This is to inform all the students, to complete their subject registration for **Generic Elective Courses (GEC), Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), & Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)** on the Saksham (ERP) Portal Login Page (<https://saksham.sitslive.com/Login>).

Students are advised to fill in their GEC, DSE, SEC, VAC and AEC preferences after reading the guidelines and the syllabi carefully, which has been uploaded on the Saksham Portal. No changes will be allowed after the selection of these subjects by the students.

Therefore, all the students must complete their subject registration by **17-12-2025**.

If students do not register for their subjects, the college will allocate these subjects at its discretion, and no requests for changes in the allotted subjects will be entertained after the due date.

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## ANNEXURE-I

### **GE GUIDELINES, SEMESTER II, 2025-26**

#### **Guidelines for GE, Semester II, Honors Courses:**

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **all Hons.** courses of Semester-II to choose their options of the GE papers that they want to opt for the 2025-26 session (Even semester, Semester-II).
2. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the different departments for the Semester-II. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**
3. The students need to opt the subject of their interest offered by the other departments i.e., If a student is in Semester-II of B. Com (H) than the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department. **For Example:**  
**A Student pursuing B. Com (H) cannot opt the GE paper offered by the Commerce Department of the College.**

#### **Guidelines for GE, Semester II, Programme Courses:**

1. It is mandatory for all the students of B.A. Programme, Semester II, to study the GE paper “**English Language Through Literature- I**” compulsorily. However, the students of the course combination of **B.A. (English + History) and B.A. (English + Economics)** will not be studying this paper, they will be offered common pool of GE courses.
2. It is mandatory for all the students of B. Com Programme, Semester II, to study the GE Paper of Hindi Language compulsorily, depending upon their acquaintance with the Hindi at School level. Please note the following for your reference:

Name of the GE Paper	Eligibility
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya ka Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- A)	<b>Studied Hindi upto Class XII</b>
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya ka Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- B)	<b>Studied Hindi upto Class X</b>
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya ka Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- C)	<b>Studied Hindi upto Class VIII</b>

Also note that students who have **not studied Hindi in their school upto VIII class, will have the option of choosing the GE paper from the list of common pool of GE Courses**, for which they may contact Dr. Aman Verma (Convenor, GE) or Dr. Ranjana Thakur (Co-convenor, GE).

### **GE/DSE GUIDELINES, SEMESTER IV, 2025-26**

#### **Guidelines for GE/DSE, Semester IV, Honors Courses:**

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **all Hons.** courses of Semester-IV to choose their options of the **GE/DSE** papers that they want to opt for the 2025-26 session (Even semester, Semester-IV).
2. In SEMESTER IV, the students of all honors courses will have the option of either studying Discipline Specific Elective (DSE)\* Paper or Generic Elective (GE)\*\* Paper.

\*(Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) is an elective course from the related discipline/subject. The Discipline Specific Elective has equal credit as that of core paper. For example, A student from semester IV, pursuing B.A. Economics (Hons.) will have the option of studying either the DSE paper, which will be offered by the Department of Economics or any GE paper offered by any other department.)

\*\*Generic Elective (GE) is an elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject. **For example: If a student is in Semester-IV of B. Com (H) then the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.**

3. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the **different departments** for the Semester-IV. The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis.

**OR**

In-case they are opting for DSE papers, they can select the DSE paper offered by the **core department**.

4. Students will not be allowed to change their GE/DSE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.

#### **Guidelines for GE, Semester IV, Programme Courses:**

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **B.A. Programme, Semester IV**, to study the GE paper “**English Language Through Literature- II**” compulsorily. However, the students of the course combination of **B.A. (English + History)** will not be studying this paper, they will be offered common pool of GE courses.

2. It is mandatory for all the students of **B.Com Programme, Semester IV**, to study the GE Paper of Hindi Language compulsorily, depending upon their acquaintance with the Hindi at School level. Please note the following for your reference:

Name of the GE Paper	Eligibility
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- A)	Studied Hindi upto Class XII
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- B)	Studied Hindi upto Class X
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- C)	Studied Hindi upto Class VIII

Also note that students who have **not studied Hindi in their school upto VIII class, will have the option of choosing the GE paper from the list of common pool of GE Courses**, for which they may contact Dr. Aman Verma (Convenor, GE) or Dr. Ranjana Thakur (Co-convenor, GE).

#### **GE GUIDELINES, SEMESTER VI, 2025-26**

#### **Guidelines for GE, All Courses, Semester VI:**

1. It is mandatory for the students of **all courses (both Programme and Honors), Semester-VI** to choose their options of the GE papers that they want to opt for the 2025-26 session (Even semester, Semester-VI).
2. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the different departments for the Semester-VI. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**

3. The students of **all courses** need to opt the subject of their interest offered by the **other departments (other than their core department)** i.e., If a student is in Semester-VI of B. Com (H) than the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. **The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.**

**For Example: A Student pursuing B. Com (H) or B. Com (P) cannot opt the GE paper offered by the Commerce Department of the College. Similarly, a student of B.A. Prog. (Economics + Mathematics) cannot opt the paper offered by the Economics and Mathematics Department.**

4. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the **different departments** for the Semester-VI. The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis.

Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.

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**GUIDELINES FOR GE and DSE, ALL HONORS COURSES AND B.COM. (PROGRAMME), SEMESTER VIII:**

1. The students of **all honors courses and B.Com (Programme), Semester-VIII** can choose their options of the GE/DSE papers that they want to opt for the 2025-26 session (Even semester, Semester-VIII).
2. Students in semester VIII will be allowed to opt either of the following:
  - Study 3 Discipline Specific Elective\* (DSE) papers, or
  - Study 2 Discipline Specific Elective\* (DSE) papers and 1 Generic Elective (GE) paper

\*(Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) is an elective course from the related discipline/subject. The Discipline Specific Elective has equal credit as that of core paper. For example, A student from semester VIII, pursuing B.A. Economics (Hons.) will have the option of studying the DSE paper, which will be offered by the Department of Economics.

**\*\*Generic Elective (GE) is an elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject. For example: If a student is in Semester-VIII of B. Com (H) than the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.**

3. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE and DSE papers for the Semester-VIII of session 2025-26. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**

- 2) Students are advised to go through the Syllabi of the Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC). The Syllabi are uploaded on the portal for your reference.
- 3) The students of B. Com (Hons.) and B.A. (Program) Semester II (UGCF:2025-2026) are informed that they will study an Indian Language-I as their compulsory AEC. Shaheed Bhagat Singh College offers only Hindi as an AEC Indian Language on the following basis:
  - Hindi A (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class XII)
  - Hindi B (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class X)
  - Hindi C (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class VIII or below)
  - Hindi D: Hindi For Foreign Students (For foreign students who have not studied Hindi before)
  - Hindi E (For the students who have not studied Hindi up to class VIII or below)
- 4) Students of B.Sc. (Hons) Mathematics, B.A. (Hons) Economics, B.A. (Hons) English, B.A. (Hons) Geography, B.A. (Hons) Hindi, B.A. (Hons) History, B.A. (Hons) Political Science, B.Com Program, Semester II (UGCF:2025-2026) are informed that they will study Environmental Science: Theory into Practice –I as their compulsory AEC.
- 5) Semester II students are informed that if they wish to study any AEC Indian language (other than Hindi), they are required to send an email to [sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in](mailto:sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in) mentioning their Roll Number, Course, Contact Number, and AEC paper that they wish to study in Semester II. In case the student opts for an AEC-Indian Language not offered by Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, then he/she will have to attend classes in any other college belonging to the Cluster Colleges (South Campus) of the University of Delhi. The fulfilment of the choice of the student depends on the terms and conditions set by the host college.

- 1) It is mandatory for all the students of all courses of Semester IV to study one Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) in the 2025-26 session (Even semester, Semester IV).
- 2) Students are advised to go through the Syllabi of the Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC). The Syllabi are uploaded on the portal for your reference.
- 3) The students of B. Com (Hons.) and B.A. Program Semester IV (UGCF:2025-2026) students are informed that they will study an Indian Language-II as their compulsory AEC. Shaheed Bhagat Singh College offers only Hindi as an AEC Indian Language on the following basis:

- Hindi A (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class XII)
  - Hindi B (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class X)
  - Hindi C (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class VIII or below)
  - Hindi D: Hindi for Foreign Students (For foreign students who have not studied Hindi before)
- 4) Students of BSc (Hons) Mathematics, BA (Hons) Economics, BA (Hons) English, BA (Hons) Geography, BA (Hons) Hindi, BA (Hons) History, BA (Hons) Political Science, & B. Com (Program) Semester IV (UGCF:2025-2026) are informed that they will study Environmental Science: Theory into Practice –II as their compulsory AEC.
  - 5) Semester IV students are informed that if they wish to study any AEC Indian language (other than Hindi), they are required to send an email to [sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in](mailto:sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in) mentioning their Roll Number, Course, Contact Number, and AEC paper that they wish to study in Semester IV. In case the student opts for an AEC-Indian Language not offered by Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, then he/she will have to attend classes in any other college belonging to the Cluster Colleges (South Campus) of the University of Delhi. The fulfilment of the choice of the student depends on the terms and conditions set by the host college.
  - 6) **Students are advised to be careful while choosing Part II of their Indian language. For example, if you studied Hindi A (Course I) in the previous semester, you must select Hindi A (Course II) in this semester. Likewise, students who studied Urdu (Course I) earlier should select Urdu (Course II) only.**
