शहीद भगत सिंह

जहम २८ सितम्बर १९०७ : शहादत २३ मार्च १९३१ 'शहीद होने की घड़ी में वह अकेला था, ईश्वर की तरह" कवि –पाश

भगत सिंह सिर्फ़ क्रांतिकारी नहीं, बिल्क एक सुलझे हुए विचारक भी थे। अपनी फाँसी से पहले उन्होंने जेल में विद्यार्थियों के नाम पत्र में संदेश दिया था कि 'इस समय हम नौजवानों से यह नहीं कह रहे हैं कि वे बम और पिस्तौल उठायें। आज विद्यार्थियों के सामने इससे भी अधिक महत्वपर्णू काम है।' उनका यह इशारा देश में फैली अज्ञानता और गरीबी को दूर करके भारत को एक ताकत्वर राष्ट्र बनाने की ओर था इसीलिए उन्होंने कहा कि 'वे (विद्यार्थी) पढ़ें और जरूर पढ़ें' हम सब जानते हैं कि 8 अप्रैल 1929 को दिल्ली की केंद्रीय एसेम्बली में बिना किसी को घायल किए उन्होंने बम फेंका और जान बूझकर खुद को गिरफ़्तार करवा दिया।

23 मार्च 1931 को जब उनको फाँसी दी गयी तब उनकी उम्र सिर्फ 23 साल 6 महीने की थी। अपनी वीरता और साहस के लिए, भगत सिंह आज भी युवाओं के बीच आदर्श तो हैं ही पर साथ ही साथ वे विद्यार्थियों के आदर्श इसलिए, भी हैं कि छोटी सी उम्र मे उन्होंने देश और दुनिया के बहुत सारे महत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ, विचार, साहित्य, इतिहास और दर्शन पढ़ डाले थे। किताबें उन्हें पिस्तौल से ज्यादा प्यारी थीं, इसलिए वे आज़ादी को ''मानसिक गुलामी'' से आज़ादी भी मानते थे जिसका रास्ता किताबों से होकर ही जाता है। उन्होंनें लिखा कि ''क्रांति बम और पिस्तौल का सम्प्रदाय नहीं। क्रांति का अर्थ है आमूल परिवर्तन।''

भगत सिंह की शहादत के इस 92 वें वर्ष में विद्यार्थियों के आगे भारत—निर्माता की कई सारी चुनौतियाँ हैं। हमें पूरा विश्वास है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज में प्रवेश पाने वाला हर विद्यार्थी भगत सिंह के उस सपने से खुद को जोड़ेगा। हमें यह जानकारी देते हुए अपार हर्ष है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॅालेज अपने स्थापना वर्ष 1967 से ही विद्यार्थियों के जीवन को राष्ट्र—प्रेम और राष्ट्र—निर्माण की दिशा में अग्रसर कर शहीद—ए—आज़म भगत सिंह के संकल्पों को ही पूरा कर रहा है।



About the College

Shaheed-e-Aazam, Sardar Bhagat Singh, was established as a coeducational college in 1967 and functions as a constituent college of University of Delhi. It acquired postgraduate status in record minimum time of 09 years. The College takes pride in having an accomplished faculty. The college is NAAC Accredited 'A' Grade college with fully computerized library, seminar room, computer labs, Geography lab and impressive infrastructure including big sports ground with cricket pitch, volley-ball court, basket-ball court and a lawn tennis court.

The college functions through various committees of faculty members. Students are also encouraged to volunteer for some committees under the guidance of competent faculty members. Ample opportunity is provided for talent to grow in cultural and other co-curricular activities.



Over the years, in order to promote independence of thought and vision, the college has distinguished itself in diverse academic and professional fields by providing a vibrant and intellectually stimulating academic culture.

Infrastructure Facilities

Library: Knowledge and Learning Resource Centre

Library has been functioning as an integral part of the college since its inception. Library's pleasing ambience and modern infrastructure provides congenial environment for study and research. The college library has undergone a transformational journey from a complete manual system into a fully automated *Knowledge and Learning Resource Center* in 2010. Since 2010, the library of the college is equipped extensively with modern information and communication technologies and CCTV based security system.



Infrastructure

It is spread across 3 floors with total seating capacity of around 200+ seats, with reading halls on first and second floors of the library along with the stack area. The first floor of the library is newly renovated and is being supported by modern infrastructure and extensive signage. Special emphasis has also been placed on provision of comfortable furniture, adorning the space with portraits/pictures of notable personalities and proper illumination of the library to give it a completely organized and high-tech look. The second floor of the library has a classical and contemporary touch. CCTV based Security System is in place along with basic facilities like RO water, etc.

In order to make online resources accessible, to both students and faculty, exclusive e-resource centres are an important part of the library infrastructure. The students' e-resource centre is equipped with 22 systems, wi fi connectivity along with *Projector* and *Screen* for screening of movies and documentaries. The library also has a fully air-conditioned, exclusive and separate e-resource centre for faculty members. The library has an Online Catalogue of its entire collection. Library is also equipped with Xerox facility.

Resources and Services

Library has a rich collection of resources, both in print and online, and has emerged as a launch pad for teaching, learning and research. The library has a total collection of about 70,000 thousand volumes on all the subjects being taught by the college, ranging from *Commerce, Economics, Mathematics, History, Geography, Political Science, and Languages,* etc. It also has a sizeable number of rare, ancient and not-to-beissued text.



Some Hallmark Sections of Library:

- i. Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research: It is a tribute to the heroes of our freedom struggle. It has exclusive material on freedom fighters, especially Bhagat Singh. The Centre was formally inaugurated during the Golden Jubliee celebrations of the college.
- ii. Light Reading Section: This section has been set up keeping in mind the imperative need to expand our learning beyond the Curriculum in order to inculcate and cater to varied reading habits of students. This section has titles ranging from fiction, biographies, autobiographies, drama, cinema, travelogue, etc.
- iii. Voluntary Book Bank: As part of the larger mission of the college, library has also created Voluntary book bank for needy students.



- iv. Periodical Section: Apart from books, Library has an exclusive Periodicals section. In total there are 98 periodicals being subscribed by library. Apart from periodicals in 8 Subjects taught by the college, library also subscribes to good number of periodicals of general nature and 20 Daily Newspapers.
- v. Apart from these varied print resources, being a member of Delhi University Library System (DULS), library provides access to various electronic resources through its exclusive e-resource centers.

The footprints of library services rendered by its hard-working staff are spread all over the college campus and have earned kudos, acclaim and recognition from its strong user community. Having its wings spread continuously, the SBSC library is truly a happening place.

Computer Labs ///

Our college has three state-of-the-art computer labs with around 115 laptops for Commerce and Mathematics departments. The laptops are equipped with various software and applications like Microsoft Office, Tally, SAS, Mathematica, Octave, R, Maxima, Latex that are required by students as part of their courses. This helps students to visualize various complex concepts/formulas learned in the theory lecture classes.

The Geography Laboratory is used to teach GIS, Cartography and, Remote Sensing courses. The



present laboratory is in the process of being renovated with advanced facilities for a better teaching-learning process. Five new computer labs are going to be developed which will be equipped with present day technology.

Fourteen classrooms are equipped with projectors that help students to learn and grasp concepts quickly. College also provides laptops to needy students on request during the study period in college.

Seminar Room/Conference Room

The college has two Seminar Rooms and one Conference Room with modern facilities. The college organizes seminars, workshops, and academic talks with the active participation of students and faculty. Eminent scholars and experts from academic institutions and corporate sector are invited to interact with the students and deliver lectures.



Activity Room

The college has 3 activity rooms with basic facilities for extra-curricular activities such as dance, music, and theatre rehearsals. We believe that extracurricular activities are the best way of developing an individual's personality.



/// Medical Room ///

The college has a Medical Room wherein basic medical support is provided to the staff and students by a qualified nurse – Ms. Mini Samuel. Doctor is also available on call.

/// Sports Facilities ///

The college has facilities for both indoor and outdoor games such as: Cricket, Hockey, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Lawn Tennis, Table Tennis, Badminton, Kho-Kho, Athletics, Weightlifting, Gymnastics, Carom and, Chess. Department of Commerce



Department of Commerce is one of the best departments of commerce among colleges of the University of Delhi. It is also the largest department of the college specializing in multiple areas of discipline with a concrete and expanding body of research work. The Department envisions a holistic development of its students by giving them the exposure to leadership and entrepreneurship under various societies, viz. Commerce Association, Marketing Society and 180 Degree Consulting.

The Commerce Association is a prominent society of the college representing the Department of Commerce for 12 years since its inception in 2009. The Association organizes a myriad of events throughout the year, a few of which are Contrivance- A Case Study Competition, Uddayam - the Annual Commerce Fest, Adwitiya- Talent Hunt Show for specially-abled students, Business Colloquium- A series of workshops covering multiple aspects of the corporate world and numerous webinars, workshops and academic talks by eminent personalities to disseminate knowledge among the audience in the discipline of commerce. The Association has witnessed a consistent increase in the footfall of its events. Uddayam-2022 received participation of over 2000 students across universities. This year the Association broke all previous records during Adwitya by collaborating with more than 10 NGOs and receiving over 50 entries despite the online mode.

The Marketing society was formed with the vision to provide fervent knowledge and practical exposure in the domain of marketing. The society is known for ditching conventional methods and working towards

rigorous skill-building for the real world. It intends to give exposure to students where they can learn how to promote themselves and their work. This year the society published articles on topics like moment marketing and metaverse marketing; conducted Mark talks in which marketing directors of famous companies like Skoda and Indigo were invited; and initiated Telegram and Whatsapp communities to provide a platform to share interesting marketing phenomena, facts, and quizzes. They also engaged in a live project with Growdiesel - a government undertaking dedicated to the cause of environment, energy, and empowerment of fuel farmers. Marksoc's annual event ELIXIR 2.0, with a footfall of 1400+, was filled to the brim with a myriad of events that tested every ounce of marketing or marketing-esque knowledge one could ever gain! Encapsulated with events varying from outlining a marketing plan, to defeating your opponents through buying a company's successful strategies, and handling a real company's marketing crisis; Elixir 2.0 incorporated within it three fun-filled and spectacular events Marketing Mishaps, Ad-Mad, and pitch please which were held in a hybrid mode.

180 Degrees Consulting is the world's largest student-run consultancy for non-profits & social enterprises. The society in the past year provided strategy consulting services to 4 Social Enterprises with a cumulative Net Promoter Score of a perfect +100. It conducted 10+ training sessions with mentors from prestigious firms such as McKinsey, Bain, Deloitte, Accenture, KPMG, etc. covering consulting and further education as topics. The society provided global exposure to our consultants by sending them for global panel discussions and networking events.

Department of Geography



The Department of Geography, Shaheed Bhagat Singh College is one of the most vibrant departments of the college. The department has completed 53 glorious years since its establishment. It has emerged as an epitome of knowledge with a total of 15 faculty members. The departmental research activities focus on exploring contemporary issues, while offering a holistic perspective of knowledge to the students. The department has a Cartography Laboratory. The Remote Sensing and GIS Laboratories are in the developing phase, which will offer students a state-of-the-art hands-on training. The department is now a network institute of the Indian Institute of Remote Sensing (IIRS) outreach program of capacity building.

To inculcate all-round development and to facilitate skill enhancement and learning among the students, the department regularly organizes field visits, conferences, workshops, seminars and a career fair, where students receive first-hand experience and learn empirically from different spheres of life. The centre functions under the convenorship of Dr. Pooja Talwar and Dr. Noopur Agrawal as Coconvener and a team comprising of teachers from various departments of the college along with two advisors, Col. Prakash Tewari, Chairman, Tewari Groups Pvt. Ltd. and Prof. Vikas Dhawan, Pro-Vice-Chancellor SGT University

CSD comprises The Entrepreneurship Cell (E cell), Encode-The Internship Cell, TEDx SBSC, Addon Courses, Hult Prize SBSC and Supply Chain Management Cell (the latest addition to the centre) in order to ensure the holistic development of our students and making them future-ready.





Encode - The Internship Cell /

Encode – the Internship Cell, a part of the Centre for Skill Development, promises to give enough exposure to the college students to equip them with strategies to excel in the times to come. Encode intends to bridge the gap between the recruiters and prospective interns, thereby eliminating the need to have personal contacts to procure internships. Encode not only organizes Internship Fairs in the college but also takes a great initiative in organizing seminars and webinars to enrich the experience for our college students through different skill development workshops. The cell provided



internships to more than **700+ Students** through the various companies brought on-board throughout the year, with around **60% of them being paid opportunities**.

Entrepreneurship Cell

Supply Chain Management Cell /

The SCM cell is a smart and collective effort of the students of SBSC aimed at imparting knowledge and insights into the supply chain management industry through industry exposure and live projects. The cell was established to empower the students through practical knowledge and hands-on experience, enhancing their employability. In its first year of initialization, the cell organized various events in the form of case study competitions, One Day Events like Advermize, Supply Mania, and Whisper Challenge. It also organized an Industrial Visit for the students of the college. The cell came up with an initiative-'Free-Flow Sessions' to make out the goal of providing insights into the world of supply chain

management to students a reality. Under this initiative, they invited guest speakers with experience working in the supply chain, logistics and operations domains to speak on an interesting topic. The SCM cell organized its first annual festival called ANUKRAM.

Career Counselling and Guidance Cell

The Career Counselling and Guidance Cell is one of the most vibrant wing of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi. It aims to build a dynamic forum to cater to the needs pertaining to career guidance and counselling. Centre for Disaster Management Studies (CDMS)

Disasters like earthquakes, floods, droughts, storms, epidemics, and pandemics have been recurring phenomena of long human history. Many deadly disasters have completely wiped out many civilizations worldwide, with the intensity and unpredictability increasing over the years and persistently posing a threat to societies in the 21st century. Hazard is the natural trigger, whereas disasters are largely an anthropological construct with a close association with the science and policy of any region. With the increasing risk to communities,



particularly in vulnerable regions, disaster mitigation and human adaptation are indispensable to counter the risk effectively and constructively during emergencies.

The Centre for Disaster Management Studies (CDMS) aims to reduce the gap between science and policy of disaster management and debate, discuss pragmatic strategies, and equip the members with the necessary skills for before, during, and post-disaster scenarios. The centre aims to create awareness about disasters and measures to prevent the loss of life and property. CDMS also envisions diminishing the impact of disasters through integrative learning and education by creating awareness among college students, faculty and staff about disaster management. CDMS has conducted many events in the recent past, including webinars on Multi-Hazard Disaster Management and Dimensions of DRR Journey, Critical Urban Infrastructure-Identifying and Assessing Smart and Green Solutions for Efficient Disaster Resilience, Critical Urban Infrastructural Issues of Disaster Risk and Infrastructure Management in Selected Countries of Global South; Seven days capacity building programs under the PMMMNMTT scheme on the theme Hydro-Meteorological Disaster: Techniques for Measuring, Monitoring and Management of Floods, and two training programs for three days on Disaster Management Plans to Enhance Resilience of Institutional Buildings and Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilience.

Recently a two days mega international conference on "Challenges to Disaster Risk Reduction and Resilient Habitat" in association with the National Institute of Disaster Management-Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India, International Geographical Union Commission (IGU) on Hazard and Risk, and United Nation Office for Disaster Risk Reduction was organized on April 5 -6, 2022. Besides, CDMS organizes regular events like "Disast'O' Pedia': Digital Picture Story Competition, Virtual Poster Making Competition' Art-E-Disaster', Quizzard - Quiz Competition, and Game-O-Mania for interactive learning and dissemination of disaster-related knowledge for students.

The centre aims to organize lectures, short-term courses, and training workshops for the students, staff









and other participants in association with other government and non-government organizations, including NIDM, NDMA, DDMA, etc., in the future. The centre also plans to take research projects for empirical studies and bring out fruitful publications in the public domain for a wider diffusion of science and policy interface. By imparting skills and training, the centre also plans to send college volunteers to help rescue and recover distressed communities. Dr. V.A.V. Raman has been founder director (2018-20) of the centre. Prof. Poonam Sharma was the director till August 2022. Currently, Prof. Kavita Sharma is the director of CDMS.

A proud moment in the annals of the history of the college was the inauguration of the Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research under the aegis of the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the college in September 1, 2016. An initiative of the Department of History, the Study Centre intends to bring together the rich corpus of published and unpublished material on the tumultuous yet enthralling history of the Indian revolutionary struggle against imperialism in which Shaheede-Azam Bhagat Singh and his ideas have made an exemplary and a lasting impact. The significant sources which can currently be accessed in both photocopied and digitized formats are Home Political records, selections from his private papers, excerpts from transcripts of interviews with Bhagat Singh's associates, memoirs, articles and books, contemporary journals, selections from newspapers, poetry, drama and a few documentaries. A vast array of prescribed material, including posters, paintings etc., has been acquired from the National Archives of India and the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library. Most of this material can be accessed from the dedicated section in the College library. To





further sensitize students to the ideals of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, the centre envisages the collection and display of more audio-visual material, including films, documentaries & amp; drama. Dr. Mita Hussain, Department of History, is the co-ordinator of the activities and programmes of this centre.


ICDP's Journey


Enactus

ENACTUS is an international non-profit organization that inspires students to improve the world through entrepreneurial action. Under its aegis, the students strive to create community development projects that put people's ingenuity and talents at the centre of improving their livelihoods. Enactus SBSC was established in October 2014 with a team of only eight members. Guided by mentor Dr. Pooja Talwar and supported by business leaders, the society started its adventure with its maiden venture: Project Karva, which targeted two communities, namely the underprivileged women and the Migrant Potters. The team aimed to teach both the communities about the basic knowledge required for setting up a properly organized business.

This was just the beginning. Thereafter the team took up five more projects, namely Project Roshni, which aimed to train the visually impaired in the art of candle making. Project Aahar, which helps to provide employment opportunities to seasonally employed migrant workers from the neighbouring states of Delhi. The Placement Cell's team comprise of 14 student co-ordinators, who are constantly engaged in developing alliances with potential recruiters seeking quality human capital and furnishing excellent career opportunities to the students.

During the recruitment season 2021-2022, placements at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College broke all past records, making it the most successful recruitment season ever at SBSC. The Season witnessed an all-time high of 276+ offers and a significant growth of 60% in the number of recruiters as more than 50 companies visited the campus for 80+ profiles in diverse sectors. The DE Shaw Group offered the highest ever package of 23 LPA. The Placement Cell was able to bring on board all Big 4 accounting firms, namely Deloitte USI, KPMG India, KPMG Global, Ernst & Young India, Ernst & Young Global and PWC India, for eight diverse profiles. Apart from Big 4s, the cell also on-boarded Big 3 management consulting firms such as Bain & Company and Boston Consulting Group, hiring for





both full-time and internship opportunities. Over the years, SBSC has maintained the confidence of Big 4s and Big 3s, which has resulted in an increase of 55% in their offers. Prof. Ruchi Gupta is the convenor of the Cell.


Moreover, corporate giants like Accenture, Sattva Consulting and unicorn start-ups like Vahdam India, Byjus, to name a few, placed their trust in the potential of our students and recruited from SBSC for the first time. The recruitment season also saw an influx of more than 50% novel recruiters. Apart from providing career opportunities to the students, the Placement Cell also hosted articleship drives for the students pursuing the Chartered Accountancy course. While the pandemic slowed down student learning opportunities, the Placement Cell took the initiative to collaborate with digital learning platform Coursera to provide all students free access to various online courses. The initiative drew the participation of more than 1000 students, who used these courses for upskilling themselves. The cell also collaborated with Quollab to provide students with an opportunity to work on live projects in domains like equity research, consulting, venture capital etc. Apart from these, the Placement Team also carried out a CV vetting drive for more than 450 students to ensure the standardization and genuineness of all CVs. To increase the corporate exposure of first- and second-year college students, the Placement Cell associated with firms like Deloitte USI, KPMG India, EY India, The D.E. Shaw Group, etc., to host events like Graduate School Maverick, KPMG Ideation Challenge and summer internships. The cell has witnessed a smooth shift towards virtual placements to provide a hassle-free hiring experience for recruiters and students.

Given the uncertainty due to COVID, the year was full of challenges. Lockdowns impacted mobility and dismantled the set standards. This was a call for innovation and agility. The constant and untiring efforts made by The Placement Cell's team helped maintain the past legacy and achieve new milestones. The cell successfully managed a smooth transition to virtual placements leading to the most successful recruitment year at SBSC.

Webinars



Queer Feminist Collective (QFC) 🖊



- It is mandatory to submit an undertaking on Judicial Stamp Paper of INR 100/- by the applicant at the time of admission stating that he/she will play for the college and university during their undergraduate course of study.

Admission on the Basis of Extra Curricular Activities (ECA)

THE candidates interested to seek admission under Extra- Curricular Activities (ECA) category are advised to apply online as per University of Delhi guidelines stipulated in university website i.e. www.du.ac.in. Admission under Extra- Curricular Activities (ECA) categories shall be granted in respect of the following Cultural Activities in the college. Not more than 15% concession in academic merit vis-à-vis Unreserved Category applicants for the last relevant cut-off may be given for admission to specific courses Subject to course Admission under ECA category will only be allowed to applicants satisfying the course Specific minimum eligibility criteria.

The selected candidates shall submit an Undertaking at the time of admission stating that the candidatewill perform for the College and University for the entire period undergraduate of the candidate's course of study. The college has a right to cancel their admissions if they violate the undertaking during their stay in college.

The decision of ECA Admission Committee shall be final.

5.	In case a student after his/her admission expires within one month of the last date of admission.	Full fee including examination fee will be refunded to his/her parents.



Attendance Requirement

No student will be eligible to appear in the Semester Examination, if he/she has not attached two-third of lectures, tutorials and practicals held during the academic semester as per rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. Exemption from this requirement will be as per the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi.

Internal Assessment

The staff council resolved that a student should secure minimum of 40 percent attendance in each paper to be eligible to appear in internal assessment of that paper in a semester. A student can get rebate of maximum 20 per cent of total attendance on part of the Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA).

Anti Ragging Rules

- 1. ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING (NOT EVEN FOR FUN) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the Delhi University system as well as public transport.
- 2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under the Ordinance XV-B and C.
- 3. Ragging for the purpose of this, ordinarily means, any act, conduct or practice by which the dominant power or status of senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - a) Involve physical assault or threat or use of physical force
 - b) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students.
 - c) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.



- d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem.
- e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
- 4. In case any student, who has obtained the degree of University of Delhi, is found under this Ordinance, committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected under Statute 15 to appropriate action for the withdrawal of degree conferred by the university.
- 5. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging.

Ragging Related Complaints

Any student aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach Dr. Varinder Kumar, Convener of the Discipline Committee or any staff member of the college for speedy disciplinary action.

Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college.
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or Fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits.
- **⊃** Debarring from representation in college events.
- Withholding results.
- **⊃** Handing over case to the police, if need be.

NOTE: It is mandatory as per the Honourable Supreme Court and UGC/AICTE Regulations that all students fill in an Anti-ragging Affidavit each year. To make the process easy MHRD has developed an ONLINE facility. Affidavits can be filled ONLINE at: www.amanmovement.org

www.antiragging.in The student is required to submit this affidavit in the college within 1 month of close of admission.

Code of Conduct

- 1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline and shall endeavour to promote the honour of the college and to inculcate healthy fellow feelings.
- 2. Student against whom disciplinary action has been taken will not be allowed to contest elections also.
- 3. Student shall refrain from:
 - Misbehavior towards members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students;
 - ii. Smoking, drinking, gambling and drug-taking in any form; Eveteasing;
 - iii. Obstructing passage in the verandah;
 - iv. Causing damage to college building, furniture, fixtures, garden, canteen crockery or to any other property;
 - v. Use of Mobile Phone in the class rooms;
 - vi. Associating with outsiders to create indiscipline in any form in the college. (No outsider will be allowed in the college without any expressed purpose and all visitors will have to make entry in the Visitor Register).
 - a. Unauthorized entry in the college building on holidays;
 - b. Loitering in corridors and making noise outside and inside the class rooms.

For any of the above offences students are liable to punishment which may amount to fine, suspension or even expulsion from the college

- 4. Students are expected to be regular in the classes.
- 5. Students must keep the college neat and clean.
- 6. Students must maintain perfect silence in the Library and obey standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
- 7. Students may participate in their favourite games or sports obeying standing rules and regulations framed by the college.



- 8. Students must always carry identity card with them.
- 9. Students must always see the College Notice Board, the Sports Notice Board and the Library Notice Board daily for obtaining up-to date information of college notices.
- 10. Students are expected not to bring any guests during the teaching hours in the college.
































Location: Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, New Delhi


