## शहीद भगत सिंह

जन्म 28 सितम्बर 1907: शहादत 23 मार्च 1931

“शहीद होने की घड़ी में वह अकेला था, ईश्वर की तरह”

भगत सिंह सिर्फ क्रांतिकारी नहीं, बल्कि एक सुलझे हुए विचारक भी थे। अपनी फाँसी से पहले उन्होंने जेल में “विद्यार्थियों के नाम पत्र” में संदेश दिया था कि “इस समय हम नौजवानों से यह नहीं कह रहे हैं कि वे बम और पिस्तौल उठावें। आज विद्यार्थियों के सामने इससे भी अधिक महत्वपूर्ण काम है।” उनका यह इशारा देश में फैली अज्ञानता और गरीबी को दूर करके भारत को एक ताकतवर राष्ट्र बनाने की ओर था इसीलिए उन्होंने कहा कि “वे (विद्यार्थी) पढ़ें और जरूर पढ़ें” हम सब जानते हैं कि 8 अप्रैल 1929 को दिल्ली की “केंद्रीय एसेम्बली” में बिना किसी को घायल किए उन्होंने बम फेंका और जान बूझकर खुद को गिरफ्तार करवा दिया।

23 मार्च 1931 को जब उनको फाँसी दी गयी तब उनकी उम्र सिर्फ 23 साल 6 महीने की थी। अपनी वीरता और साहस के लिए भगत सिंह आज भी युवाओं के बीच आदर्श तो हैं ही पर साथ ही साथ वे विद्यार्थियों के आदर्श इसलिए भी हैं कि छोटी सी उम्र में उन्होंने देश और दुनिया के बहुत सारे महत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ, विचार, साहित्य, इतिहास और दर्शन पढ़ डाले थे। किताबें उन्हें पिस्तौल से ज्यादा प्यारी थीं, इसलिए वे आज़ादी को “मानसिक गुलामी” से आज़ादी भी मानते थे जिसका रास्ता किताबों से होकर ही जाता है। उन्होंने लिखा कि “क्रांति बम और पिस्तौल का सम्प्रदाय नहीं। क्रांति का अर्थ है आमूल परिवर्तन।”

भगत सिंह की शहादत के इस 89वें वर्ष में विद्यार्थियों के आगे भारत-निर्माण की कई सारी चुनौतियाँ हैं। हमें पूरा विश्वास है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज में प्रवेश पाने वाला हर विद्यार्थी भगत सिंह के उस सपने से खुद को जोड़ेगा। हमें यह जानकारी देते हुए अपार हर्ष है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज अपने स्थापना वर्ष 1967 से ही विद्यार्थियों के जीवन को राष्ट्र-प्रेम और राष्ट्र-निर्माण की दिशा में अग्रसर कर शहीद-ए-आज़म भगत सिंह के संकल्पों को ही पूरा कर रहा है

# Infrastructure Facilities



## Library: Knowledge and Learning Resource Centre

The Shaheed Bhagat Singh College Library is spread across 3 floors, however, at present 2 floors are functional with total seating capacity of 180 seats in reading halls on first and second floors of the library. Coupled with a robust and modern IT led infrastructure, the Library has grown sizeably in its resources and services, readily accessible to each member of our College fraternity. Library has a bar-coded computerized lending facility. Two computers are exclusively devoted for OPAC (On-line Public Access Catalogue) for searching books. A fast growing collection of library is nearing 1 lakh books on diverse fields of study and research and more than hundred Periodicals, comprising of Academic Journals and Magazines of general interest.

### Some of the significant highlights of SBSC library are:

- i. A separate E-resource Centre for faculty as well as for students to facilitate access to a huge number of online journals, financial and statistical databases, reference and citation tools subscribed by Delhi University Library System.
- ii. Establishment of “Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research” by procuring pertinent Primary Resources on Bhagat Singh from National Archives of India (NAI) and Nehru Memorial Museum Library (NMML) as a Golden Jubilee commemoration.
- iii. Setting up a Voluntary Book Bank for poor students as a social responsibility initiative.
- iv. Establishment of a Light Reading Section is another initiative in our endeavour to remain updated both in scholarly and popular contents. This section has been set up keeping in mind that it is imperative to expand our learning beyond the Curriculum in order to cater to varied reading habits and interests transcending class room instructions.
- v. The E-resource centre for students with 12 Wi-Fi enabled computers can be used to access various journals and learning resources.





# Infrastructure Facilities



## Computer Laboratory

Our college has three state-of-the-art computer labs with around 115 laptops for Commerce and Mathematics departments. The laptops are equipped with various softwares and applications like Microsoft Office, Tally, SAS, Mathematica, Octave, R, Maxima, Latex that are required by students as part of their courses. This helps students to visualize/demonstrate various complex concepts/formulas learned in the theory lecture classes. The labs have uninterrupted availability of the internet and are equipped with projectors and audio-visual facilities.

The **Geography Laboratory** is used to teach GIS, Cartography and Remote Sensing courses. The present laboratory is in the process of being renovated with advanced facilities for better teaching-learning process.

Fourteen classrooms are equipped with projectors that help students to learn and grasp concepts quickly. College also provides laptops to needy students on request during the study period in college.

## Seminar/ Conference Room

The college has two Seminar Rooms and one conference room with modern facilities. The college organizes seminars, workshops and academic talks with active participation of students and faculty. Eminent scholars and experts from academic and corporate bodies are invited to interact with the students and deliver lectures.



## Activity Room

The college has 3 activity rooms with basic facilities for extra-curricular activities such as dance, music and theatre rehearsals. We believe that extracurricular activities are the best way of developing an individual's personality.



## Medical Room

The college has a Medical Room wherein basic medical support is provided to the staff and students by a qualified nurse – Ms. Mini Samuel. Doctor is also available on call.

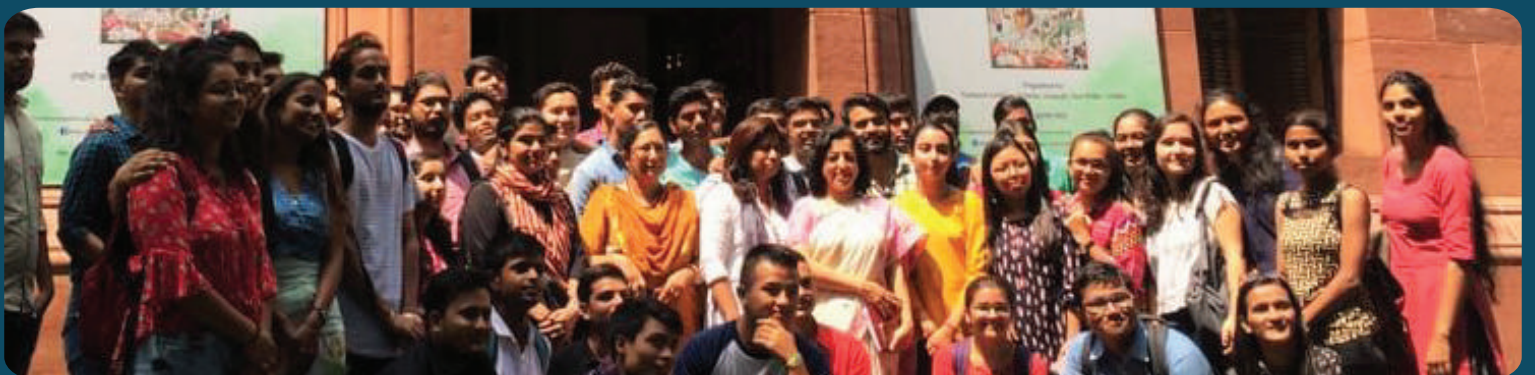

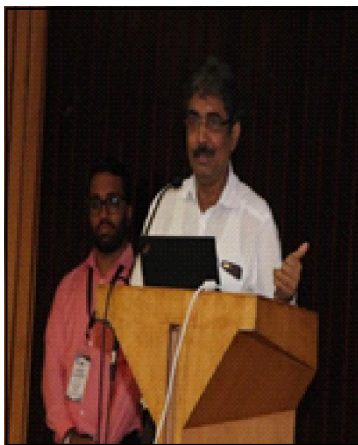


# Life At SBSC

He is supported by Co-convener Dr. Pooja Talwar and team comprising of teachers from various departments of the College and two advisors from Shaheed Bhagat Singh Alumni Association of the College namely, Shri Harinderjit Singh and Shri V. Shekhar.

Encode – the Internship Cell working under the Centre for Skill Development promises to make the students of the College more experienced and provide lot of exposure which is so required in today's times. Encode organises Internship Fair in the College. The Centre will continue to bring in even better opportunities for the students of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College in future.



The centre for skill development under the co-ordinatorship of Dr. Noopur Agrawal also organised an event of global fame – TED Talk in the name of Tedx SBS.

From this year Centre for Skill Development is going to start certificate Add on Courses to bridge the gap in employability. To prepare students for corporate world and equip them with necessary skills to enable them to get employment and be self-employed. The Courses under consideration are as follows:

- i. Digitalization and Taxation Accounting (GST Plus)
- ii. Sales Management

- vi. Tourism Marketing and Destination Branding

Courses will be offered to our students and students of nearby colleges. Date of starting the courses will be announced shortly.

### Centre for Disaster Management Studies (CDMS)

**N**ATURAL disasters like earthquakes, floods, droughts, storms, epidemics and anthropogenic disasters like fire incidents and terrorist attacks are posing major threats to the living world today. The number of these disasters is increasing with every passing day, thereby necessitating the need for people to learn how to react judiciously and constructively to such emergencies. The Centre for Disaster Management Studies aims to equip the students and staff



members with the preparedness to respond urgently and effectively to disasters and employ the training received constructively in such situations to ameliorate disaster-hit regions.

The Centre for Disaster Management Studies (CDMS) was inaugurated on February 1, 2019 with an aim to create awareness about disasters as well as the measures to prevent the loss of life and property, to diminish the impact of disasters through integrative learning and education and to create awareness among college students, faculty and staff about disaster management. The Chief Guest for the Inaugural was Dr. V. Thiruppugazh, Gujarat cadre IAS officer, currently Joint Director (Policy and Plan), National Disaster Management Authority, New Delhi. A session on Disaster Preparedness was also organised under the aegis of the Centre,



conducted by Mr. Nawal Prakash, National Disaster Management Authority, New Delhi.

The Centre aims to organize lectures, short-term courses, and training workshops for the students, staff and other participants in association with other government and non-government organizations in this field, in particular, NIDM, NDMA, DDMA etc in the near future. The Centre also plans to take up real-time projects and bring out publications to address the many nuances of disaster management. Once trained to work in disaster-hit zones, the Centre also plans to send rescue teams from the College to help the distressed and the needy. Dr. V.A.V. Raman, Associate Professor, Department of Geography, is currently the Director of the Centre.

### Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research

A proud moment in the annals of the history of the College was the inauguration of the Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research under the aegis of the Golden Jubilee celebrations of the college on September 1, 2016. An initiative of the Department of History, the Study Centre intends to bring together the rich corpus of published and unpublished material on the tumultuous yet enthralling history of the Indian revolutionary struggle against



imperialism in which Shaheed-e-Azam Bhagat Singh and his ideas have made an exemplary and a lasting impact. The significant sources which can currently be accessed in both photocopied and digitized formats are Home Political records, selections from his private papers, excerpts from transcripts of interviews with Bhagat Singh's associates, memoirs, articles and books, contemporary journals, selections from newspapers, poetry, drama and a few documentaries. A vast array of prescribed material including posters, paintings etc. have been acquired from the National Archives of India and the Nehru Memorial Museum and Library. Most of this material can be accessed from the dedicated section in the College library. To further sensitize students to the ideals of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, the Centre envisages the collection and display of more audio visual material including films, documentaries & drama. Dr. Mita Hussain, Associate Professor, Department of History, is the coordinator of the activities and programmes of this Centre.

### PM Yuva Yojana

FOCUSING specifically on self-employment and entrepreneurship, our College was selected under the scheme, PM Yuva Yojana, which aims to provide proper training to the

youth in this regard. In January 2018, the E-CELL was established to train the students about the practical aspects associated to entrepreneurship. An academic training for the same was organized last year between August-October 2018. More than 50 students enrolled for the course and benefitted from extensive lectures imparted in that duration. PM Yuva Yojana has also collaborated with the Wadhvani foundation on the learning platform, Learnwise, on which the E-Cells of different colleges are registered. At the successful completion of the course, the students were required to set up of a campus company which would serve as a platform for the application of the entrepreneurial skills learned during the course. In the coming years, we also plan to organize entrepreneurial activities by organizing various events under the E Cell, with support from the Wadhvani Foundation and under the guidance of the Nodal office of the PM Yuva Yojana, working under the Ministry of Skill Development and Small Enterprise. Principal Dr. Anil Sardana is the Coordinator of the PM Yuva Yojana Centre in the College.

### International Coordination and Development Programme (ICDP)

UNIVERSITIES and colleges are increasingly realizing the importance of understanding different cultures and the work opportunities they offer. In the highly globalized and rapidly changing world today, young learners in undergraduate programs need to broaden their horizon and gain international exposure. With this aim in mind, the ICDP was established in the College last year to foster a multi-faceted approach to learning through global outreach. The Programme aims to open a world of possibilities for students by facilitating Student Exchange Programmes through international collaborations. We are now among the very few colleges in the University of Delhi which provide students with such exceptional and promising opportunities.



In its maiden year itself, the ICDP organized an orientation session, a lecture and an ICDP summit on "Opportunities and Challenges of Foreign Collaborations and Exchange in India," all of which saw the participation of resource-persons and speakers affiliated to reputed International Universities. We take pride in the fact that we have tentatively collaborated with universities across the globe, namely the University of British Columbia, the University of Chicago and New York University. Dr. Amrita Bajaj, Assistant Professor, Department of Geography, is currently the coordinator of ICDP.

### Herbal Garden

A Herbal Garden was established on October 25, 2016 in the College by Harithkram - the Environment Society of the College, with research consultancy from DEEKSHA, and



supported by the Department of Environment, Government of the NCT of Delhi. The garden is a collection of living herbal and other plants for the purposes of understanding, conservation, learning, and display. An allied aim of establishing the Herbal Garden was to popularise their usefulness and to conserve the associated traditional knowledge and their values for future generations..

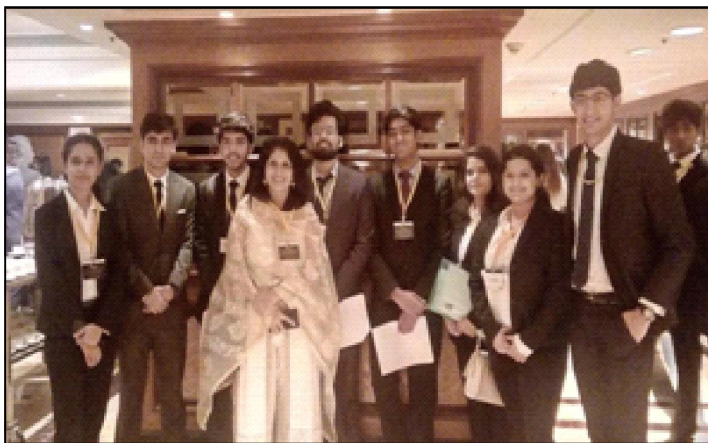
## Enactus

Under its aegis, the students strive to create community development projects that put people's own ingenuity and talents at the center of improving their livelihoods.



Enactus SBSC was established in October 2014 with a team of only 8 members. Guided by mentor Dr.Pooja Talwar and supported by business leaders, the society started its adventure with its maiden venture: Project Karva which targeted two communities namely the



underprivileged woman and the Migrant Potters. The team aimed at teaching both the communities about the basic knowledge required for the setting up of a proper organized business.

This was just the beginning. thereafter the team took up 3 more projects namely Project Roshni which aimed to train the visually impaired the art of candle making, Project Aahar which helps in providing employment opportunities to seasonally employed migrant workers from the neighboring states of Delhi and Project Vidyut which works towards the unique cause and ingenious idea of sustainable energy and the importance of use of alternative sources of energy in the future.

## Cultural Council

**T**HE outstanding Cultural Council of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College is the pride of the institution. It is an umbrella body comprising of nine societies: Film Tantra (film making and film appreciation society), Envision (the photography society), Audiophile (the music society), Meraki (the creative writing society), Promethean (the fine arts society), Spardha (the dance society), Natuve (the theatre society), Revolutionists (the quizzing and debating society) and Noor (the fashion society). The annual cultural fest of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, Dastaan 2019, was held in the college premises on March 30-31, 2018, which witnessed the enthusiastic participation of students from the numerous colleges of DU as well as different



educational institutions of Delhi NCR. All the societies of the Cultural Council together won a tally of a whopping 230 prizes in the university circuit last year, which is a record in itself!

**Filmtantra**, the film making and film appreciation society, aims to bring independent cinema that breaks the barriers of form, language and subject matter to a largely student audience, by organising regular screenings and an annual film festival. Last year, Filmtantra made 5 films along with after-movies for major cultural events in the College. These productions were also screened at student festivals across Delhi and even won prizes.

**Envision**, the photography society, sees the world from behind its lenses, noticing beauty in the seemingly mundane, bringing to the fore what usually goes unnoticed. Members of Envision showcase their photographs at photo exhibitions across the city. The society also tirelessly covers all the events held in the College and sometimes, also in other colleges of DU. The society's members won numerous awards in the events organized by colleges all across Delhi.

**Audiophile**, the music society, brings the much-needed musical flavour to the College during the festive season through Classical Indian as well as Western Music. The society bagged about 45 prizes last year which spanned across various categories: Solo, Band Competitions,



Indian Classical, Semi-Classical and Fusion Duet competitions. The newly formed Indian Classical Choir of the society bagged its first ever prize with its annual piece.

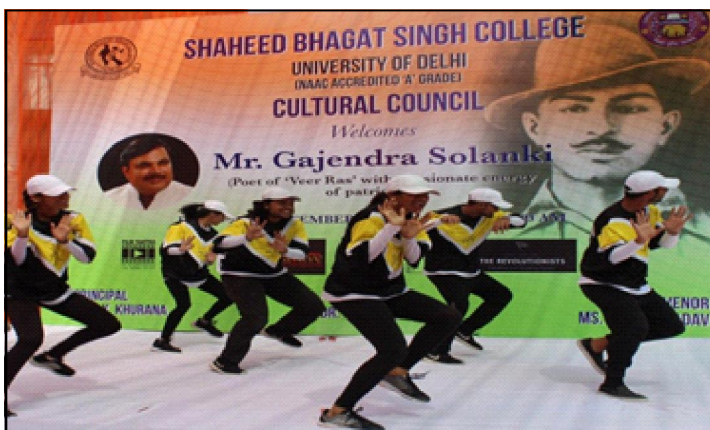
**Meraki**, the Creative Writing Society has budding poets and writers who are not only proficient with their pen but also articulate orators and slam poets. They have been winning numerous prizes in slam poetry competitions and creative writing competitions all over DU.

Members of **Promethean**, the fine arts society, work tirelessly throughout the year: from decorating the college for various events like Bhagat Singh Jayanti and the annual festival, to pepping up the walls of the college canteen with breathtaking graffiti, they bring an aesthetic feel to the College. The society organizes various competitions in the College and also participates in competitions like clay-modelling, graffiti on canvas, t-shirt painting, face painting, pot painting, newspaper dressing, poster making and political cartoon making organized by different colleges and universities in Delhi NCR.



**Spardha**, the Western Dance Society of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College is counted as one of the best college dance crews of India. With over 50 competition titles won in the last season, Spardha was also declared as Winners of the Delhi Dance Fever '19 and was awarded with the Best Team title.

**Natve**, the Theatre Society of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, brings immersive theatre to University of Delhi by indulging the audience in the plays they perform. The society organizes its own street play and



stage play festivals, Paigaam and Space respectively. Hosting the best campus theatre teams with an approximate footfall of 3000-4000 people including many theatre enthusiasts in Delhi, Paigaam evokes the revolutionary essence of street plays, thereby spreading significant social messages alongside.

**Revolutionists**, the quizzing society, organized their Quizzing Fest, Inquilab, during Dastaan '19, which, for the first time, saw participants from foreign universities such as Princeton and Purdue University. The English as well as the Hindi debating wings of Revolutionists have been on the winning streak, bagging several prizes in the College as well as in other institutions in Delhi NCR.

**Noor**, the Fashion Society, is the newest member of the cultural council, formed only last year. The society organized Aurora '19, a Fashion Competition in Dastaan '19, which went to packed houses. Students from different courses showcased their takes on the topic 'Feminism.' The society aims to arouse serious discussions on significant social issues through the medium of fashion in the coming years.

## Students' Union

**T**HE Students' Union of the College is a democratically elected body which works for the welfare of the students and towards improvements in the College. In our College, we attempt to



develop the leadership skills of our students by involving them in various decision-making activities for the betterment of the students and the infrastructural facilities of the College. The Students Union organizes a Freshers' Party and a Union Festival, both of which are widely popular amongst the youth of our College.

## Placement Cell

**T**HE Placement Cell is the official association of students responsible for inviting companies and facilitating the placements of students from the College as well as for promoting their personal development and skill enhancement through various workshops and seminars. It is constantly engaged in developing alliances with potential recruiters and inviting them to the College to provide high quality human capital to the recruiters on the one hand, and furnishing excellent opportunities to fresh graduates on the other. The College equips the students to learn about entrepreneurial and managerial skills to conduct themselves in challenging business environments by conducting CV vetting processes and regular recruitment drives. The Placement Cell aims to provide a smooth recruitment procedure for companies that visit the campus and create valuable symbiotic relationships between job-seekers and job-providers for future interactions.

The College boasts of a record number of placements last year, second only to SRCC. As of March 2019, more than 160 students were



presented with offers from various companies, out of which more than 130 were job offers while some 30 were offers for articleship. Reputed corporate houses and management consultancy firms like Deloitte USI, Ernst & Young, GDS, KPMG Global, Bain Capability Centre, KPMG India, NIIT, Wipro, Genpact and Boston Consultancy Group recruited our students across diverse profiles, offering packages ranging between an average CTC of 4.69 lakhs to the highest on-campus package of 20 lakhs (offered by D. E. Shaw). Additionally, the Placement Cell also invited firms like Mazars and AARK India, among others, to hire students for articleship. The non-profit organization “Teach for India” also short-listed some of our students to work with them.

### College Magazine - VANI

**I**N order to promote the creative potential and expressive skills of the students, the College encourages students to contribute to the College Magazine. Contributions cover a wide range of genres like expository and informative articles, interesting autobiographical and anecdotal experiences, humorous and satirical pieces, poems, short stories, one-act plays, photo essays, etc. Contributions are evaluated by the Editorial Committee of the Magazine before publication. The Editorial Team also comprises students from the College, who work under the guidance of the teacher convener of the Magazine Committee. The College now publishes an e-magazine in a bid to contribute towards paper-reduction for a better environment.

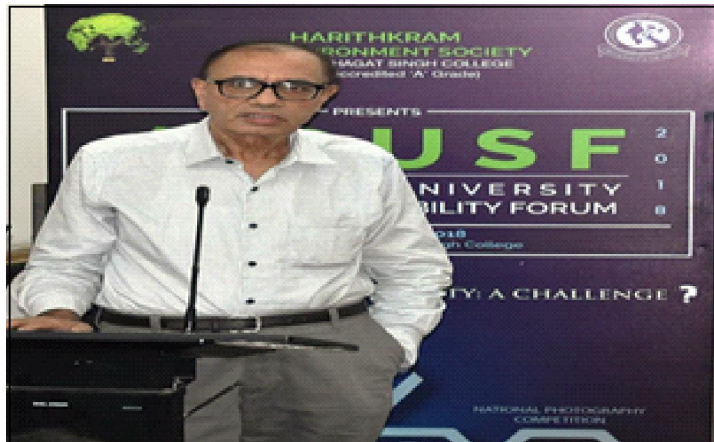

Harithkram invites the batch of first year students to join in the **sapling plantation drive** in the first few days to sensitize the students to the environment and their surroundings. The fresh batch of students will also be invited to join “Harithkram” through the first two weeks of August.

### Students’ Aid Fund

**W**E, at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, believe that every student deserves to get the best of education irrespective of the financial condition of his family. 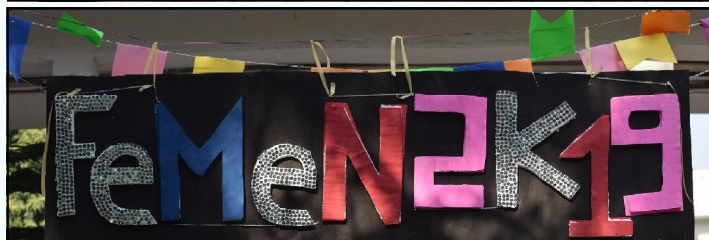
Authority, Dr. Anil Sardana, Principal of the College. For more information on RTI, kindly refer to the College website.

Admission to the course is granted by the college on the basis of the selection for admission advice issued by the Department of Commerce, University of Delhi.



# Admission Guidelines for Under Graduate Programme 2019-20

- The candidates seeking admission to any of the courses at under-graduate level are required to register themselves online by logging on to Delhi University Website, i.e., [www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in)
- The various categories are as follows:
  - ❑ UR, OBC, SC, ST, EWS, PwD, Kashmiri Migrants, CW (Children/Wards of the Officers and Men of the Armed Forces including Para-Military Personnel), admission of wards of college/university employees, admission on Sports basis and admission on Extra Curricular Activities (ECA) basis.
  - ❑ The College will follow the guidelines issued by the University of Delhi for the calculation of best of 4 subjects percentage for admission to Honours and Programme courses.
  - ❑ The college will follow the University Guidelines for change of stream for admission to B.A. Programme.
  - ❑ The candidates must check the University website and website of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, i.e. [www.sbsc.in](http://www.sbsc.in) for cut-offs for different courses. The candidates who meet the requisite cut-off should log on to the DU web portal and select college/course where he/she wants to take admission and meets the desired cut-offs. The candidate will take the print out of the form and proceed to the college for verification of mark-sheet, calculation of cut-off percentage depending on the course and verification of other documents. After this, the college will

approve the admission on the DU web portal and the candidate will be required to deposit the fee online.

- ❑ Candidates who could not take admission in a cut-off list can be considered for admission in the immediate next cut-off list only on the last date of admission, subject to availability of seats.
- ❑ The College shall accept the class X and class XII certificates of the approved Boards of Secondary and Senior Secondary Education in India (All India Boards and State Boards) as notified by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India. For complete details please refer to [www.mhrd.gov.in](http://www.mhrd.gov.in).
- ❑ For boards, like International Baccalureate, whose results are declared late, candidates may be considered in whichever cut-off list their result is declared, subject to availability of seats and provided the candidate had completed the online registration process.
- ❑ The College shall strictly follow the university guidelines with respect to gap year policy. Gap year(s) would be no bar for the purpose of admission to the undergraduate courses.
- ❑ The last date of admission for all undergraduate courses will be as notified by University of Delhi. For detailed admission related guidelines please visit University of Delhi website i.e. [www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in).

## Admission on the Basis of Sports

THE candidates interested to seek admission under sports category are advised to apply online as per University of Delhi guidelines stipulated in university website.

- The Sports Admission Committee of the college shall:
  - i) screen the applications/forms uploaded by the candidates.
  - ii) verify original Sports Certificates of the candidates as per marks allotted by the DUSC.
- The level of competency of the candidate in the Sports/Games shall be determined only for those who have achieved a distinction in Sports/Games during the last three years in the Sports/Games recognised by AIU and IOA. Preference will be given to Sports/Games in which Delhi University Inter-college and Inter-university Competitions/Tournaments are held.
- The level of distinction of certificates will be determined from 1st May, 2016 to 30th April, 2019.
- It is mandatory to submit an undertaking on Judicial Stamp Paper of INR 100/- by the applicant at the time of admission stating that he/she will play for the college and university during their undergraduate course of study.

# Admission on the Basis of Extra Curricular Activities (ECA)

THE candidates interested to seek admission under Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) category are advised to apply online as per University of Delhi guidelines stipulated in university website i.e. [www.du.ac.in](http://www.du.ac.in). Admission under Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) categories shall be granted in respect of the following Cultural Activities in the college. ## Note:

- The ECA Admission Committee of the college shall:
  - i) screen the applications/forms uploaded by the candidates
  - ii) verify original ECA Certificates of the candidates as per marks allotted by the ECA Committee.
- Not more than 15% concession in academic merit vis-à-vis Unreserved Category applicants for the last relevant cut-off may be given for admission to specific courses subject to course-specific eligibility criteria. Admissions under ECA category will only be allowed to applicants satisfying the course-specific minimum eligibility criteria.
- The selected candidates shall submit an Undertaking at the time of admission stating that the candidate will perform for the College and University for the entire period of the candidate's undergraduate course of study. The college has a right to cancel their admissions if they violate the undertaking during their stay in college.
- The decision of ECA Admission Committee shall be final.

## Admission Rules, Regulations and Procedures

ADMISSION will be done on the basis of merit decided by the Admission Committee and the Principal. Admission to all the courses are routed through various Committees that are constituted for this purpose. Candidates are required to submit the print out of the admission form downloaded from the University of Delhi, Web Portal and the set of college forms, for admission to the First year (Semester I) of three Year CBCS Under Graduate Programme. The First Admission list shall be notified on June 28, 2019.

### 1. Eligibility

On the admission day, the eligibility of the applicant will be verified as per the university rules. The Mark-sheet of the applicant will be matched with the Board Result available on their websites. Satisfying the qualifying criteria the applicant will then be issued an Eligibility Slip and should proceed towards document verification.

The reserved category applicant (OBC/SC/ST/EWS/PwD) after getting the eligibility slip issued will be required to get their caste certificate verified and then may proceed for document verification.

### 2. Documents/Certificates Required for Admission

- i) Eligibility Slip issued by the College (Computation of Best 4%)
- ii) DU Registration Form (Containing the College Name and the Course to which the admission is sought)

- iii) Duly filled Reference Card (Detached from Admission Form Supplied by the College)
- iv) Duly filled I-Card Form (Detached from Admission Form Supplied by the College)
- v) Undertaking for Minimum Attendance
- vi) Generic Elective (GE) Optional Form
- vii) Class XII Marks-sheet.
- viii) Class XII Provisional Certificate/Original Certificate
- ix) Class X Marks-sheet cum certificate showing Date of Birth
- x) SC/ST/OBC/EWS/PwD Certificate (if applicable)

**Note: In case of any of the certificate(s) is not verifiable online, college reserves the right to retain the original certificate(s) for verification.**

**A) In case of SC/ST candidates-** Caste certificate in the name of candidates, if the certificate is not verifiable online, Caste Certificate of Father/Mother/Brother/Sister is required.

**B) In the case of OBC candidates-**

- The Caste Certificate must be in the name of applicant.
- The Caste should be included in the Central list of OBC.



- ❑ Certificate must mention the non-creamy layer status of the applicant.
- ❑ The OBC non-creamy layer status certificate issued for the Financial year 2018-19 shall be valid only as per Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. EWS Certificate from DM/ADM/DC/ADC/SDM/Tehsildar/SDO or any competent authority prescribed as per notification no. 36039/1/2019-Estt (Res) issued by Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Govt. of India, certifying the applicant can claim reservation under this category. The names of applicants claiming reservation under this category must match with the names that appear on their corresponding School Board qualifying certificates; similarly their parents names must match in both sets of certificates.

- ❑ **The EWS Candidates are also required to submit the following documents:**
  - Photocopy of Proof of Income (Any of the following):
    - In case of father/ mother being salaried:
      - Form 16 issued by the employer
      - Copy of income tax return for the assessment year 2018-19 containing the name of employer
    - In other case:
      - Copy of income tax return of last 3 years i.e. assessment year 2018-19, 2017-18 & 2016-17.

#### **D) In case of PwD candidates**

Applicants must furnish a valid disability certificate issued by a recognized Government hospital, bearing a photograph of the applicant.

- xi) Proof of residence of the student and parent/guardian viz. electricity bill, AADHAR card, Voter ID card, receipt of property tax payment, MTNL/ BSNL telephone bill, which would be notified with the original. In case the residence proof of the local address is not practically possible, then permanent residence proof is compulsory.
- xii) Three recent passport size photographs of the Candidate and One Photograph of the Parent/Guardian.
- xiii) Candidate must be present throughout the admission procedure along with either parent (guardian only in the case of outstation students)

**Self-attested Photocopies of documents mentioned in point no. vii to xi above.**

### **3. Attestation of Documents**

The University will accept the self-attested copies of documents/papers provided by the students. It is made clear that if any false attestation/falsified records are detected, the student will be debarred from attending any course in the University or its College(s) for next five years and in addition, a criminal case under relevant sections of IPC (viz, 470, 471, 474 etc.) **will be instituted against him/her, to subject him/her to the requisite criminal proceedings.**

# Rules for Refund of Fee on Account of Withdrawal/Cancellation of Admission

Sr. No.	Reasons for Seeking Refund	Quantum of fee to be refunded
1.	When a student applies for withdrawal of admission upto last date of admission	Full fee after deduction of Rs.1000/- and full examination fee.
2.	When admission is error/omission/commission on the part of the University/ College	Full fee and full examination fee.
3.	When cancellation of admission is due to concealment/falsification of facts, submission of false/fake certificates(s), providing misleading information by the student or for any error/mistake on the part of the student.	No fee will be refunded.
4.	When a student of Self Financing course applies for withdrawal of admission on or before the last date of admission.	Full fee after deduction of Rs. 1000/- and full examination fee.
5.	In case a student after his/her admission expires within one month of the last date of admission.	Full fee including examination fee will be refunded to his/her parents.

## Rules, Discipline and Code of Conduct

### Attendance Requirement

No student will be eligible to appear in the Semester Examination, if he/she has not attached two-third of lectures, tutorials and practicals held during the academic semester as per rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. Exemption from this requirement will be as per the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi.

### Internal Assessment

The staff council resolved that a student should secure minimum of 40 percent attendance in each paper to be eligible to appear in internal assessment of that paper in a semester. A student can get rebate of maximum 20 per cent of total attendance on part of the Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA).

### Anti Ragging Rules

1. Zero Tolerance For Ragging (Not Even For Fun) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the Delhi University system as well as public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under the Ordinance XV-B and C.
3. Ragging for the purpose of this, ordinarily means, any act, conduct or practice by which the dominant power or status of senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
  - a) Involve physical assault or threat or use of physical force
  - b) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students.

- c) Violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
  - d) Expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem.
  - e) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. In case any student, who has obtained the degree of University of Delhi, is found under this Ordinance, committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected under Statute 15 to appropriate action for the withdrawal of degree conferred by the university.
  5. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging.

### Ragging Related Complaints

Any student aggrieved in this matter may fearlessly approach Dr. Varinder Kumar, Convener of the Discipline Committee or any staff member of the college for speedy disciplinary action.

Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college.
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or Fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in college events.
- Withholding results.
- Handing over case to the police, if need be.

**NOTE: It is mandatory as per the Honourable Supreme Court and UGC/AICTE Regulations that all students fill in an Anti-ragging Affidavit each year. To make the process easy MHRD has developed an ONLINE facility. Affidavits can be filled Online at: [www.amanmovement.org/www.antiragging.in](http://www.amanmovement.org/www.antiragging.in). The student is required to submit this affidavit in the college within 1 month of close of admission.**

## Code of Conduct

Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline and shall endeavour to promote the honour of the college and to inculcate healthy fellow feelings.

1. Student against whom disciplinary action has been taken may not be granted re-admission. Such a student will be liable to forfeit any prizes won or office held if so decided by the college Discipline Committee.
2. Student against whom disciplinary action has been taken will not be allowed to contest elections also.
3. Student shall refrain from:
  - i. Misbehaviour towards members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students;
  - ii. Smoking, drinking, gambling and drug-taking in any form; Eve-teasing;
  - iii. Obstructing passage in the verandah;
  - iv. Causing damage to college building, furniture, fixtures, garden, canteen crockery or to any other property;
  - v. Use of Mobile Phone in the class rooms;
  - vi. Associating with outsiders to create indiscipline in any form in the college. (No outsider will be allowed in the college without

any expressed purpose and all visitors will have to make entry in the Visitors Register).

- a. Unauthorized entry in the college building on holidays;
- b. Loitering in corridors and making noise outside and inside the class rooms.

For any of the above offences students are liable to punishment which may amount to fine, suspension or even expulsion from the college

4. Students are expected to be regular in the classes.
5. Students must keep the college neat and clean.
6. Students must maintain perfect silence in the Library and obey standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
7. Students may participate in their favourite games or sports obeying standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
8. Students must always carry identity card with them.
9. Students must always see the College Notice Board, the Sports Notice Board and the Library Notice Board daily for obtaining up-to date information of college notices.
10. Students are expected not to bring any guests during the teaching hours in the college.
11. Suggestions from students are always welcome and will be given proper attention.

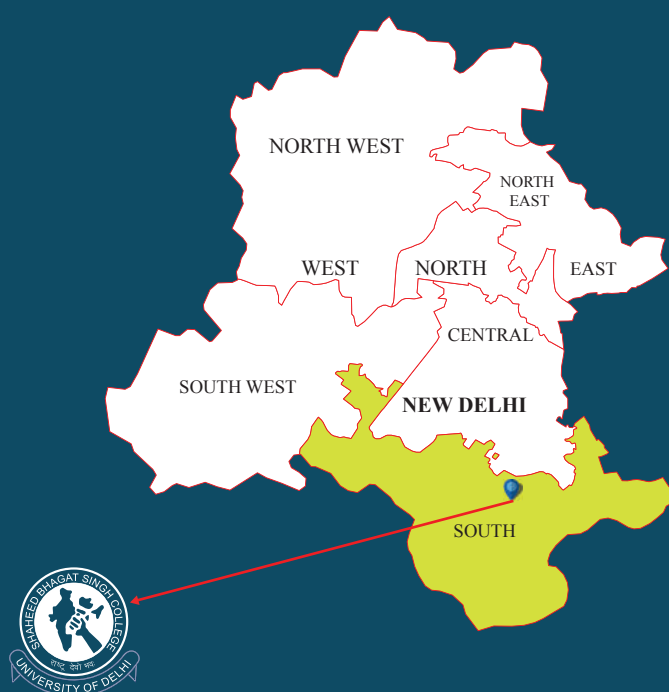

## Shaheed Bhagat Singh College New Delhi
