Property Defacement (Special Emphasis)

- Respect college property
- Take prior written approval for displays
- Report any acts of defacement immediately
 - If a student, whose name appears on a poster defacing College premises (including the practice of resorting to spelling errors in the name of candidates) without his/her knowledge, it will be the duty of the concerned candidate/student remove it immediately, or if he/she thinks that the poster is pasted on anv College/public/ private property someone else without his/her knowledge then immediately file complaint in a police station with proof of his/her identity and also send a copy of the same to the College authority
- Don't stick posters or write on walls, buildings, or public/private property
- No candidate shall, nor shall his/her supporters, deface or cause any destruction to any property of the college campus, for any purpose whatsoever
- Whoever defaces any property, shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to 1 year, or with fine which may extend to 50,000, or with both as per The Delhi Prevention of Defacement of Property Act, 2007
- All candidates shall be held jointly and severally liable for any destruction / defacing of any university / college property, as per 6.7.8 Lyngdoh Committee Recommendations
- The student may be liable to pay fine Rs 25,000/- or as decided by the College or suspension from college, rustication from college for a specified period, expulsion from the College, and may also be debarred from contesting election according to the relevant rules of the University/other applicable laws - as per Delhi university' Notification dated 08th Aug, 2025

- All candidates shall be jointly responsible for ensuring the cleaning up of the polling area within of hours conclusion of polling

No littering or leaving campaign material on premises

- Any contravention of any of the guidelines may make the liable to candidate stripped of his candidature, or his elected post, as the case may be. The university Competent authorities/the Authority of the college/ may take appropriate disciplinary action against such a violator - as per 6.7.15 Committee Lyngdoh Recommendations
- The costs of removing defacement will be recovered from the candidates or their organisation
