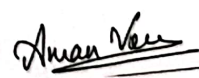
All students are hereby informed that failure to register for their optional subjects within the stipulated deadline will result in the College allocating subjects at its own discretion prior to the commencement of the academic session. No requests for changes in the allotted subjects will be entertained after the due date under any circumstances.

Students are also advised that any shortfall in attendance arising due to non-registration or delayed registration of subjects shall be entirely their responsibility. The **date of commencement of the academic session shall be treated as the reference date** for attendance calculations, regardless of the registration status.

All concerned are strongly advised to complete the subject registration process well within the given timeline to avoid any academic or administrative inconvenience.

GUIDELINES FOR GE, SEMESTER I, HONORS COURSES

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **all Hons.** courses of Semester-I to choose their options of the GE papers that they want to opt for the 2026-27 session (Odd semester, Semester-I).
2. The students are required to give their preferences of the GE papers offered by the different departments for the Semester-I of session 2026-27. **The College will allot the GE subject on first come first serve basis. Students will not be allowed to change their GE subjects at a later stage. Therefore, follow extreme care while choosing the options, as college does not guarantee for the allotment of the chosen preferences.**
3. The students of all Hons. courses need to opt the subject of their interest offered by the **other departments (other than their core department)** i.e., If a student is in Semester-I of B. Com (H) then the student will choose a GE subject of his/her interest from Non-Commerce Department only and Vice Versa. **The students cannot choose the course offered by their own department. For Example: A Student pursuing B. Com (H) cannot opt the GE paper offered by the Commerce Department of the College.**
4. Please also note that if a student wishes to have 'Minor degree' in any one discipline, then he/she is required to study 7 Generic Elective of the same department during the period of 4 years. A student can get minor degree only if he/she successfully completes 4 years of the undergraduate programmes.

Example: A student is enrolled in B.A. (Hons.) History and decides to pursue 4th year (sem VII + sem VIII). If he successfully completes the 4th year, he/she will be awarded Major in History. In addition, if the student successfully completes seven GEs in Political Science, he/she will be awarded Minor in Political Science.

GUIDELINES FOR GE, SEMESTER I, PROGRAMME COURSES:

1. It is mandatory for all the students of **B. Com. (Prog.), Semester I**, to study the GE paper **"English Language Through Literature- I"** compulsorily.
2. It is mandatory for all the students of **B.A. Programme, Semester I**, to study the GE Paper of Hindi Language compulsorily, depending upon their acquaintance with the Hindi at School level. Please note the following for your reference:

Name of the GE Paper	Eligibility
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya (Hindi- A)	Studied Hindi upto Class XII
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya (Hindi- B)	Studied Hindi upto Class X
Hindi Bhasha aur Sahitya (Hindi- C)	Studied Hindi upto Class VIII

Also note that students who have **not studied Hindi in their school upto VIII class**, will have the option of choosing the GE paper from the list of common pool of GE Courses.

Please also note that the students of B.A. (Programme) who have not studied Hindi upto Class VIII, will be offered the common pool of GE Courses, and for that they may contact Dr. Aman Verma, GE Convenor.

Guidelines for AEC Semester I

1) It is mandatory for all the students of all courses of Semester I to study one Ability Enhancement Course (AEC) in the 2026-27 session (Semester-I).

2) Students are advised to go through the Syllabi of the Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC). The Syllabi are uploaded on the portal for your reference.

3) The students of **B. Com (Hons.)** and **B.Com. (Program)** Semester I (UGCF:2026-2027) are informed that they will study Environmental Science: Theory into Practice –I as their compulsory AEC.

4) Students of **B.Sc. (Hons) Mathematics, B.A. (Hons) Economics, B.A. (Hons) English, B.A. (Hons) Geography, B.A. (Hons) Hindi, B.A. (Hons) History, B.A. (Hons) Political Science, B.A. Program**, Semester I (UGCF:2026-2027) are informed that they will study an Indian Language-I as their compulsory AEC. Shaheed Bhagat Singh College offers only Hindi as AEC Indian Language on the following basis:

- **Hindi A** (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class XII)
- **Hindi B** (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class X)
- **Hindi C** (For the students who have studied Hindi up to Class VIII)
- **Hindi D:** Hindi for Foreign Students (For foreign students who have not studied Hindi Before)
- **Hindi E** (For the Indian students who have not studied Hindi up to Class VIII)

5) Semester I students are informed that if they wish to study any AEC Indian language (other than Hindi), they are required to send an email at sbsc.aec@sbs.du.ac.in mentioning their Roll Number, Course, Contact Number, and AEC paper that they wish to study in Semester I. In case the student opts for an AEC-Indian Language not offered by Shaheed Bhagat Singh College, then he/she will have to attend classes in any other college belonging to the Cluster Colleges (South Campus) of the University of Delhi. The fulfilment of the choice of the student depends on the terms and conditions

set by the host college. The following AEC-Indian Languages are available at cluster colleges: Sanskrit, Punjabi, Assamese, Bengali, Bodo, Dogri, Gujarati, Kanda, Kashmiri, Konkani, Malayalam, Manipuri, Marathi, Maithili, Nepali, Odia, Santali, Sindhi, Tamil, Telugu, & Urdu.

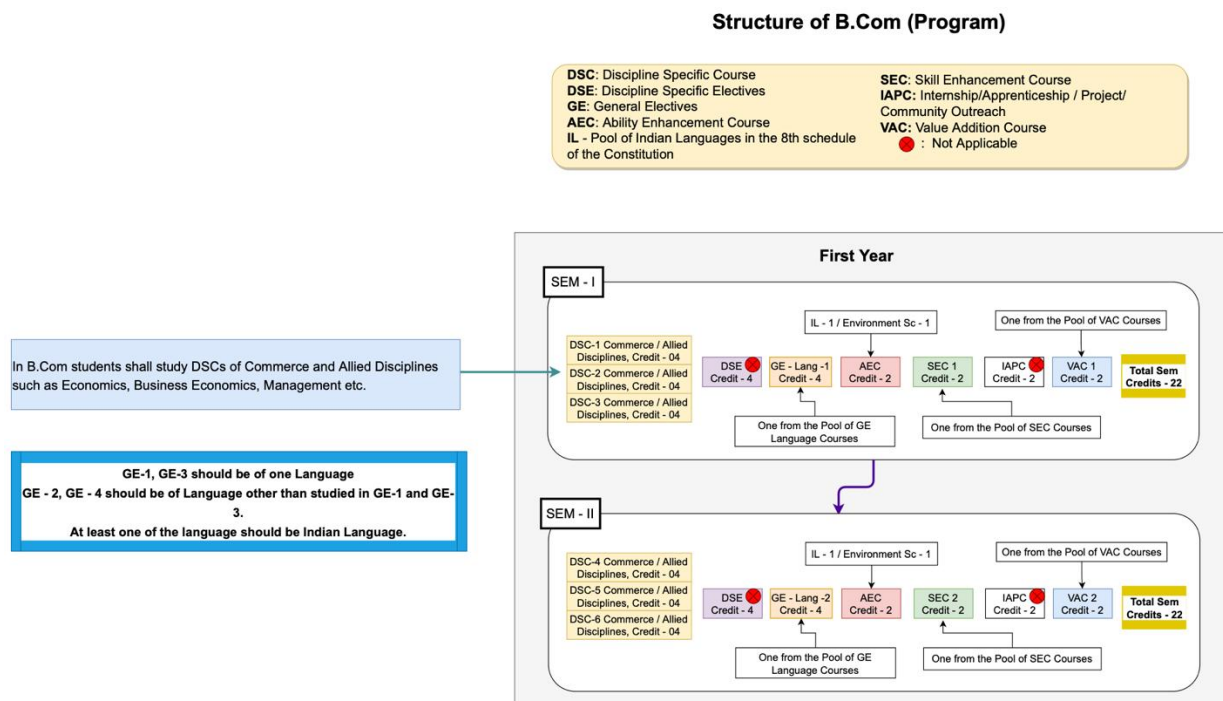

Structure of UG Program Two core Disciplines Applicable to all B.A.(Programs)

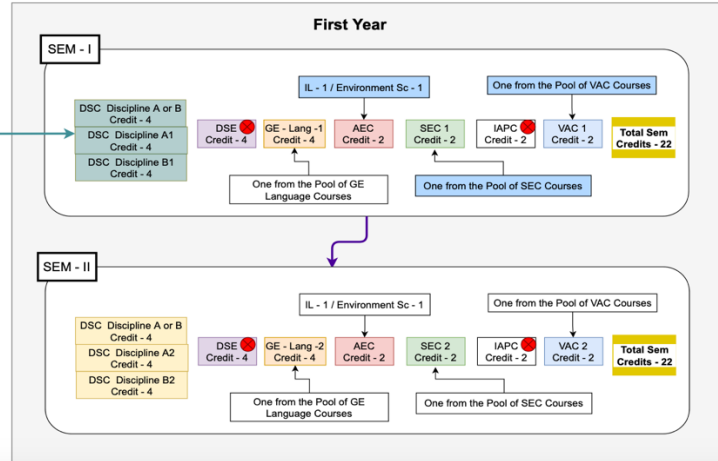

Example: For BA (Programme) History + Economics

A student shall study two disciplines, i.e., History and Economics
 DSC 1 may be of Discipline A or B (say, History / Economics),
 DSC 2 may be of Discipline A (say, History) and
 DSC 3 may be of Discipline B (say, Economics).

GE-1, GE-3 should be of one Language
 GE - 2, GE - 4 should be of Language other than studied in GE-1 and GE-3.
 At least one of the language should be Indian Language.
