
Legend then, Legend now, Legend forever.....



भगत सिंह सिर्फ क्रांतिकारी नहीं, बल्कि एक सुलझे हुए विचारक भी थे। अपनी फाँसी से पहले उन्होंने जेल में विद्यार्थियों के नाम पत्र में संदेश दिया था कि 'इस समय हम नौजवानों से यह नहीं कह रहे हैं कि वे बम और पिस्तौल उठायें। आज विद्यार्थियों के सामने इससे भी अधिक महत्वपर्ण काम है।' उनका यह इशारा देश में फैली अज्ञानता और गरीबी को दूर करके भारत को एक ताकतवर राष्ट्र बनाने की ओर था इसीलिए उन्होंने कहा कि 'वे (विद्यार्थी) पढ़ें और जरूर पढ़ें हम सब जानते हैं कि 8 अप्रैल 1929 को दिल्ली की केंद्रीय एसेम्बली में बिना किसी को घायल किए उन्होंने बम फेंका और जान बूझकर खुद को गिरफ्तार करवा दिया।

23 मार्च 1931 को जब उनको फाँसी दी गयी तब उनकी उम्र सिर्फ 23 साल 6 महीने की थी। अपनी वीरता और साहस के लिए, भगत सिंह आज भी युवाओं के बीच आदर्श तो हैं ही पर साथ ही साथ वे विद्यार्थियों के आदर्श इसलिए, भी हैं कि छोटी सी उम्र में उन्होंने देश और दुनिया के बहुत सारे महत्वपूर्ण ग्रंथ, विचार, साहित्य, इतिहास और दर्शन पढ़ डाले थे। किताबें उन्हें पिस्तौल से ज्यादा प्यारी थीं, इसलिए वे आज़ादी को "मानसिक गुलामी" से आज़ादी भी मानते थे जिसका रास्ता किताबों से होकर ही जाता है। उन्होनें लिखा कि "क्रांति बम और पिस्तौल का सम्प्रदाय नहीं। क्रांति का अर्थ है आमूल परिवर्तन ।"

शहीद भगत सिंह की शहादत के इस ९४व वर्ष में, देश के युवाओं के सम्मुख भारत-निर्माण की अनेक चुनौतियाँ विद्यमान हैं। हमें पूर्ण विश्वास है कि शहीद भगत सिंह कॉलेज में प्रवेश पाने वाला हर विद्यार्थी शहीद-ए-आज़म भगत सिंह के स्वप्नों से स्वयं को जोड़ते हुए, राष्ट्रहित में सक्रिय भूमिका निभाएँगे।


### ACADEMIC ACCREDITATION AND DISTINCTIONS



### **DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS**



The Department of Economics of the College offers undergraduate programmes in Economics - B.A.(Honours) Economics and B.A.(Prog.) with Economics as a major and minor. B.A.(Hons.) Economics is one of the most prestigious courses of the college and the University of Delhi. It attracts the best students from all over the country. SBSC is one of the few colleges that offers B.A.(Prog.) with Economics & Commerce and Economics & Mathematics as subject combinations. GE offered by the department is the most popular GE in the college.

The Department was set up in 1967 with the very establishment of the college. At that time the number of students rarely exceeded 40 with no female students and only 3 faculty members in the department. The strength of faculty members in the department has increased to 19 committed and dynamic teachers with specializations in various branches of economics and a tremendous research base. The total number of students in the department has also increased to 200 at present. The department has been able to attract a number of students from different parts of India. Our students have outperformed not only in academics but also in sports and other extracurricular activities. The department makes constant efforts to encourage students not only in academics but also in their overall personality enhancement.

A brief glimpse includes the **Economic Society**, **now called Ecospire**, which has been playing a vital role in developing and showcasing the talents of the students in the sphere of economics while cultivating their interest and applicative ability.



The annual Economics Fest, named 'Econotise', gives an opportunity to all the aspiring economists at inter as well as intra-college/university levels to participate in various activities like panel discussions, paper presentations, MUN, extempore, economic quizzes, etc., to enhance their pioneering ideas through interactions and debates, drawing an overwhelming response each year.

The department organizes national seminars, lecture series, workshops, and webinars by eminent speakers and experts on contemporary economic issues. Along with it, the department also organizes industrial visits, plantation drives, and recreational tours, which would help in overall personality building and raising environmental sensitization.

The alumni of the department have opted for higher education from prestigious institutions like the Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, Jawaharlal Nehru University, IIMs, ISB and IIFT in India. Many of the students have joined international universities like the London School of Economics, the University of Scotland, and the University of Chicago for their master's and research. #### Alyssum: The Literary Magazine



### PRINCIPAL'S INTERNSHIP SCHEME



The Principal's Internship Scheme 1.0 and 2.0 at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, University of Delhi, is a flagship programme that has successfully completed two tenures, offering students invaluable hands-on experience in the college's administrative and operational framework. Designed to provide practical exposure without disrupting academic commitments, the scheme enables students to engage with various college departments while balancing their coursework effectively. The convenor of the Principal Internship Scheme, **Dr. Mahesh Kumar Chaudhary**, has provided immense support and guidance to ensure the programme runs smoothly.

Last academic year, the internship program received over 300 registrations from both morning and evening colleges. After a rigorous selection process, students were assigned to key departments, including the Administration Office, Library, and Knowledge Dissemination Center. Interns contributed to daily operations, records management, and academic support services, gaining first-hand insight into institutional management. Beyond administrative training, the scheme also equips students with essential life skills, preparing them for group discussions, interviews, and the practical applications of their knowledge. Many students benefited greatly from this real-time exposure, with some securing direct placements and others being offered part-time roles in their respective fields.



The principal's vision for this initiative has always been to create a holistic learning experience—one that integrates theoretical knowledge with practical exposure, enabling students to develop essential workplace skills such as teamwork, time management, and problem-solving. Over the years, the Principal's Internship Scheme has become a program that consistently draws enthusiastic participation from both morning and evening college students. As the college continues to expand this initiative, it remains committed to enhancing the program's impact, ensuring that students gain meaningful experiences that prepare them for future professional challenges.



### SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMMES, AWARDS AND PRIZES

In order to recognize the academic, co-curricular and extra-curricular achievements of our students, the college organizes the Annual Day and Prize Distribution function every year since its inception. The college endeavours to cultivate an atmosphere of healthy competition and meritocracy by recognising the dedication and effort demonstrated by its students in their academic pursuits. These accolades are intended to inspire students to strive for the standard of excellence that Shaheed Bhagat Singh College upholds. The College continues to encourage its educators to work in close synergy with students to deliver quality education, a commitment that shall remain steadfast in the years to come.

#### STUDENT AID FUND AND FEE CONCESSION

Shaheed Bhagat Singh College is determined to provide quality education to all the students with equal opportunity and accessibility. The college is completely devoted to spread out inclusivity and avoid financial constraints of the students to protect their academic interests. Therefore, the college has established a 'Students Aid Fund & Fee Concession Committee' to facilitate students who need financial aid to continue their studies. The concession can range anywhere between 10 percent to 100 percent fee relaxation, depending upon financial need and circumstances of the concerned student.

Applications are invited from the students, through online or offline mode, in the beginning of academic session. Thereafter, interviews are conducted comprehensively with all the students who applied for fee concession. The committee decides some basic parameters to ensure that the fee concession or relaxation should be given to the students who actually need it. The percentage of fee concession depends upon parameters, such as economic status of the student's family, academic performance, regular attendance, and overall discipline and behaviour in the college.

In the previous academic year, the committee conducted two extensive sessions of interviews to deal with all the students of Ist, IInd & IIIrd year who applied for the student aid fund and fee concession. The Committee has recommended more than 300 students for fee concession. The committee has recommended hundred percent fee relaxation for some students based on their economic conditions.



### INFRASTRUCTURE

Over the last few years, the college has undertaken a series of infrastructure development projects to enrich the educational ecosystem and improve accessibility. The crowning glory of this transformative phase was the visit of Prof. Yogesh Singh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi, who inaugurated a range of major infrastructure projects on July 22, 2024. His visit, alongwith other esteemed university dignitaries, marked a proud and historic moment, as it was the first time that the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi visited our college, lauding and blessing the institution's strides toward modernization and inclusivity. Among the standout achievements have been the unveiling of a fully renovated Shaheed Bhagat Singh statue; enhanced accessibility and teaching facilities through installation of new elevators; several smart classrooms and laboratories; upgraded seminar halls; and state-of-the-art facilities like the open-air auditorium, the Academic Auditorium, a new Staff Room, a video-conferencing committee room, and the renovated Library Reading Hall. These developments have not only improved infrastructure but also symbolized the college's forward looking vision in alignment with NEP 2020 and its commitment to excellence. Details of these facilities and developments have been enumerated in the following sections.

#### LIBRARY: KNOWLEDGE & LEARNING RESOURCE CENTRE

"A room without books is like a body without a soul", said the Roman statesman and philosopher Cicero. At Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, the college library has always been the cornerstone and soul of our academic endeavours. The library keeps evolving to ensure a pleasing ambience and modern, inclusive infrastructure that can ensure congenial environment for academic pursuits of all its members, evidenced by remarkable, consistent growth in its collections and services. Equipped with modern ICT tools, air conditioning in the reading hall, and CCTV security, the library offers a conducive environment for study and research. Working with a fully automated Knowledge and Learning Resource Centre since 2010 and updated with KOHA Library Management Software for database management (with features such as e-mail alert during the process of checking in/out books, online book reservations/suggestions, and a web-based Online Public Access Catalogue for efficient book/resource searches), the college library is spread over three floors with seating for 200+ students. Among other facilities, the library offers the convenience of a newly renovated state-of-the-art reading hall with air-conditioning and comfortable furniture,



modern signage and art across the three floors, E-resource centres for students and faculty with high-speed Wi-Fi, projectors, and over 22 computer systems, and access to online catalogues, a vast collection of 70,000 volumes, rare texts, and daily newspapers, and a plethora of online academic resources including the ones accessible through the revolutionary ONOS facility (a trailblazing, digital library initiative by the Government of India, offering free-of-cost institutional access to global research and resources across the country). Special sections, centres and projects of the library include Centre for Shaheed Bhagat Singh Studies and Research, which is dedicated to the ideals and philosophy of Shaheed-e-Aazam Bhagat Singh, a Light Reading Section to develop the taste for reading in our students that includes fiction, biographies, travelogues, and more genres, a Voluntary Book Bank for students in need, and a Periodical Section with subscription to 74 periodicals, comprising 39 academic journals and 35 magazines of general and scholarly interest as well as several/24 reputed newspapers. Moreover, students and faculty members benefit from access to over five lakh e-journals and e-books through the Delhi University Library System (DULS) and INFLIBNET consortia.

In an effort to support extended academic engagement, the operational hours of the Reading Hall have been extended, starting from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. This revolutionary initiative has received an enthusiastic response and underscored the institution's commitment to academic excellence, accessibility, and student-centric learning.





### LIBRARY: STATE-OF-THE-ART READING HALL

The newly renovated Reading Hall of the library, designed with enhanced seating arrangements in a comfortable, conducive, air-conditioned space that meets the needs of a diverse group of students, was inaugurated on 25th March 2025, a move that was applauded by all students and staff members present. With the capacity to accommodate around 300 students and supported by lifts that enhance accessibility, this hall has earned the distinction of being one of the largest air-conditioned reading halls among colleges of the University of Delhi, accessible and welcoming to everyone, including differently abled students. Another crucial addition to the college library has been the Helen Keller Resource Centre, which is currently under development. This dedicated space inside the library will further strengthen our commitment to supporting students with disabilities, providing them with the resources, tools, and environment they need to thrive academically and personally.



#### ACADEMIC AUDITORIUM

The college has made another significant stride with the inauguration of the newly constructed state-of-the-art Academic Auditorium on 17th February 2025. With a seating capacity of 230, the auditorium, located atop the library, marks a significant addition to the college's academic infrastructure, offering the promise of enabling insightful conferences, seminars, interactions, collaboration, and discussions across academic fields and institutions. It includes features such as flexible seating arrangements, high-profile speakers, an elevated podium, powerful lighting, wall-mounted screens, wireless internet connectivity, enhanced accessibility through an inclined platform lift for wheelchair users or individuals requiring mobility assistance, a well-designed green room, and an emergency exit.





#### OPEN-AIR AUDITORIUM

The college has recently taken a monumental step forward by constructing a state-of-the-art open-air auditorium equipped with rock-wool insulation, providing a venue for major academic and cultural events where optimal design, flexibility, efficiency, and sustainability are seamlessly integrated. The auditorium is equipped with energy-efficient, low-noise High Volume Low Speed (HVLS) fans, providing smooth, uniform air circulation that enhances comfort, eliminates the need for multiple standing fans, and offers a sustainable, costeffective cooling solution for events.





### COMPUTER AND GEOGRAPHY LABS

The college has established five modern computer labs with 60+ high-spec computers, projectors and sound systems, with more equipments on the way. Remote sensing labs and Digital Cartography lab of the Department of Geography have been provided with state-of-the-art devices and technologies to enable cutting-edge research and learning for students as well as faculty members. These initiatives, coupled with continuous upgrading of computers in our administrative offices, have set new benchmarks in the college's journey toward digital empowerment and pedagogical innovation.



## SEMINAR ROOMS, ACTIVITY ROOMS AND VIDEO CONFERENCING ROOM

The college boasts five seminar rooms and a fully equipped video conferencing room, facilitating interactive academic sessions, workshops, and expert talks. The modernized video-conferencing committee room, designed to seat 35–40 participants, is equipped with high-end audio-visual systems, including LED screens, portable microphones, speakers, and integrated lighting solutions. Additionally, three existing classrooms have also been transformed into technology-enabled smart classrooms. These classrooms/seminar rooms feature an auditorium-style or cavea-shaped layout designed to accommodate a hundred students. They are equipped with integrated digital infrastructure, including podium systems, LCD interactive panel, high-speed Wi-Fi, sound systems, and smart cameras. Two airconditioned Activity Rooms are also available on the third floor of the college building for facilitating interactions such as tutorials, meetings, discussions, extra-curricular activities, and round-table seminars.





### GYAN PRASAR KENDRA

The envisioning and inauguration of the Knowledge Dissemination Centre, "Gyan Prasar Kendra," in 2023 represents a momentous leap toward democratizing access to quality education, offering online lectures, podcasts, and guidance and resources for competitive exam preparation to students across the country. Seeking to bridge the educational divide by leveraging technology to reach a wider student audience across the nation, Gyan Prasar Kendra maintains a state-of-the-art studio and a dedicated YouTube channel, where students can access top-tier lectures by University of Delhi faculty, covering the regular college syllabi and competitive examinations such as UPSC-CSE and CUET-PG. The initiative also features podcasts with eminent personalities, offering insights that help students build confidence and clarity in their academic and professional pursuits. The Centre started its run with a studio that combined minimal, efficient design with the latest technology/media for recording, producing, and editing content and is proud to have produced a rich and diverse lineup of educational content (lectures, podcasts, talks, recordings of live events etc.) that is available free of charge on its YouTube channel. 

#### CENTRE FOR INDIAN KNOWLEDGE SYSTEM

The Centre for Indian Knowledge Systems (CIKS) at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College was inaugurated on January 16, 2023 during the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav and the Centenary celebrations of University of Delhi. The Centre has been established in adherence to the goals of the Ministry of Education, Government of India, and National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 for the facilitation and dissemination of Bharatiya Gnana Parampara (Indian Traditional Knowledge Systems) based interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary research and outreach activities. ### CENTRE FOR WRITING AND COMMUNICATION

The Centre is a one of-a-kind space for the University of Delhi. It intends to develop communication, critical thinking, and research skills within the college community by working with a diverse section of students, teachers, and external experts and offering a multidisciplinary understanding of best practices in writing, communication, and research.




### THE PLACEMENT AND INTERNSHIP CELL

The Placement and Internship Cell of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College has demonstrated outstanding commitment in bridging the gap between academic learning and professional readiness, creating a robust ecosystem for student success. Under the guidance of Dr. Sahil Ramchandani (Convenor), along with Dr. Pragya Nayyar, Dr. Pooja Talwar, and Prof. Ruchi Gupta (Co-Convenors), the Cell has worked diligently to foster strong corporate relationships, ensuring students receive relevant exposure, guidance, and training. Throughout the academic year 2024–25, the Cell conducted CV vetting sessions, aptitude workshops, mock interviews, and expert-led career seminars to enhance employability and prepare students for evolving industry demands. These initiatives culminated in a highly successful placement season, with over 200 offers secured from 120+ reputed recruiters across 30+ unique job profiles. Top-tier firms such as Deloitte, KPMG India, EY GDS, PwC, and Grant Thornton participated actively, alongside high-growth companies like Zomato, Urban Company, Delta X, and Ditto Insurance. The highest package touched INR 23.05 LPA, while the average and median CTCs were INR 5.6 LPA and INR 6.05 LPA respectively, indicating steady and competitive placement outcomes. Students were placed in diverse roles such as Business Analyst, Risk Consultant, Audit Associate, and Growth Specialist, with opportunities spanning key locations in India and abroad, including remote and UAE-based roles.

Complementing final placements, the Internship Cell also played a pivotal role in expanding early career exposure through its two flagship internship fairs—Winternovate and Internovate. Together, these fairs onboarded over 100 companies offering internships across domains such as business development, marketing, finance, content writing, operations, and social media. Notable recruiters included Reslink Technologies, Techradiance, Pregrad, Ava Intern, and Careers360. The internships offered stipends ranging from INR 5,000 to INR 40,000 per month, with the average stipend standing at INR 13,000. Many of these roles came with added benefits such as Pre-Placement Offers (PPOs) and certifications, offering students not just exposure but also tangible career-building opportunities. The consolidated efforts of the Placement and Internship Cell reflect Shaheed Bhagat Singh College's growing credibility among leading employers and its deep focus on holistic career development, as it continues to scale its partnerships and opportunities for students year after year.









#### RULES, DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

#### **Attendance Requirement**

No student will be eligible to appear in the semester examination if he/she has not attended twothirds of the lectures, tutorials, and practicals held during the academic semester as per the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. Exemption from this requirement will be granted per the University of Delhi's rules and regulations.

#### **Anti-Ragging Rules**

- ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING (NOT EVEN FOR FUN) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the Delhi University system, as well as public transport.
- Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under Ordinance XV-B and C.
- Ragging, for the purpose of this, ordinarily means any act, conduct, or practice by which the dominant power or status of a senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students, and includes individual or collective acts or practices that:
  - (A) Involve physical assault, threat, or use of physical force
  - (B) Violate the status, dignity, and honour of students
  - (C) Violate the status, dignity, and honor of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
  - (D) Expose students to ridicule and contempt, and affect their self-esteem.
  - (E) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behavior
- In case any student who has obtained the degree of the University of Delhi is found under this Ordinance committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected to Ordinance XV to appropriate action for the withdrawal of the degree conferred by the university.
- For this ordinance, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging.

#### **Ragging-Related** Complaints

Any student aggrieved in this matter may approach Dr. Ashish Singh, convener of the Discipline Committee, or any college staff member for speedy disciplinary action. Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college.
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or a fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits.
- Debarment from representation in college events.
- Withholding results.
- Handing over the case to the police, if need be.



**NOTE:** It is mandatory, as per the Honorable Supreme Court and UGC/AICTE Regulations, that all students fill in an anti-ragging affidavit each year. To make the process easier, the MHRD has developed an online facility. Affidavits can be filled out ONLINE at www.amanmovement.org & www.antiragging.in. The student is required to submit this affidavit to the college within 1 month of the close of admission.

#### **Code of Conduct**

- 1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline and endeavor to promote the honor of the college, as well as inculcate healthy fellow feelings.
- 2. The student against whom disciplinary action has been taken will not be allowed to contest elections either.
- 3. Students shall refrain from:
  - Misbehavior towards members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students;
  - Smoking, drinking, gambling, and drug-taking in any form; eve-teasing;
  - Obstructing passage in the verandah;
  - Causing damage to the college building, furniture, fixtures, gardens, canteen crockery, or to any other property;
  - Use of Mobile Phones in the Classrooms;
  - Associating with outsiders to create indiscipline in any form in the college. (No outsider will be allowed in the college without any expressed purpose, and all visitors will have to make entry in the Visitor Register.)
  - Unauthorized entry in the college building on holidays;
  - Loitering in corridors and making noise outside and inside the classrooms.

For any of the above offenses, students are liable to punishment, which may amount to a fine, suspension, or even expulsion from the college.

- 4. Students are expected to be regular in the classes.
- 5. Students must keep the college neat and clean.
- 6. Students must maintain perfect silence in the library and obey the standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
- 7. Students may participate in their favorite games or sports, obeying the standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
- 8. Students must always carry their identity cards with them.
- 9. Students must always see the College Notice Board, the Sports Notice Board, and the Library Notice Board daily to obtain up-to-date information on college notices.
- 10. Students are expected not to bring any guests during the teaching hours in the college.
- 11. Suggestions from students are always welcome and will be given proper attention.
