, New Delhi. The event turned out to be a huge success and the members of E-cell got the opportunity to interact with budding entrepreneurs. It was a LIVE full one-day event for startups with: - 450+ min of extensive knowledge sharing, Learning from Experts, Networking opportunities with Investors &

Industry Leaders and Recognition for your achievements in your sector. • E-Novation 4.0 By E-Cell: E-Novation is the semi annual event which is organized by the entrepreneurship cell in the month of November every year. This year the cell conducted the 4th Edition of this semi-annual event on 21st and 22nd November 2022. E-Novation 4.0 was the triangle of three sub events namely -1) Talk2Preneur (Offline), 2) CinePreneur - Bollywood Based Entrepreneurship Competition and 3) BizzBate - Case Study Competition with a Debate. All events received a participation of more than 800+ students from all over the university with a total 75000+ impressions.

Talk2preneur: Mr. Varun Gupta (Founder of Boulton Audio) was the first guest to be interviewed live in the college premises. The Students of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College got the opportunity to interact with him and ask him about his journey of becoming a successful entrepreneur. CinePreneur: Competition was conducted to test the marketing and sales capabilities of the students. In this competition, students had to enact and sell anything they want through a drama. The competition was a huge success as many students pitched their products by performing and acting Bollywood gestures. Mr. Vaibhav Kanwar (Founder of Clapbox) and Ms. Ananya Narang were invited as the judges for this competition. BizzBate: Competition was a case study competition along with a debate. This competition received more than 350+ participation from the students all over the University of Delhi. Bizzbate consisted of three rounds namely Quiz Round, Presentation Round and Debate Round. Each round was an eliminating round. This competition tested the research and presentation abilities of the students. Mr. Ashutosh Pratihast (Angel Investor) and Mr. Saurabh Trivedi (Angel Investor) were invited as judges for this competition

18. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The teachers also teach in Hindi medium apart from English medium for the benefit of the students who wish to get instructions in the Hindi language. They encourage students to give the assignments even in the Hindi language. The Hindi Department also organizes its fest and also celebrates Hindi Diwas on 14th September every year. Department of Geography and Department of Hindi in association with Bhartiye Sikshita Mandal celebrated International Mother tongue Day. A webinar was organized on 16th February, 2023 on the theme 'Sahitya aur Cineme'. For the purpose of increasing knowledge about the vast field of art and culture amongst the students, Promethean - The Fine Arts Society visited The National Gallery of Modern Art in the month of July, 2022. The Placement Cell continued with its initiative to collaborate with digital learning platform Coursera to

provide free access of various online courses to all students. The initiative drew participation of more than 1000 students, who used these courses for upskilling themselves.

As a constituent institution of the University of Delhi, SBSC

1.1.2 - The institution adheres to the academic calendar including for the conduct of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE)

The College adheres closely to the University of Delhi's academic schedule when it comes to arranging the start and finish of sessions, midterm breaks, preparatory breaks, and dates for theoretical and practical exams. SBSC conducts CIE in accordance with the university's rigorous criteria. CIE has a weightage of 25% of the maximum marks in each topic, according CBCS rules. It consists of 20% based on performance in the internal evaluation and 5% based on attendance record. CIE as per NEP differ with different papers offered since the assessment process tests the learning outcomes, knowledge gained, attitudes developed and skills mastered by a student during an academic programme

Students are informed of this weightage as early as they join the college; it is particularly included in the prospectus and orientation programme. Internal evaluation guidelines are also posted on the website and often discussed in lectures by the teachers. Students can also view their IA marks that have been uploaded by their professors on the website of the college. In case

of grievance, the IA Committee has effectively handled the complaint.

SBSC follows the Delhi University rules and norms on Internal Assessment. During the online phase of teaching, internal assessment

was based on one test/assignment/project/presentation. However more than one assignment was usually taken per course and the highest marks received across various assignments were considered as the final internal assessment for that course. Faculty members designed a variety of assignments such as MCQs, student presentations, group projects and essays. Students were given adequate time to complete these assignments. The Internal Assessment Committee oversaw all matters related to student assessment. Teachers were encouraged to space their assignments through the course of the semester and complete grading of assignments in a timely manner. The evaluation criteria were objective and transparent. Students were provided feedback that explained the reasons for the grades received by the student. Teachers uploaded the marks for each student on the Internal Assessment portal provided by College. Students were informed about checking their marks on the portal. Discrepancies could be reported to the concerned teacher directly or to the department internal assessment in-charge. Students could also contact their class representatives and send a list of such grievances to the teacher. The teacher checked the reported grievance and corrected it on the portal.

SBSC follows the Delhi University rules and norms on Internal Assessment. During the online phase of teaching, internal assessment was based on one test/assignment/project/presentation. However more than one assignment was usually taken per course and the highest marks received across various assignments were considered as the final internal assessment for that course. Faculty members designed a variety of assignments such as MCQs, student presentations, group projects and essays. Students were given adequate time to complete these assignments. The Internal Assessment Committee oversaw all matters related to student assessment. Teachers were encouraged to space their assignments through the course of the semester and complete grading of assignments in a timely manner. The evaluation criteria were

objective and transparent. Students were provided feedback that explained the reasons for the grades received by the student. Teachers uploaded the marks for each student on the Internal Assessment portal provided by College. Students were informed about checking their marks on the portal. Discrepancies could be reported to the concerned teacher directly or to the department internal assessment in-charge. Students could also contact their class representatives and send a list of such grievances to the teacher. The teacher checked the reported grievance and corrected it on the portal.
