Extension of Subject Registration for GEC, DSE, SEC, VAC & AEC – Semester III, V & VII (Academic Session 2026–27)

This is to inform all students of Semester III, V and VII for the Academic Year 2026–27 that they must complete their subject registration for Generic Elective Courses (GEC), Discipline Specific Electives (DSE), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Addition Courses (VAC), and Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) through the Saksham (ERP) Portal (<https://saksham.sitslive.com/Login>).

This is the **FINAL OPPORTUNITY** to complete the subject registration process.

Students are strictly advised to carefully read the guidelines (Annexure I, II & III) and the relevant course syllabus before submitting their preferences. All registrations must be completed on or before **9th July 2026**.

Important Instructions:

1. No request for change, modification, or correction in the selected subjects will be entertained after the registration is submitted.
2. Students who fail to register their subject preferences by the prescribed deadline will forfeit their right to choose their subjects.
3. After the registration window closes, the College will manually allot the subjects to all students who have not completed their registration.
4. The subjects allotted by the College shall be FINAL and BINDING. Under no circumstances will any request for change, modification, exchange, or re-allotment of subjects be considered thereafter.

Students are, therefore, advised to complete their subject registration within the stipulated time to ensure that they are allotted subjects according to their own preferences. Failure to do so will result in manual allotment by the College, and the decision of the College in this regard shall be final.

ANNEXURE 1:

GUIDELINES FOR GE/DSE, SEMESTER III, HONORS COURSES:

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **all Hons.** courses of Semester-III to choose their options of the **GE/DSE** papers that they want to opt for the 2026-27 session (Odd semester, Semester-III).
2. In Semester III, the students of all honors courses will have the option of either studying Discipline Specific Elective (DSE)* Paper or Generic Elective (GE)** Paper.

*(Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) is an elective course from the related discipline/subject. The Discipline Specific Elective has equal credit as that of core paper. For example, A student from semester III, pursuing B.A. Economics (Hons.) will have the option of studying either the DSE paper, which will be offered by the Department of Economics or any GE paper offered by any other department.)

Generic Elective (GE) is an elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject. **For example: If a student is in Semester-III of B. Com (H) then the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and vice versa. The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.

3. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the **different departments** for the Semester-III of 2026-27 session. The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis.

OR

In case they are opting for DSE papers, they can select the DSE paper offered by the **core department**.

4. Students will not be allowed to change their GE/DSE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.

GUIDELINES FOR GE, SEMESTER III, PROGRAMME COURSES:

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **B. Com. Programme, Semester III**, to study the GE paper **“English Language Through Literature- II”** compulsorily.
2. It is mandatory for all the students of **B.A. Programme, Semester III**, to study the GE Paper of Hindi Language compulsorily, depending upon their acquaintance with the Hindi at School level. Please note the following for your reference:

Name of the GE Paper	Eligibility
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- A)	Studied Hindi upto Class XII
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- B)	Studied Hindi upto Class X
Hindi Gadya: Udbhav aur Vikas (Hindi- C)	Studied Hindi upto Class VIII

However, the students of the course combination of **B.A. (Hindi + Geography)** will not be studying this paper, they will be offered common pool of GE courses.

Please also note that the students of B.A. (Programme) who have not studied Hindi upto Class VIII, will be offered the common pool of GE Courses, and for that they may contact the GE Convenor.

GUIDELINES FOR GE, ALL COURSES, SEMESTER V:

1. It is mandatory for the students of **all courses (both Programme and Honors), Semester-V** to choose their options of the GE papers that they want to opt for the 2026-27 session (Odd semester, Semester-V).
2. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the different departments for the Semester-V of session 2026-27. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**
3. The students of **all courses** need to opt the subject of their interest offered by the **other departments (other than their core department)** i.e., If a student is in Semester-V of B. Com (H) than the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. **The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.**

For Example: A Student pursuing B. Com (H) or B. Com (P) cannot opt the GE paper offered by the Commerce Department of the College. Similarly, a student of B.A. Prog. (Economics + Mathematics) cannot opt the paper offered by the Economics and Mathematics Department.

Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.

GUIDELINES FOR GE and DSE, ALL COURSES, SEMESTER VII:

1. The students of **all honors courses and B.Com (P) Semester-VII** can choose their options of the GE/DSE papers that they want to opt for the 2026-27 session (Odd semester, Semester-VII).
2. Students in semester VII will be allowed to opt either of the following:
 - **Study 3 Discipline Specific Elective* (DSE) papers, or**
 - **Study 2 Discipline Specific Elective* (DSE) papers and 1 Generic Elective (GE) paper**

*(Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) is an elective course from the related discipline/subject. The Discipline Specific Elective has equal credit as that of core paper. For example, A student from semester VII, pursuing B.A. Economics (Hons.) will have the option of studying the DSE paper, which will be offered by the Department of Economics.

****Generic Elective (GE) is an elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject. For example: If a student is in Semester-VII of B. Com (H) then the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department.**

3. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE and DSE papers for the Semester-VII of session 2026-27. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**

Guidelines for SEC Semester III

- 2) The students are required to give their preferences for SEC from the subject list (displayed below and visible on the Saksham Portal). The college will allot the SEC subjects on a first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their SEC subjects at a later stage. Therefore, the students should exercise extreme care while choosing their options, as the college does not guarantee allotment of the chosen preferences.
- 3) Students are advised to go through the syllabi of the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) before choosing their options. The syllabi are uploaded on the Saksham portal for your reference.
- 4) Students cannot opt for the same paper in Semester III which they have studied in any of the previous semesters (Semesters I, II). For example: if the student has studied the SEC Paper “Finance for Everyone” in any of the previous semesters (Semester I, II), then he/she cannot opt for the same paper in Semester III.
- 5) Since students cannot study any SEC subject which they have already studied in any of the previous semesters, it is directed to the students to give last preference to the already studied subjects. Students will not be allowed to change their VAC subjects at a later stage. Therefore, the students should exercise extreme care when choosing their options, as the college does not guarantee the allotment of their chosen preferences.
- 3) Students are advised to go through the Syllabi of the Value-Addition Courses (VAC) before choosing their options. The Syllabi are uploaded on the portal for your reference.
- 4) Students cannot opt for the same paper in Semester III which they have studied in any of the previous semesters (Semester I or II). For example: if the student has studied the VAC Paper “Financial Literacy” in any of the previous semesters (Semester I or II), then he/she cannot opt for the same paper in Semester III.
- 5) Since students cannot study any VAC subject which they have already studied in any of the previous semesters, it is directed to the students to give last preference to the already studied subjects. For example, if any student has already studied “Financial Literacy” in any of the previous semesters, then he/she should give Financial Literacy as his/her last preference.

- 1) It is mandatory for all the students of all courses of Semester III to study one Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) in the 2026-27 session (Odd semester, Semester-III).
- 2) Students are advised to go through the Syllabi of the Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC). The Syllabi are uploaded on the portal for your reference.

3) The students of **B. Com (Hons.) and B.A. Program** Semester III (UGCF:2026-2027) are informed that they will study Environmental Science: Theory into Practice –II as their compulsory AEC.

4) Students of **BSc (Hons) Mathematics, BA (Hons) Economics, BA (Hons) English, BA (Hons) Geography, BA (Hons) Hindi, BA (Hons) History, BA (Hons) Political Science, & B. Com (Program)** Semester III (UGCF:2025-2026) are informed that they will study an Indian Language-II as their compulsory AEC. Shaheed Bhagat Singh College offers only Hindi as AEC Indian Language on the following basis:

Hindi A (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class XII)

Hindi B (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class X)

Hindi C (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class VIII)

Hindi D: Hindi for Foreign Students (For foreign students who haven't studied Hindi Before)

Hindi E: (For the Indian students who have not studied Hindi up to Class VIII)

5) Semester III students are informed that if they wish to study any AEC Indian language (other than Hindi), they are required to send an email at sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in mentioning their Roll Number, Course, Contact Number, and AEC paper that they wish to study in Semester III. If the student opts for an AEC-Indian Language not offered by Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, he/she will have to attend classes at another college in the Cluster Colleges (South Campus) of the University of Delhi. The fulfilment of the choice of the student depends on the terms and conditions set by the host college. The following AEC-Indian Languages are available at cluster colleges: Sanskrit, Punjabi, Assamese, Bengali, Bodo, Dogri, Gujarati, Kanda, Kashmiri, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Maithili, Nepali, Odia, Santali, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, & Urdu.
