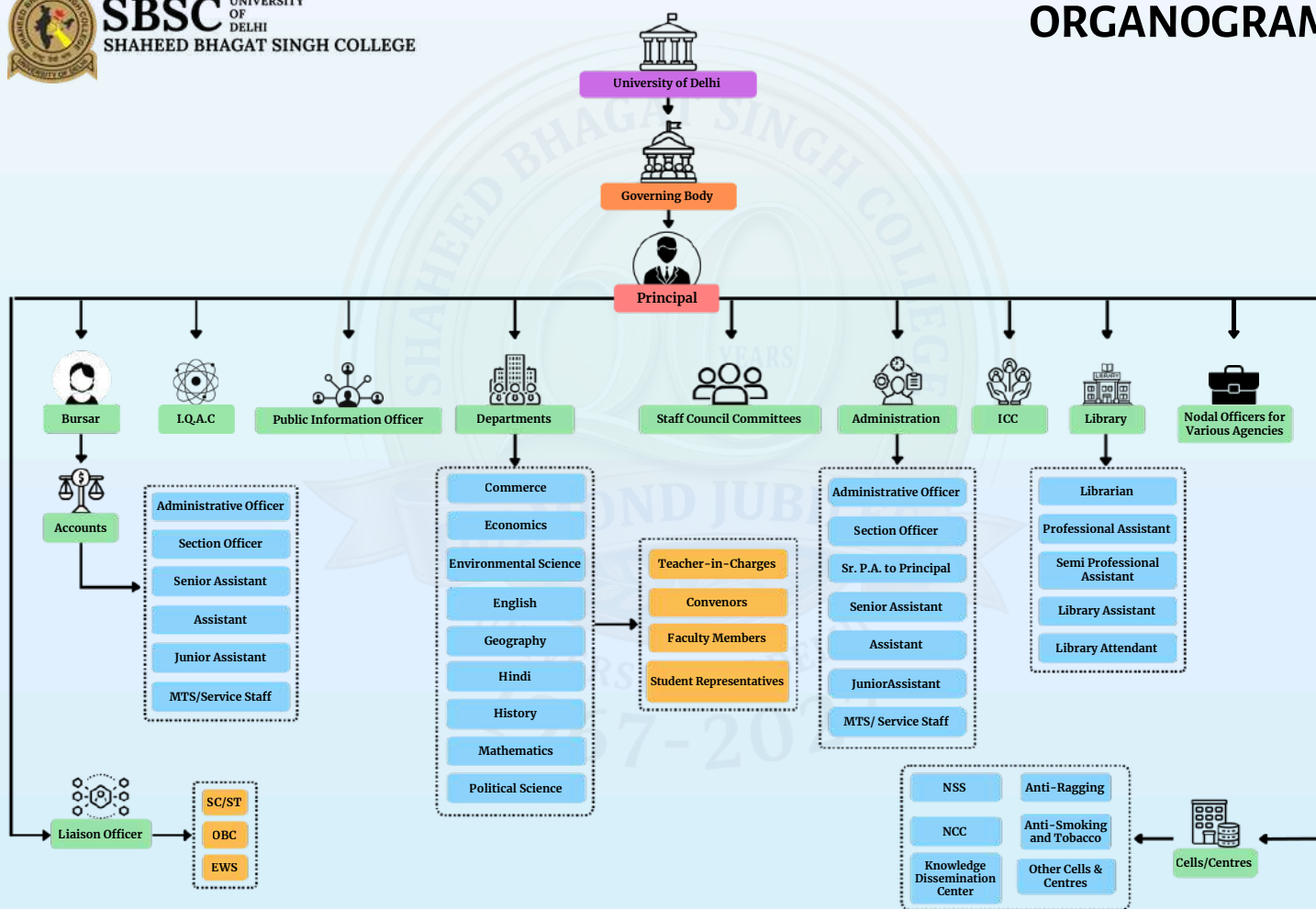


COLLEGE ADMINISTRATION CHART

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS



The Department of Economics at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College offers undergraduate education in Economics and has established a strong academic presence within the college and the University of Delhi. Its B.A. (Hons.) Economics programme is among the highly sought-after courses, attracting talented students from different parts of the country. Established in 1967 alongside the inception of the college, the department has developed a rich academic tradition and continues to draw students from diverse regions of India.

The department also organises national seminars, lectures series, workshops & webinars by eminent speakers and experts on contemporary economic issues. Alongside this, department also organise industrial visits, plantation drives and recreational tours which would help in overall personality building and raising environment sensitisation. During 2025-26 the department organised the 3rd National Seminar of the department on the topic of “Challenges and Opportunities in the Age of AI: Economic Perspective”. The seminar proved to be successful in bringing together policymakers, academicians, industry experts, and labour representatives to discuss the growing impact of Artificial Intelligence on the economy.

The annual Economics Fest, Econotise, provides aspiring economists at both intra- and inter-college/university levels with a platform to participate in activities such as panel discussions, paper presentations, MUNs, extempore competitions, and economic quizzes, fostering intellectual exchange and innovative thinking. The department further enriches students' learning through national seminars, lecture series, workshops, and webinars by eminent speakers on contemporary economic issues. It also organises industrial visits, plantation drives, and recreational tours to promote holistic development and environmental awareness among students.

The alumni of the department have opted for higher education from prestigious institutions like the Delhi School of Economics, Indian Statistical Institute, Jawaharlal Nehru University, IIMs, ISB and IIFT in India. Many of the students have joined international universities like the London School of Economics, the University of Scotland, and the University of Chicago for their master's and research. Our students are well placed in various think tanks in both government and corporate organisations. The department has its own Research Journal called Indian Journal of Economic Studies, 'Arthnaya' - Economics Magazine, Economics Lecture Series and a dedicated economics Research cell- ArthShodh.



The research cell works holistically throughout the academic year and provide training to the students to perform interdisciplinary research. The cell has been divided into two major sub-divisions namely, microeconomics and macroeconomics. In an effort to allow beginners to start writing on topics of academic interest the research cell of the department has also launched an Annual E-Magazine of Arthshodh : ‘Yellow Writer: The Write Path’. The magazine is a

PRINCIPAL'S INTERNSHIP SCHEME



The Principal's Internship Scheme is a flagship initiative aimed at providing students with practical exposure to institutional functioning while ensuring a balance with their academic commitments. Following the successful completion of two tenures, PIS 1.0 and PIS 2.0, the scheme has demonstrated its effectiveness in offering hands-on experience within the administrative and operational framework of the college. Building on this strong foundation, PIS 3.0 is currently in progress, continuing the vision of experiential learning and professional development.

In the current academic year, the programme witnessed an overwhelming response, receiving over 300 registrations from students across both morning and evening colleges. The interns are placed in key departments such as the Administration Office, Library, and Knowledge Dissemination Centre, where they actively contributed to day-to-day operations, records management, and academic support services.

Over the years, the Principal's Internship Scheme has become a programme that consistently draws enthusiastic participation from both morning and evening college students. STUDENT AID FUND AND FEE CONCESSION

Shaheed Bhagat Singh College is determined to provide quality education to all the students with equal opportunity and accessibility. The college is completely devoted to spread out inclusivity and mitigate financial constraints of the students to protect their academic interests. Therefore, the college has established a 'Student Aid Fund & Fee Concession Committee' to facilitate students who need financial aid to continue their studies. The committee meets regularly to discuss such cases and evaluates grant of concession. The concession can range anywhere between 10 percent to 100 percent fee relaxation, depending upon financial need and circumstances of the concerned student.

Applications are invited from the students, through online or offline mode, in the beginning of academic session. Thereafter, interviews are conducted comprehensively with all the students who applied for fee concession. The committee decides some basic parameters to ensure that the fee concession or relaxation should be given to the students who actually need it. The percentage of fee concession depends upon parameters, such as economic status of the student's family, academic performance, regular attendance, and overall discipline and behaviour in the college.

In academic year 2025-26, the committee has conducted two extensive interview sessions to interact with all the students of Ist, IInd, IIIrd and IVth year who applied for the student aid fund and fee concession. The Committee recommended more than 250 students for fee concession. Besides, the committee recommended hundred percent fee concession to some most deserving students based on their economic conditions and academic performance. The prime objective of the Student Aid Fund and Fee Concession committee is the inclusivity of education which aims to protect the right to education of each and every deserving student of the college.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMMES, AWARDS AND PRIZES

THE PLACEMENT AND INTERNSHIP CELL

The Placement & Internship Cell of Shaheed Bhagat Singh College has continued to play a crucial role in facilitating students' transition into the professional world by strengthening industry linkages and providing structured career-oriented support.

The Cell has focused on expanding recruiter engagement while preparing students to effectively navigate competitive recruitment processes. Throughout the year, initiatives such as CV building and vetting sessions, aptitude workshops, group discussion training, and mock interviews were conducted to enhance employability. The Cell also organised C-Suite Clash, a case study competition powered by Unstop, where students demonstrated analytical thinking and presented innovative solutions to real-world business challenges.

PLACEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The academic year 2025-26 has marked a significant milestone, with over 240 placement offers secured and the number continuing to grow, reflecting one of the highest recruiter participation levels in the past decade along with a notable rise in student placements in recent years. Prominent organisations such as Bain Capability Network, Boston Consulting Group, Futures First, Deloitte, and Grant Thornton actively recruited from the college.

The placement drive also saw participation from emerging and fast-growing firms including District by Zomato, Gallagher & Mohan, Ditto, VMock, Preferred Square, WTW, and DeltaX, highlighting an increasingly diverse recruiter base.

During the last academic year the highest package offered stood at INR 17 LPA, while the average CTC was INR 5.45 LPA and the median CTC reached INR 6 LPA, indicating consistent and competitive outcomes.

INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

A total of 385+ internships were secured during the year, reflecting the Cell's expanding outreach and strong industry engagement. Of these, 110+ internships were secured through independent internship drives, with organisations such as Deloitte USI, KPMG, Magicpin, Farmley, Tata1mg, and Hitachi contributing to these opportunities, while a significant share was driven by the Cell's flagship initiative, Internovate 2026, through which over 275 students secured internships. Conducted in February, the inaugural edition of Internovate witnessed participation from 75+ companies, including 40+ offline and 45+ online recruiters, and received 1000+ registrations from students across Delhi University, demonstrating its wide reach and impact. organisations such as Unstop, Times Internet, Magicpin, Farmley, Hitachi, and Careers360 offered roles across diverse domains. Stipends ranged from INR 5,000 to over INR 25,000, with the average stipend standing at INR 15,000 per month, and several companies extended Pre Placement Offers (PPOs), further strengthening long-term career prospects for students.

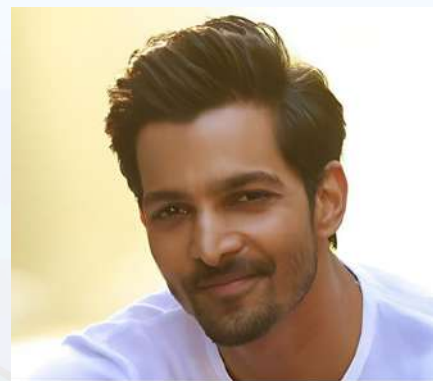

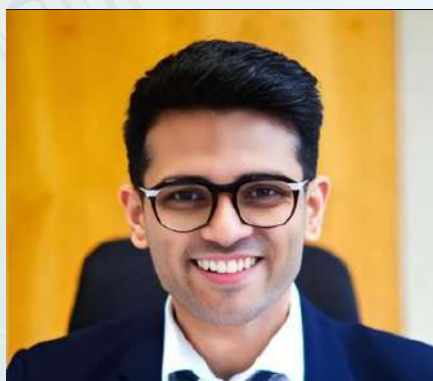

ACADEMIC AUDITORIUM

A modern venue equipped with advanced audio-visual technology and flexible seating. It serves as the primary hub for seminars, conferences, workshops, and intellectual exchanges. The auditorium has a seating capacity of 230 people. The auditorium has already hosted major events such as the 13th International Conference on Business and Management. This highlights its importance as the college's primary venue for national and international academic programmes.



OPEN-AIR AUDITORIUM

The college has recently taken a monumental step forward by constructing a state-of-the-art open-air auditorium equipped with rock-wool insulation, providing a venue for major academic and cultural events where optimal design, flexibility, efficiency, and sustainability are seamlessly integrated. The seating capacity of the auditorium is around 500 people. The auditorium is equipped with energy-efficient, low-noise High Volume Low Speed (HVLS) fans, providing smooth, uniform air circulation that enhances comfort, eliminates the need for multiple standing fans, and offers a sustainable, cost-effective cooling solution for events. The venue recently hosted 59th Annual Day & Award Ceremony in the college.



COMPUTER AND GEOGRAPHY LABORATORIES

The college has established 11 modern computer labs including three Geography labs, all with AIOs computers, projectors and sound systems. Remote sensing labs and Digital Cartography labs of the Department of Geography have been provided with state-of the-art devices and technologies to enable cutting-edge research and learning for students as well as faculty members.



SEMINAR, ACTIVITY, AND VIDEO CONFERENCING ROOMS

The college boasts five seminar rooms facilitating interactive academic sessions, workshops, and expert talks and also a fully equipped modern video-conferencing committee room designed to seat 35–40 participants. Two air-conditioned Activity Rooms are also available on the third floor of the college building for facilitating interactions such as tutorials, meetings, discussions, extra-curricular activities, and round-table seminars.

A digital media centre equipped with recording facilities to produce educational lectures, podcasts and a dedicated YouTube channel to provides academic resources and guidance for competitive examinations, including UPSC-CSE and CUET-PG. It aims to expand quality learning opportunities beyond the traditional classroom.



ENTERPRISE RESOURCE PLANNING (ERP) – SAKSHAM

Developed in-house at Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, SAKSHAM is our ERP solution for managing college data and processes, accessible through our website as well as a dedicated app. It integrates, stores and streamlines student, faculty, and administrative data from admission/joining to farewell/retirement. Embodying the spirit of Digital India and the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goal of reducing paper consumption, Saksham is focused on digitizing processes and data (such as daily student attendance records, Internal Assessment scores, notices for students, etc.), thereby significantly reducing our carbon footprint and embracing a more sustainable and environmentally conscious approach. Gyan Prasar Kendra has a YouTube channel which aims to serve as a centralized platform for accessing educational content, facilitating learning beyond the classroom. The initiative provides a platform for high-quality academic lectures delivered by distinguished faculty members of the college through Smart Boards and a professionally equipped recording setup. Introduced with the objective of expanding access to quality education, the initiative seeks to support students who may face constraints in accessing enhanced learning opportunities and academic resources.

Looking ahead, the committee seeks to expand its reach by deepening multicultural integration through more student exchange initiatives and international partnerships, fostering global cooperation in higher education.

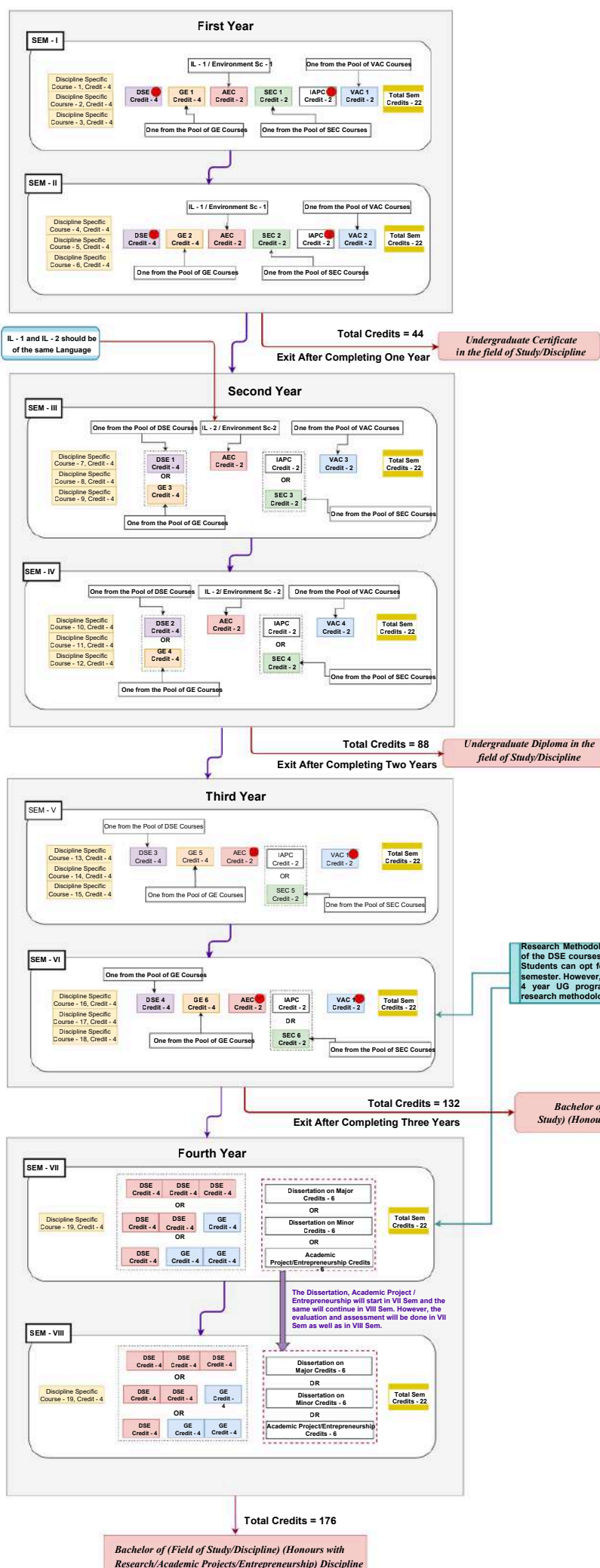

Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions.
Major -> 80 credits, Minor -> 28 credits

Example: B.Sc. Life Sciences programme with Botany, Zoology and Chemistry as core disciplines.

Case I: He/She shall get **Major** in Botany, on successful completion of VIII semester, if he/she earns minimum 80 credits in Botany from **Eight DSCs** and at least **Nine DSEs** of Botany and writes dissertation in Botany.

Advice: Students are advised to choose the discipline in which they wish to Major and

must study at least **Three DSEs** of that discipline in the first three years. Like in this example, student must decide earlier and study three DSEs of Botany in the first three years as only maximum of six DSEs are available in fourth year. Similarly, if the student want to minor in any of the remaining two disciplines, he/she should study one DSE of that discipline in the first three years.

He/She shall get a Minor in Zoology, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from **Six DSCs** and **one DSE** of Zoology. Or
He/She shall get a Minor in Chemistry, if he/she earns minimum 28 credits from **Six DSCs** and **One DSE** of Chemistry.

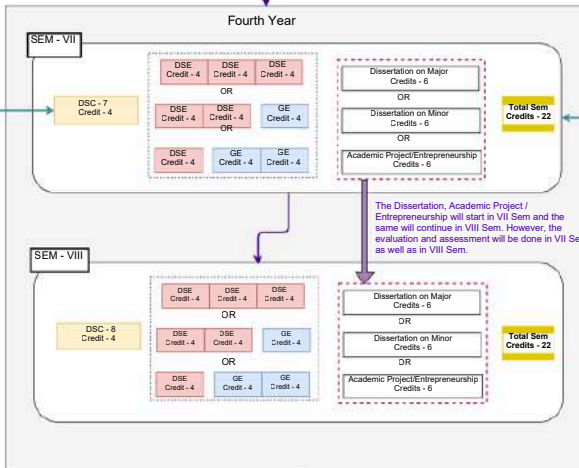

RULES, DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

Attendance Requirement

No student will be eligible to appear in the semester examination if he/she has not attended two-thirds of the lectures, tutorials, and practicals held during the academic semester as per the rules and regulations of the University of Delhi. Exemption from this requirement will be granted per the University of Delhi's rules and regulations.

Anti-Ragging Rules

- ZERO TOLERANCE FOR RAGGING (NOT EVEN FOR FUN) Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the Delhi University system, as well as public transport.
- Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under Ordinance XV-B and C.
- Ragging, for the purpose of this, ordinarily means any act, conduct, or practice by which the dominant power or status of a senior student is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students, and includes individual or collective acts or practices that:
 - (A) Involve physical assault, threat, or use of physical force
 - (B) Violate the status, dignity, and honour of students
 - (C) Violate the status, dignity, and honor of students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
 - (D) Expose students to ridicule and contempt, and affect their self-esteem.
 - (E) Entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behavior
- In case any student who has obtained the degree of the University of Delhi is found under this Ordinance committing an act or practice of ragging, he/she may be subjected to Ordinance XV to appropriate action for the withdrawal of the degree conferred by the university.
- For this ordinance, abetment of ragging will also amount to ragging.

Ragging-Related Complaints

Any student aggrieved in this matter may approach Dr. Ashish Singh, convener of the Discipline Committee, or any college staff member for speedy disciplinary action. Anyone found guilty of ragging may be subject to any one or more of the following punishments:

- Rustication from the college.
- Suspension from the college or classes for a limited period or a fine with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships and other benefits.
- Debarment from representation in college events.
- Withholding results.
- Handing over the case to the police, if need be.

NOTE: It is mandatory, as per the Honorable Supreme Court and UGC/AICTE Regulations, that all students fill in an anti-ragging affidavit each year. To make the process easier, the MHRD has developed an online facility. Affidavits can be filled out ONLINE at www.amanmovement.org & www.antiragging.in. The student is required to submit this affidavit to the college within 1 month of the close of admission.

Code of Conduct -

1. Students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline and endeavor to promote the honour of the college, as well as inculcate healthy fellow feelings.
2. The student against whom disciplinary action has been taken will not be allowed to contest elections either.
3. Students shall refrain from:
 - Misbehavior towards members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and fellow students;
 - Smoking, drinking, gambling, and drug-taking in any form; eve-teasing;
 - Obstructing passage in the verandah;
 - Causing damage to the college building, furniture, fixtures, gardens, canteen crockery, or to any other property;
 - Use of Mobile Phones in the Classrooms;
 - Associating with outsiders to create indiscipline in any form in the college. (No outsider will be allowed in the college without any expressed purpose, and all visitors will have to make entry in the Visitor Register.)
 - Unauthorized entry in the college building on holidays;
 - Loitering in corridors and making noise outside and inside the classrooms.

For any of the above offenses, students are liable to punishment, which may amount to a fine, suspension, or even expulsion from the college.

4. Students are expected to be regular in the classes.
5. Students must keep the college neat and clean.
6. Students must maintain perfect silence in the library and obey the standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
7. Students may participate in their favorite games or sports, obeying the standing rules and regulations framed by the college.
8. Students must always carry their identity cards with them.
9. Students must always see the College Notice Board, the Sports Notice Board, and the Library Notice Board daily to obtain up-to-date information on college notices.
10. Students are expected not to bring any guests during the teaching hours in the college.
11. Suggestions from students are always welcome and will be given proper attention.

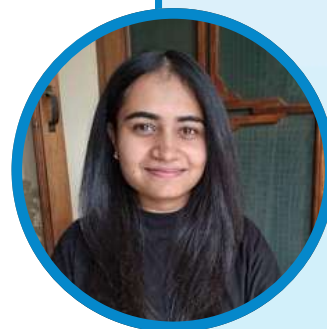

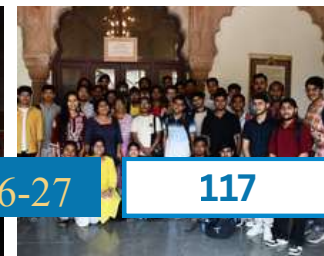
